Parish Happenings and Information

What is the Paschal Triduum?

The Paschal Triduum (the “Three Days”) is the summit of our Liturgical Year and celebrates the heart of our faith, The Paschal Mystery of Jesus Christ: his Life, Passion, Death, and Resurrection. The three days are celebrated as one long liturgy beginning with the Holy Thursday Mass of the Lord’s Supper, through Good Friday’s service of the Passion of the Lord, reaching its high point in the Easter Vigil and concluding on Easter Sunday. During these three holiest days of the year, we do not simply re-enact events in the life of Jesus, but enter into a ritual remembering the saving mystery of our faith. When we wash feet on Holy Thursday, we recall our Lord’s command to serve others and strengthen our commitment to that call. When we venerate the Cross on Good Friday, after proclaiming the Passion of the Lord, we offer our humble thanks that Jesus chose to die for our sins and win our salvation by his suffering. And at the Easter Vigil we welcome into our community new members who are initiated by baptism, confirmation and reception of the Eucharist. We recommit ourselves to our own baptismal promises and enter into the season of Easter, rejoicing in the resurrection of the Lord. Every symbol we use during the entire liturgical year is present tonight—fire, water, oil, incense—helping us to see, hear, smell, and feel this celebration with our whole human selves.

So many of us began Lent on Ash Wednesday, being marked with ashes, recalling our sins, preparing to receive God’s mercy. Let us now join together to transition from penitence to joy and celebrate these most special days. This is what we have been preparing for! If you have never attended the liturgies of Triduum before, perhaps this is the year to begin.



March Gathering - March 31

On March 31 we will take a tour of the United States District Court for the Western District of Missouri. The tour is designed to help people better understand how cases get to our court and the different agencies who participate in the judicial process. The tour consists of speakers from the Clerk’s Office of the U.S. District Court, an Investigative Agency (FBI, Secret Service, ATF or DEA), the U.S. Attorney’s Office or Federal Public Defender’s Office, the Probation or Pre-Trial Services Offices, the U.S. Marshal’s Service and a personal visit with a Judge in his/her courtroom. If time permits, a visual walk through of other areas of the courthouse can be conducted. **We will meet at St. Sabina at 8:30am to carpool, and our tour begins at 9:30am.** After the tour we will eat lunch at BRGR Kitchen and Bar in the Power and Light District. The tour is free, so the only cost will be your lunch. Cell phones are not allowed in the courtroom, but will be kept safe by the guard outside the courtroom. ARE YOU AT RISK FOR DIABETES? Quiz #3

Which breakfast is the best diabetes fighter?

- A. Bacon and eggs
- B. Fiber-rich cereal
- C. A blueberry muffin

Answer: B In a study of more than 365,000 adults, those who ate the highest amount of fiber found in cereals and whole grain products regularly had a 34 percent lower risk of dying from diabetes than those who consumed the least.

What's the riskiest morning beverage?

- A. Cold-pressed fruit juice
- B. Milk
- C. Black coffee

Answer: A The kale-grapefruit-pineapple concoction can be a sugar bomb. Many store-bought bottles of juice contain more than 20 grams of sugar. A new study discovered that drinking beverages with added sugar was associated with a 13 percent greater rate of diabetes per daily serving.

Luke 23: 44-46



Although we may be intellectually aware that we are playing the part of the people of Jesus’ time, we really must reflect on whether this also represents how we can be today. Do we glorify Christ at one moment, but then condemn him through our own actions, our own inability to fulfill His expectations for us? Of course we do. As Lent culminates and Easter comes upon us, it is time for us to admit our sins and to vow as good stewards to live out the love to which the Lord has called us. Reflection on the Readings



Today we begin Holy Week, the highlight of the liturgical year culminating with the celebration of the Paschal Triduum, Holy Thursday,

Good Friday and the Easter Vigil, the celebration of the passion, death and resurrection of Jesus. Lent officially ends with the evening Mass on Holy Thursday. On every Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion the first reading, the responsorial psalm and the second reading are always the same, while the gospel reading proclaims the passion narrative from one of the three synoptic gospels. This year we focus on the passion narrative according to Luke.

The refrain from responsorial Psalm 22 "My God, my God, why have you abandoned me?" speaks of the feeling of abandonment as Jesus undergoes his passion and death. At the same time the psalm ends on a note of praise and trust in God who saves all who call upon the Lord for help.

This dual focus is also the theme of the first reading from Isaiah who speaks of the rejection and suffering that the servant of the Lord endures for his faithfulness to the Lord. Through all this, God's servant trusts in the Lord and is fully confident that God will not allow the servant to be disgraced or put to shame. Trust in God is what enables the servant to endure the tribulations of life.

The second reading from Paul's letter to the Philippians speaks of Jesus' willingness to let go of "equality with God" so as to become fully human. In this manner, Jesus was able

to model what being truly human entails. Care and concern for others even to the point of totally giving of oneself for others is the essence of being human. Obedience to God demands such a lifestyle. God is always there, always concerned, and will never allow us to be disgraced or put to shame. Fidelity to God's ways brings about new life and depth of relationship for all, no matter what life brings.

The gospel narrative presents each gospel writer's unique manner of presenting Jesus to their communities. Luke consistently portrays Jesus as the savior for all people, most especially the poor, the outcasts, the marginalized and all those having no societal status or power. Luke's Jesus is the bearer of God's good news to all, proclaiming the reality that God cares, is concerned and continually offers mercy, forgiveness and a place at the table.

