Child Safety

After reporting to these civil and law enforcement authorities, report suspected *sexual abuse of a minor or vulnerable adult* to the Diocesan Ombudsman, Joe Crayon, at 816.812.2500 or crayon@ombudsmankcsj.org, if the abuse involves a priest, deacon, employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Kansas City-St. Joseph.

DIY Reusable Disinfecting Wipes

1. Cut up old tee shirts, socks, fabric etc
2. Mix 60% rubbing alcohol or 140 proof Grain Alcohol, 20% water and 20% vinegar
3. Fill with the cloths so they soak up the mixture
4. Store in a jar, empty wipes container or lidded tub
5. Wash used wipes and place in container for reuse

Pentecost closes the fifty day celebration of Easter as we re-enter the Season of Ordinary Time. The following Sunday we



celebrate the Feast of the Most Blessed Trinity, highlighting the reality that in and through Jesus, we have come to know the Father and we have been gifted with the Spirit. The remainder of the liturgical year is the ideal time to reflect and enter more deeply into the mystery of love that is the Trinity. Our God's very being is Love. The Father's love by its very nature always flows out into another that we call the Son. The mutual love shared between the Father and Son, again flows out into a third that we name the Spirit. The mutual and intertwining dance of love flows out from the Trinity resulting in all of creation. All of creation originates out of and is completely suffused with God's outpouring love. We are created in love and intimately partake in God's divine loving dance. When we make the Sign of the Cross or pray the Glory Be, we praise God as Father, Son and Spirit, honoring the Trinity and our share in that eternal love that is always with us. Make time to view this week's DYK video and reflect on how you are intimately loved by our Trinitarian Relational God, freely, completely, totally and forever.

Did You Know - Going to the farmers' market is a great family activity. There's plenty to see and new foods to try. Here are a few tips to get the most out of your next trip.

1. Bring Cash and Choose Your Time

While some vendors might be able to accept credit cards or checks, cash is king. If you want the absolute freshest produce and the most selection, arrive bright and early. On the other hand, by shopping later in the day – say, an hour before the market closes – you can get the best discounts.

2. Make a Loop First and Be Prepared

The best way to tackle a farmers' market is by making a loop around the entire market first. Be sure and stash a cooler in the back of your car to keep fruits and veggies cool and fresh.

3. Try Something New and Buy in Season

4. Grab Bulk Portions

5. Ask Questions – If you are unsure of a product or need more information, ask the vendor.

Reflection on the Readings

With the feast of Pentecost the fifty days of the Easter Season come to a close and the Season of Ordinary Time becomes operative once again till the first Sunday of Advent. The Feast of the Most Holy Trinity is part of Ordinary Time and helps focus attention on the fullness of revelation that has occurred through the Easter mysteries. The fullness of our God, Father, Son and Spirit, has been made known to us through Jesus. **The rest of the liturgical year is devoted to deepening our relationship and love commitment with our God.** We continually affirm the oneness of God expressed in the three-ness of persons. But what does this all mean?

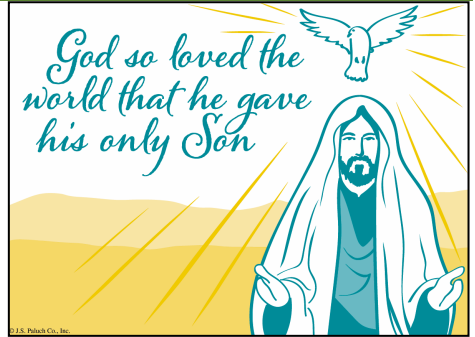
The Trinity brings us in touch with mystery. Mystery is often understood as something we will never be able to explain, so why bother? But mystery can also be looked upon as something that is "infinitely comprehensible or explainable." What exactly would that mean? **This statement takes seriously the fact that we are living, thinking people who want our values and beliefs to mean something.** If this is so, then we must say something, however inadequate, about things that we will never be able to totally or exhaustively comprehend. **Mysteries should never stop us from attempting to make sense of those realities and how they impact our lives.** What does the mystery of the Trinity tell us about our God along with our relationship to God and one another?

The readings offer rich insights for unpacking the Trinity. The first reading from Exodus affirms that our God is a "merciful and gracious God, slow to anger and rich in kindness and fidelity." That God has chosen to "come along in our company" despite our own lack of kindness and fidelity. **God's desire to share God's fullness of life with us, we name "grace." Grace is not a quantity but a relationship.** We never lose God's grace for God gives it freely, totally, completely and unconditionally, never taking it back, no matter what we do.

