Get Out to Enjoy the Fall Weather and Improve Your Health

A practice developed in Japan in the 1980's called shinrin-yoku, "forest bathing," or luxuriating in the woods has proven to improve health. It combines mindfulness practice and spending time in nature. A study conducted across 24 forests in Japan found that when people strolled in a wooded area, their levels of stress hormone cortisol plummeted almost 16 percent more than when they walked in an urban environment. Subjects' blood pressure showed improvement after about 15 minutes of the practice. But one of the biggest benefits may come from breathing in chemicals called phytoncides, emitted by trees and plants. Women who logged two to four hours in a forest on two consecutive days saw a nearly 40 percent surge in the activity of cancer-fighting white blood cells, according to one study. Phytochemical exposure reduces stress hormones, indirectly increasing the immune system's ability to kill tumor cells. Even if you don't live by a forest, studies suggest that just looking at green space-like the trees outside your office window-helps reduce muscle tension and blood pressure. For a positive change in your health, take a stroll outside and soak up this wonderful change of season!

Stewardship

Folded Hands

"All we can do now is pray." We often say this when human efforts have failed, but it puts God in the place of last resort. In the Gospels, Jesus tells his disciples pray first, next and last. Don't wait; call on God now, cry to God, tell God your problems. Believe that God hears you and looks on you with love. All prayers are answered: God says "yes," "no," or "wait." Perhaps your friend with cancer needs reconciliation with a family member more than a cure. Maybe the job that fell through for your son was a wrong turn. Your children may return to the Church when they have children. God sees the bigger picture. Prayer is not supposed to persuade God to give us exactly what we want; rather it is a means to rest our concerns and desires in the heart of God, who will give us all we need. Start with folded hands and an attitude of trust.

Living Stewardship Now

When faced with an emergency or crisis, begin with prayer, such as "Jesus, I trust in you. Guide me to do your will in this and all things."

Reflection on the Readings



The psalm refrain, Psalm 121 “Our help is from the Lord, who made heaven and earth.” sets the tone for the key themes of this Sunday’s readings. They seem to be rather obvious as all three readings, along with the psalm, focus on the need for persistence in prayer so that ultimately justice can be accomplished. The psalm is

one of confidence and trust in God who secures justice for the widow (gospel), the oppressed and the powerless, all who have little power and almost no voice.

Psalm 121 is a pilgrimage prayer of those journeying to Jerusalem. As they set out on the journey to deepen their relationship with God, they ask God’s help, assured that God “will guard your coming and your going.” This was extremely important on a journey that was riddled with difficulties and many dangers. Such confidence and reliance on God comes only from a deep relationship and trust in a God who is concerned for all, protects all and secures justice for all.

The first reading from Exodus clearly affirms that persistence in prayer, even when difficult or challenging, brings its own benefits. Prayer helps develop a deeper relationship with God based on confidence and trust in a God who is always present and faithful. The second reading from the second letter to Timothy encourages all of us to remain faithful to what we know about our God, knowledge gained primarily through God’s word incarnated in Jesus and in the revealed Scriptures. The daily cultivation of our relationship to God in Christ and through the Scriptures makes us competent and assured in our faith, enabling us to reach out to all in justice and right relationship, “whether...convenient or inconvenient.”

Luke’s parable of the persistent widow and the unjust judge seems to uphold an unsavory character, the unjust judge (recall the unjust steward of a few Sundays ago), as someone from whom we can learn a lesson. That lesson centers on two aspects of prayer. One is the need for persistence and confidence in prayer exemplified by the persistent widow. Since she had no

male to petition for her rights, the widow was extremely vulnerable in that society. She could only overcome such vulnerability by persistence and reliance on the compassion of others. The parable’s other lesson focuses on the unjust judge as one who cares for no one, yet is willing to respond to the widow because of her persistence. If the uncaring judge is moved to respond, how much more so will our loving, caring and just God respond.

Reflecting on the parable from a different perspective leads to the gleaning of other lessons from the story. What if the unjust judge represents our attitude towards God and others, basically one of caring for self with no concern for God, others or right relationships? In this scenario, the widow takes on the role of God who challenges us consistently and persistently for justice in our relationship with others. God invites us into relationship to live, act and respond with justice towards all. When we do not, or choose other paths, our “persistent widow” God continually knocks at our door hoping that we will break down the barriers we have constructed and do justice by establishing right relationships with all.

