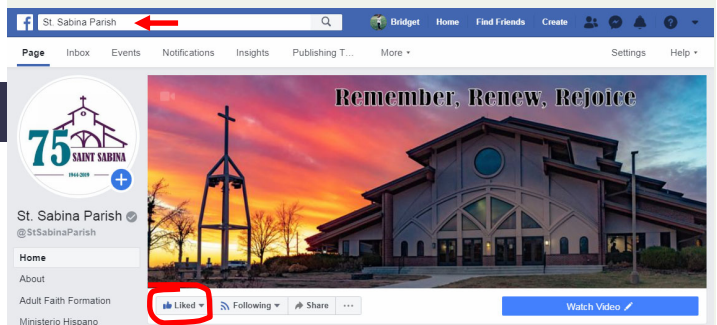

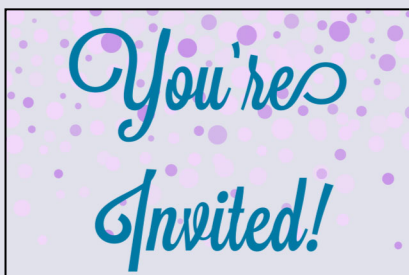

Similar to 'First Aid' and CPR, 'Mental Health First Aid' teaches individuals how to help those experiencing mental health challenges or crises.

Mental health challenges – such as depression, anxiety, psychosis and substance use – are shockingly common in the United States. In fact, more than 1 in 5 American adults will have a mental health problem in any given year.

The National Council for Behavioral Health certifies individuals throughout the nation, including the St. Sabina Wellness Center to provide Mental Health First Aid courses to prepare their communities with the knowledge and skills to help individuals who are developing a mental health problem or experiencing a mental health crisis. Identified on SAMHSA's National Registry of Evidence-Based Programs and Practices, the training helps the public better identify, understand and respond to signs of mental illnesses.

“And to another he said, ‘Follow me.’ But he replied, ‘Lord, let me go first and bury my father.’ But he answered him, ‘Let the dead bury their dead. But you, go and proclaim the kingdom of God.’ And another said, ‘I will follow you, Lord, but first let me say farewell to my family at home.’ To him Jesus said, ‘No one who sets a hand to the plow and looks to what was left behind is fit for the kingdom of God.’”

Luke 9: 59-62

In today’s Gospel, from Luke, Christ refers to the struggle to put Him above all else as He encounters two “would-be” disciples on His way to Jerusalem. We are called to put Christ and His kingdom ahead of our own plans if we truly wish to be His disciples and to find victory in the battle of selfishness. Living stewardship as a way of life can go a long way in arming us for victory. A stewardship way of life provides us with a custom-made “training plan” — the commitment to a specific offering of our time, talent and treasure to the Kingdom of God. It is a plan discerned through prayer, and by looking at the realities of our unique circumstances, strengths and limitations. The daily discipline of committing to the plan strengthens us and helps us gradually move away from the “yes, but” attitude and towards an unqualified “yes!” to Christ and His will. Do not be afraid to give the best of yourself and your gifts to Christ. He deserves nothing less. Reflection on the Readings

As we delve directly into the season of Ordinary Time or numbered Sundays, we are challenged to take up the Paschal journey that Jesus commits himself to in the reading from Luke's gospel. Luke talks about Jesus being "resolutely determined to journey to Jerusalem." All the readings this Sunday challenge us to join Jesus with the same resolve and determination that he manifests.

Jesus' journey is not an easy one. According to Luke's account, the honeymoon experience in Galilee, the first blush of his public ministry, is now over and Jesus realizes that the next and final step is the journey to Jerusalem. Jesus knows that proclaiming God's reign involves challenging the status quo and the established authorities of his day, both political and religious. This is going to get him into trouble, yet he also believes that the journey is necessary if he is to be faithful to his mission of proclaiming God's reign to all. So he sets out on the journey that will eventually lead to his death, with a resolve, a determination and a single-mindedness that is admirable as it is difficult.

Along the way, Jesus, like Elijah in the first reading and Paul in the second, offer others the opportunity to join the journey. The offer comes with strings attached. The conditions for discipleship demand that we allow nothing to get in the way of doing the will of God. As humans we are pulled in many directions and are distracted by the many voices that surround us. If, like Jesus, we feel called to proclaim God's reign wherever we are planted, then we need to attune ourselves to only one voice. God's voice takes precedence over all other voices.

Discipleship must be wholehearted. Part time or half-hearted discipleship is a contradiction. This is why Elijah and Jesus appear to react so harshly to those who find any number of obstacles on their journey to discipleship. The call to discipleship is complete, total and without hesitation. To follow through on our call to discipleship demands that we do much work beforehand so that at the opportune time, there will be no hesitation whatsoever.

Like Elisha, to whom Elijah offers discipleship, we too need to rid ourselves of all that would distract us from resolutely carrying out God's

wishes. Paul encourages us to "live by the Spirit," to "stand firm...and not submit again to the yoke of slavery." For Paul, the demands of discipleship are summed up in "one statement: You shall love your neighbor as yourself." These are the demands of following Jesus on the Paschal journey.