In the passion narrative, Luke presents a Jesus who is vulnerable and rejected by all those in power and authority. Jesus seems to be at the mercy of those who inflict harm, much like the poor and weak of the world. For Luke, Jesus is more a victim and a martyr, taking the role of the suffering servant and thus identifying with all

those who are powerless and oppressed victims.

At the same time, Luke strongly emphasizes the innocence of Jesus. Like the victims of the world, Jesus, though innocent, is tortured and condemned to death. Luke has Pilate proclaim three times that Jesus is innocent (Lk 24: 4, 14, 22). Herod finds no guilt in Jesus (Lk 23:15). The centurion at the cross proclaims Jesus to be innocent (Lk 23:47).

Despite this unjust and undeserved suffering, Luke pictures Jesus as forgiving and serene throughout. There is no anguished cry from the cross as in Mark. Rather, Jesus prays for his persecutors, asking the Father to forgive them for "they know not what they do" (Lk 23:34). Luke is the only gospel presenting the dialogue between the two thieves with Jesus promising the "good thief" that "today you will be with me in paradise" (Lk 23:43).

Throughout Luke's passion narrative, Jesus is pictured as innocent, prayerful, forgiving, serene and courageous. In this fashion, Luke offers us a model of discipleship. How is Luke's Jesus a model for your daily living?

Reflexión Sobre las Lecturas



Hoy comenzamos la Semana Santa, el punto culminante del año litúrgico que termina con la celebración del Triduo Pascual, Jueves Santo, Viernes Santo y la Vigilia de Pascua, la celebración de la pasión, muerte y resurrección de Jesús. Cuaresma oficialmente termina con la Misa del Jueves Santo. En cada Domingo de Ramos en

la Pasión del Señor la primera lectura, el salmo responsorial y la segunda lectura son siempre los mismos, mientras que la lectura del evangelio proclama el relato de la pasión de uno de los tres evangelios sinópticos. Este año nos centramos en la narración de la pasión según San Lucas.

El estribillo del Salmo responsorial 22 "Dios mío, Dios mío, ¿por qué me has abandonado?" Habla de la sensación de abandono que Jesús siente mientras sufre su pasión y muerte. Al mismo tiempo, el salmo termina con una nota de alabanza y confianza en Dios que salva a todos los que invocan al Señor en busca de ayuda.

Este doble enfoque es también el tema de la primera lectura de Isaías que habla del rechazo y el sufrimiento que el sirviente del Señor supera por su fidelidad al Señor. Durante todo esto, el sirviente de Dios confía en el Señor y está totalmente seguro de que Dios no permitirá que se deshonra o avergüenza al sirviente. La confianza en Dios es lo que permite al sirviente soportar las tribulaciones de la vida.

La segunda lectura de la carta de Pablo a los Filipenses habla de la voluntad de Jesús de dejar "su condición divina" con el fin de ser plenamente humano. De esta manera, Jesús fue capaz de modelar lo que implica ser verdaderamente humanos. El cuidado y preocupación por los demás, incluso hasta el punto de dar totalmente de uno mismo a los demás es la esencia del ser humano. La obediencia a Dios exige tal estilo de vida. Dios está siempre ahí, siempre preocupado, y nunca permitirá que nos deshonran o avergüenzan. La fidelidad a los caminos de Dios trae nueva vida y la profundidad de la relación para todos, no importa lo que trae la vida.

La narrativa del evangelio presenta la manera única de cada escritor del evangelio de presentar a Jesús a sus comunidades. Lucas retrata constantemente a Jesús como el salvador de todas las personas, sobre todo de los pobres, los marginados, y de todos aquellos que no tienen estado social o poder. El Jesús de Lucas es el

portador de la buena nueva de Dios a todos, proclamando la realidad de que Dios se preocupa y continuamente ofrece la misericordia, el perdón y un lugar en la mesa.

En el relato de la pasión, Lucas presenta a un Jesús que es vulnerable y rechazado por todos aquellos en el poder y la autoridad. Jesús parece estar a merced de aquellos que causan daño, como los pobres y los débiles del mundo. Para Lucas, Jesús es más una víctima y mártir, tomando el papel del siervo sufriendo e identificando así con todos aquellos que son víctimas impotentes y oprimidos.

Al mismo tiempo, Lucas enfatiza la inocencia de Jesús. Al igual que las víctimas del mundo, Jesús, siendo inocente, es torturado y condenado a muerte. Lucas tiene a Pilato proclamando tres veces que Jesús es inocente (Lc 24: 4, 14, 22). Herodes no encuentra culpa en Jesús (Lc 23:15). El centurión en la cruz proclama que Jesús es inocente (Lc 23:47).

A pesar de este sufrimiento injusto e inmerecido, Lucas ve a Jesús como indulgente y sereno en todo momento. No hay grito de angustia de la cruz como en Marcos. Más bien, Jesús ora por sus perseguidores, pidiéndole al Padre que los perdone porque "no saben lo que hacen" (Lc 23,34). Lucas es el único Evangelio que presenta el diálogo entre los dos ladrones con Jesús prometiendo el "buen ladrón" que "hoy estarás conmigo en el paraíso" (Lc 23,43).

A lo largo del relato de la pasión de Lucas, Jesús es descrito como inocente, orante, indulgente, sereno y valiente. De esta manera, Lucas nos ofrece un modelo de discipulado. ¿Cómo es el Jesús de Lucas un modelo para su vida diaria?