What are your reactions as you reflect on our God taking on the role of the “persistent widow” in your life? Would that persistence eventually move you to acts of justice? How would you respond to the “persistent widow” who bothers you for justice day and night? What affect would that have on your decision regarding whom to vote for this November? What affect would that have on how you lived as a faithful disciple of the Lord? Luke challenges us in many directions this Sunday. Take time to reflect on what God is trying to say to you as you interact with the Word and where that interaction takes you.



Reflexión Sobre las Lecturas



El estribillo del salmo, salmo 121 "El auxilio me viene del Señor que hizo el cielo y la tierra." Resume los temas claves de las lecturas de este domingo. Parecen ser bastantes obvios como las tres lecturas, junto con el salmo, se centran en la necesidad de persistencia en la oración para que en última instancia, la justicia se puede lograr. El salmo es uno de confianza y fe en Dios que hace justicia a la viuda (Evangelio), los oprimidos y los sin poder, todos los que tienen poco poder y casi sin voz.

El salmo 121 es una oración de peregrinación de los que viajan a Jerusalén. Mientras salen de viaje a profundizar su relación con Dios, piden la ayuda de Dios, asegurados de que Dios "guarda sus entradas y salidas." Esto fue muy importante en un viaje que estaba plagado de dificultades y muchos peligros. Tal confianza en Dios sólo viene de una profunda relación y confianza en un Dios que se preocupa por todos, protege a todos y asegura justicia para todos.

La primera lectura del Éxodo afirma claramente que la persistencia en la oración, aun cuando difícil o desafiante, trae sus propios beneficios. La oración ayuda a desarrollar una relación más profunda con Dios basada en la confianza en un Dios que siempre está presente y fiel. La segunda lectura de la segunda carta a Timoteo anima a todos a permanecer fieles a lo que sabemos sobre nuestro Dios, el conocimiento obtenido principalmente a través de la palabra de Dios encarnado en Jesús y en las Escrituras reveladas. El cultivo diario de nuestra relación con Dios en Cristo y por medio de las Escrituras nos hace competentes y seguros en nuestra fe, que nos permite llegar a todos en la justicia y la relación correcta, "a tiempo y a destiempo."

La parábola de la viuda persistente y el juez injusto de Lucas parece mantener un personaje desagradable, el juez injusto (recuerde el administrador injusto de hace unos domingos), como alguien de quien podemos aprender una lección. Esa lección se centra en dos aspectos de la oración. Uno de ellos es la necesidad de que la persistencia y la confianza en la oración ejemplificado por la viuda persistente. Como no tenía hombre para peticionar sus derechos, la viuda era extremadamente vulnerable en esa sociedad. Sólo podía superar esa vulnerabilidad mediante la

persistencia y la confianza en la compasión de los demás. Otra lección de la parábola se centra en el juez injusto como alguien que no se preocupa por nadie, sin embargo, está dispuesto a responder a la viuda a causa de su persistencia. Si el juez indiferente se mueve a responder, ¿cuánto más lo hará nuestro Dios amoroso y cariñoso?

Al reflexionar sobre la parábola desde una perspectiva diferente resulte en cosechar otras lecciones de la historia. ¿Qué pasa si el juez injusto representa nuestra actitud hacia Dios y otros, básicamente, una de cuidar de sí mismo, sin preocuparse por los demás, Dios o las relaciones correctas? En este escenario, la viuda asume el papel de Dios, que nos desafía consistente y persistente por la justicia en nuestra relación con los demás. Dios nos invita a una relación de vivir, actuar y responder con justicia a todos. Cuando no lo hacemos, o elegimos otros caminos, nuestra "viuda persistente" Dios llama continuamente a nuestra puerta con la esperanza de que rompamos las barreras que hemos construido y hagamos justicia mediante el establecimiento de relaciones correctas con todos.

¿Cuáles son sus reacciones al reflexionar sobre nuestro Dios asumiendo el papel de la "viuda persistente" en su vida? ¿Esta persistencia le moverá a hacer actos de la justicia? ¿Cómo respondería a la "viuda persistente" que le molesta para la justicia día y noche? ¿Qué efecto tendría eso en su decisión con respecto a para quién votar este noviembre? ¿Qué efecto tendría esto sobre cómo ha vivido como un discípulo fiel del Señor?

Lucas nos desafía en muchas formas este domingo. Tómese el tiempo para reflexionar sobre lo que Dios está tratando de decirle mientras interactúa con la Palabra y en donde esa interacción se realiza.