What would make a person take on such demands? The refrain of the responsorial psalm boldly proclaims the answer. The end result of the discipleship journey is that "You are my inheritance, O Lord." If the Lord is to be our inheritance, it is essential that we strive to set the Lord ever before us. The psalmist asserts that "with the Lord at my right hand, I shall not be disturbed," no matter the difficulties encountered on our discipleship journey. Attuning ourselves to the demands of discipleship brings with it the rewards of abundant joy, fullness of life, and peace and security in God who is indeed our one and only inheritance.

Reflect on how resolute you are in modeling yourself on Jesus. When distractions or other voices challenge your resolve to journey with Jesus, how do you respond? What help do you need to continue being faithful to your baptismal call to follow Jesus? With the psalmist, let us pray that we make God our one and only inheritance.

Reflexión Sobre las Lecturas

Mientras que hurgamos en la temporada del Tiempo Ordinario o los domingos numerados, tenemos el desafío de emprender el viaje Pascual al que Jesús se compromete en la lectura del evangelio de Lucas. Lucas habla de que Jesús "tomó la firme determinación de emprender el viaje a Jerusalén".

Todas las lecturas de este domingo nos desafían a acompañar a Jesús con la misma determinación que el manifiesta.

El viaje de Jesús no es fácil. Según el relato de Lucas, la experiencia de la luna de miel en Galilea, el primer sonrojo de su ministerio público, ya terminó y Jesús se da cuenta de que el siguiente y último paso es el viaje a Jerusalén. Jesús sabe que proclamar el reinado de Dios implica desafiar las cosas como están y las autoridades establecidas de su época, tanto políticas como religiosas. Esto lo va a meter en problemas, pero también cree que el viaje es necesario si quiere ser fiel a su misión de proclamar el reino de Dios a todos. Así que se embarca en el viaje que finalmente lo llevará a su muerte, con una resolución, una determinación y una mentalidad única que es tanto admirable como es difícil.

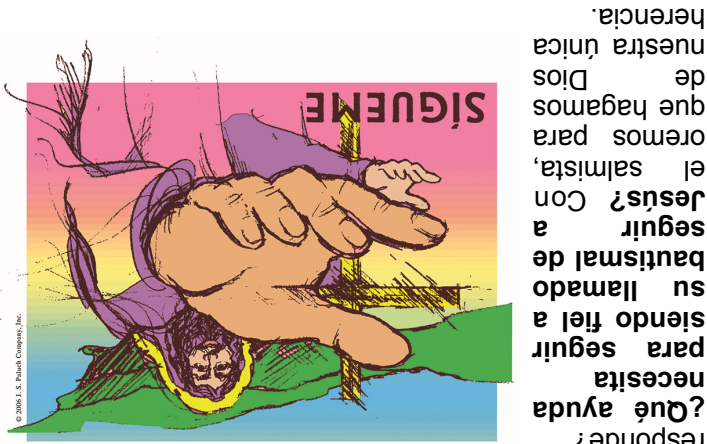
En el camino, Jesús, como Elías en la primera lectura y Pablo en la segunda, le ofrece a otros la oportunidad de unirse al viaje. La oferta viene con cuerdas adjuntas. Las condiciones para el discipulado exigen que no permitamos que nada se interponga en el camino de hacer la voluntad de Dios. Como seres humanos somos atraídos en muchas direcciones y nos distraen las muchas voces que nos rodean. Si, como Jesús, nos sentimos llamados a proclamar el reino de Dios donde sea que estemos, entonces debemos sintonizarnos con una sola voz. La voz de Dios tiene prioridad sobre todas las otras voces.

El discipulado debe ser sincero. El discipulado a medias es una contradicción. Esta es la razón por la cual Elías y Jesús parecen reaccionar tan severamente a aquellos que encuentran una cantidad de obstáculos en su viaje hacia el discipulado. El llamado al discipulado es completo, total y sin dudas. Para cumplir con nuestro llamado al discipulado, se requiere que trabajemos mucho de antemano para que, en el momento oportuno, no haya ninguna duda en absoluto.

Al igual que Eliseo, a quien Elías ofrece el discipulado, nosotros también necesitamos deshacernos de todo lo que nos distraiga de llevar a cabo resueltamente los deseos de Dios. Pablo nos anima a vivir "de acuerdo con las exigencias del Espíritu", a no someternos "de nuevo al yugo de la

¿Qué haría que una persona asuma tales demandas? El estribillo del salmo responsorial proclama audazmente la respuesta. El resultado final del viaje de discipulado es que "Tú, Señor, eres el lote de mi heredad". Si el Señor debe ser nuestra herencia, es esencial que nos esforcemos por poner al Señor ante nosotros. El salmista afirma que "con el a mi derecha, no vacilaré", sin importar las dificultades encontradas en nuestro viaje de discipulado. El hecho de sintonizarnos con las exigencias del discipulado conlleva las recompensas de la alegría abundante, la plenitud de la vida, la paz y la seguridad en Dios, que es nuestra única herencia.

Reflexione sobre que tan determinado es al modelarse en Jesús. Cuando las distracciones u otras voces desafían su decisión de viajar con Jesús, ¿cómo responde?



¿Qué ayuda necesita para seguir siendo fiel a bautismal de seguir a Jesús? Con el salmista, oremos para que hagamos de Dios nuestra única herencia.
