The teamwork approach used in today’s Gospel is just as relevant to us modern-day Christian stewards. It takes courage and commitment to go out and invite others into the Christian life. We need to work together to do it well. But there is also symbolic importance to working in teams. It points to the reality that when we invite others to embrace the Good News of the Gospel, we are not merely inviting them into a belief system, but into a relationship with Christ and through that relationship, into Christ’s family — our fellow Christian disciples near and far. Our parish is our immediate spiritual family in this extended worldwide fold. We are not meant to live as isolated individuals within the parish any more than we are meant to live in isolation within our families. We are meant to be a community. That is why it is so important for us to foster a vibrant, supportive, welcoming parish life. This is why we emphasize hospitality as one of the pillars of stewardship. Reflection on the Readings

As we continue delving into the mystery of the paschal journey with Jesus, the refrain from Psalm 66 clues us into the theme running through this Sunday's readings: "Let all the earth cry out to God with joy." Joy in the Lord, for all that the Lord has done and will continue to do as we travel the road of discipleship, is what we heartily proclaim this Sunday. The psalmist recalls God's loving care for the people during the Exodus and knows that God's love manifested in past events will and does continue to be made real in our daily lives, here and now. **The Lord's power has done wonders for all the people, and we shout with joy, as we experience the Lord present and active in our lives.**

The first reading comes from the last chapter of Isaiah. The rich images of life, abundance, continued vitality and nourishment suffuse this text. From the lifelessness and death of the Babylonian exile, God has transformed Jerusalem into an overflowing nourishing mother who never ceases to be attuned to the needs of her children. **Isaiah's joy in God overflows as he images Jerusalem as a nursing mother who is ever ready to comfort and give delight to her children.** Life teems all around and within Jerusalem, symbol of God's people, and of God's presence with the people. **Isaiah goes even further in imaging God: "as a mother comforts her child, so will I comfort you."** Everything in this reading makes us cry out to God with joy.



Luke's gospel passage speaks of Jesus, the very joy of God in our midst, missioning his followers, seventy-two in all, to go forth and proclaim the empire or reign of God to all. By healing and establishing a realm of peace, well-being, tranquility and abundance among the

people, God's reign is made real and effective. Ultimately that abundance is centered on Jesus' presence and action in our midst, the very presence and action of God. **In Jesus, God-with-us, there is nothing that we cannot do, even overcoming the forces of evil that often surround and overwhelm us.**

Jesus' followers return, rejoicing in God for the great

things that they were able to accomplish in Jesus' name. Luke has Jesus proclaim that through their work in spreading God's reign, Satan is already defeated, falling "like a lightning bolt from the sky." **Jesus also adds that true joy ultimately comes not from defeating Satan but from intimate union with God expressed in the image of "your names are written in heaven."** This is the ultimate joy that we celebrate today.

No matter what happens, we are to rejoice in the fact that in Jesus, God has chosen to be with us, and we are to proclaim that from the rooftops. Rejection, conflict, oppression will not win out, for the reign of God is at hand, and always will be. This joy is meant for all, symbolized in the number seventy-two, a number inclusive of all the nations of the world as referenced in chapter 10 of Genesis. **We too, in fidelity to our journey as disciples, are called to be inclusive of all, proclaiming God's joyful reign and loving concern for all.**

Paul adds a final note to this aspect of joy. That note centers on the cross. His boast and his joy is in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ. Even when we experience the marks of Jesus on our own bodies through the rejections and opposition of others, still our response is one of joy. We are assured that no matter what happens, God will continue to be our source of life, abundance, vitality and joy. So indeed we too can boast in the cross. **That life of sacrifice, of care and concern for the other no matter the cost, is the hallmark any disciple who walks the paschal journey with Jesus.**

Reflect on how God's life-giving power has been operative in your life. Name some things in your life that make you "cry out to God with joy."