John's gospel offers rich insights with the very popular verse 3:16, "God so loved the world that he gave his only son..." This phrase divulges the heart of the Trinitarian mystery in the word "love" or "agape" in Greek, "hesed" in Hebrew. **This is covenantal, steadfast love, love willing to give of itself totally for the other.**

God gives totally of self to the world in the person of Jesus and Jesus gives totally of self back to God by loving all that he encounters. It is that dynamism of love in mutual self giving to the other that overflows into a third that we name the Spirit. The Spirit for John is the Paraclete, the one who walks beside us in mutual love, guidance, encouragement and support. God's love for us from our first moment of

existence engulfs us in God's trinitarian divine life and love. **We, as God's loving creation, are welcomed into and intimately partake of God's divine trinitarian dance of love.**



As humans we know that love does not evolve in isolation. Two are required for love to work out experientially. We also know that the mutuality of love between two persons is so overwhelming that it flows out into care and concern for another. **If we are created in the image and likeness of God, then this mutual love and concern for the other must have its origin in God, who also is in communion with another, whose dynamism then flows out into a third.** Over the centuries, our faith tradition has named this the Trinity.

The Jewish scriptures have prepared us for this understanding. Jesus has modeled it for us. Today we celebrate it. **And since this Sunday is the return to Ordinary time, it speaks of the essence of what Christians are to be about in their everyday lives: mutuality of love that continually flows into love of others, inviting all to partake of God's trinitarian life and love.** Thus with Paul in today's second reading we can say to each other: "The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, and the love of God and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with all of you."

Reflect on how you enter into and live out the mutuality of love modeled by the Trinity.

Reflexión Sobre las Lecturas

Con la fiesta de Pentecostés, los cincuenta días de la temporada de Pascua vienen a su fin y la Temporada del Tiempo Ordinario vuelve a operar una vez más hasta el primer domingo del Adviento. El Domingo de la Santísima Trinidad es parte del Tiempo Ordinario y ayuda a centrar la atención en la plenitud de la revelación que ha ocurrido a través de los misterios pascuales. La plenitud de nuestro Dios—Padre, Hijo y Espíritu—se nos ha hecho conocer a través de Jesús. **El resto del año litúrgico está dedicado a profundizar nuestra relación y compromiso amoroso con nuestro Dios.** Afirmamos continuamente la unidad de Dios expresada en la trinidad de las personas. ¿Pero que significa todo esto?

La Trinidad nos pone en contacto con el misterio. “Misterio” se puede entender como algo que uno “nunca será capaz de explicar, así que ¿por qué molestarse?” O puede considerarse como algo que es “infinitamente comprensible o explicable”. ¿Qué significa exactamente eso? **Esta declaración toma en serio el hecho de que somos personas vivas y pensativas y queremos que nuestros valores y creencias signifiquen algo.** Si es así, entonces debemos decir algo, aunque sea insuficiente, acerca de cosas que nunca seremos capaces de comprender totalmente o exhaustivamente. **Los misterios nunca deben detenernos de intentar a dar sentido a esas realidades y sus afectos a nuestras vidas.** ¿Qué nos dice el misterio de la Trinidad acerca de nuestro Dios junto con nuestra relación con Dios y con uno al otro?

Las lecturas ofrecen una gran riqueza de ideas para descomprimir la Trinidad. La primera lectura del Éxodo afirma que nuestro Dios es un Dios “compasivo y clemente, paciente, misericordioso y fiel”. Dios ha elegido “venir con nosotros” a pesar de nuestra falta de bondad y fidelidad. **El deseo de Dios de compartir la plenitud de la vida de Dios con nosotros, llamamos “gracia”.** La gracia no es una cantidad sino una relación. Nunca perdemos la gracia de Dios porque Dios la da totalmente, completamente e incondicionalmente, sin reclamarla nunca, sin importar lo que hagamos.

El evangelio de Juan ofrece una gran riqueza de ideas con el verso muy popular 3:16, “Tanto amó Dios al mundo, que le entregó a su Hijo único...” Esta frase revela el corazón del misterio trinitario en la palabra “amor” o “*ágape*” en Griego, “*hesed*” en Hebreo. **Este es el amor firme, el amor dispuesto a darse por completo para el otro.**

Dios da totalmente de sí al mundo en la persona de Jesús y Jesús da totalmente de sí mismo de nuevo a Dios amando todo lo que él encuentra. Es ese dinamismo del amor en la entrega mutua al otro que desborda en una tercera que hemos llamado el Espíritu. El Espíritu para Juan es el Paráclito, el que camina junto a nosotros en amor mutuo, dirección, ánimo y apoyo. El amor de Dios por nosotros desde

nuestro primer momento de existencia nos envuelve en la vida y el amor divinos y trinitarios de Dios. **Nosotros, como la creación amorosa de Dios, somos bienvenidos y participamos íntimamente en la danza de Dios de amor divina y trinitaria.**



Como seres humanos sabemos que el amor no evoluciona de forma aislada. Se necesita dos para que el amor funcione experiencialmente. También sabemos que la reciprocidad de amor entre dos personas es tan abrumadora que fluye hacia el cuidado y la preocupación por el otro. **Si somos creados en la imagen y semejanza de Dios, entonces este amor recíproco y preocupación por el otro debe tener su origen en Dios, que también está en comunión con otro, cuyo dinamismo fluye hacia un tercero.** A lo largo de los siglos, nuestra tradición de fe ha llamado a esto la Trinidad.

Las escrituras judías nos han preparado para este entendimiento. Jesús lo ha modelado para nosotros.