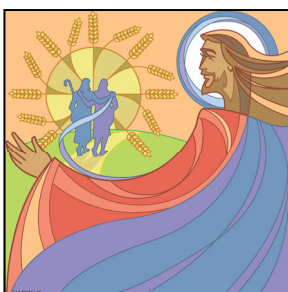

Reflexión Sobre las Lecturas

Mientras continuamos hurgando en el misterio del viaje pascual con Jesús, el Salmo Responsorial 66 nos indica el tema que se encuentra en las lecturas de este domingo: "Alegrémonos con Dios, que con su poder gobierna eternamente". Alegría en el Señor, por todo lo que el Señor ha hecho y continuará haciendo mientras recorremos el camino del discipulado, es lo que proclamamos de corazón este domingo. El salmista recuerda el amoroso cuidado de Dios por la gente durante el Éxodo y sabe que el amor de Dios manifestado en eventos pasados continúa siendo real en nuestras vidas diarias, aquí y ahora. **El poder del Señor ha hecho maravillas para todas las personas, y aclamamos con alegría, al experimentar al Señor presente y activo en nuestras vidas.**

La primera lectura viene del último capítulo de Isaías. Las ricas imágenes de la vida, la abundancia, la vitalidad y el alimento continuo sustentan este texto. Desde la falta de vida y la muerte del exilio babilónico, Dios ha transformado a Jerusalén en una madre desbordante y nutritiva que nunca deja de estar en sintonía con las necesidades de sus hijos. **La alegría de Isaías en Dios se desborda cuando imagina a Jerusalén como una madre lactante que está siempre dispuesta a consolar y dar deleite a sus hijos.** La vida está repleta alrededor y dentro de Jerusalén, símbolo del pueblo de Dios y de la presencia de Dios con el pueblo. **Isaías va aún más lejos al imaginar a Dios: "como un hijo a quien su madre consuela, así los consolaré yo".** Todo en esta lectura nos hace aclamar a Dios con alegría.



El pasaje del evangelio de Lucas habla de Jesús, el mismo gozo de Dios entre nosotros, misionando a sus seguidores, setenta y dos en total, para que proclamen el imperio o el reino de Dios a todos. Al sanar y establecer un reino de paz, bienestar, tranquilidad y abundancia entre

la gente, el reino de Dios se hace real y efectivo. En última instancia, esa abundancia se centra en la presencia y la acción de Jesús entre nosotros la misma presencia y la acción de Dios. **En Jesús, Dios con nosotros, no hay nada que no podamos hacer, incluso superar las fuerzas del mal que muchas veces nos rodean y pueden abrumar.**

Los seguidores de Jesús regresaron regocijándose en Dios por las grandes cosas que pudieron lograr en el nombre de Jesús. Lucas hace que Jesús proclame que a través de su trabajo en la difusión del reino de Dios, Satanás ya está derrotado, cayendo "del cielo como el

rayo". Jesús también agrega que el verdadero gozo, en última instancia, no proviene de derrotar a Satanás sino de una unión íntima con Dios expresada en la imagen de "sus nombres están escritos en el cielo". **Esta es la alegría suprema que celebramos hoy.**

Pase lo que pase, debemos regocijarnos por el hecho de que en Jesús, Dios ha elegido estar con nosotros, y debemos proclamarlo desde los tejados. El rechazo, el conflicto, la opresión no vencerán, porque el reino de Dios está cerca, y siempre lo estará. Esta alegría es para todos, simbolizada en el número setenta y dos, un número que incluye a todas las naciones del mundo como se menciona en el capítulo 10 de Génesis. **Nosotros también, en fidelidad a nuestro viaje como discípulos, estamos llamados a aceptar a todos, proclamando el reinado alegre y la preocupación amorosa de Dios por todos.**

Pablo agrega una nota final a este aspecto de la alegría. Esa nota se centra en la cruz. Su jactancia y su alegría están en la cruz de nuestro Señor Jesucristo. Incluso cuando experimentamos las marcas de Jesús en nuestros propios cuerpos a través de los rechazos y la oposición de los demás, nuestra respuesta es de alegría. Estamos seguros de que pase lo que pase, Dios seguirá siendo nuestra fuente de vida, abundancia, vitalidad y alegría. Así que ciertamente nosotros también podemos jactarnos en la cruz. **Esa vida de sacrificio, de cuidado y preocupación por el otro, sin importar el costo, es el sello distintivo de cualquier discípulo que camina en el viaje pascual con Jesús.**

Reflexione sobre cómo el poder de Dios ha operado en su vida. Nombre algunas cosas en su vida que le hacen alegrar con Dios.
