After two full Synods on the Family in 2014 and 2015, Pope Francis issued the Apostolic Exhortation known as *Amoris Laetitia, The Joy of Love*. These five two-hour sessions will explore select texts from *Amoris Laetitia*, highlighting the wisdom and the insights into love, family and relationship of both Pope Francis and the synod participants. We will examine Francis’ scriptural reflection on love as it impacts real world relationships, and our response to hurting or failed relationships, with special attention paid to divorced and remarried Catholics.

Our Good Friend the Grapefruit

A 2014 lab study at the University of California, Berkeley, found that grapefruit juice not only helped animals lose 18 percent more weight than those that drank just water, but also lowered their blood glucose as effectively as the type 2 diabetes drug metformin. If you have a choice of yellow or pink, choose pink. A ruby red grapefruit provides about a fifth of your daily vitamin A needs (critical for vision and skin) and contains lycopene, the pigment that lends tomatoes their potentially heart-protecting properties. One word of caution: Grapefruit can interfere with certain medications, so check with your doc and read your prescription label for precautions. Add this wonderfully sour fruit to your diet as an alternative to eating only sweet or salty foods. Variety is the spice of life!

Stewardship

“The person who is trustworthy in very small matters is also trustworthy in great ones; and the person who is dishonest in very small matters is also dishonest in great ones. If, therefore, you are not trustworthy with dishonest wealth, who will trust you with true wealth? If you are not trustworthy with what belongs to another, who will give you what is yours? No servant can serve two masters. He will either hate one and love the other, or be devoted to one and despise the other. You cannot serve both God and mammon.”

Luke 16: 10-13

The whole concept of stewardship is clear in today's parable. The steward is the manager (not the owner) of the master's gifts. God is, of course, the manager, and we are the stewards who are charged with the responsibility of overseeing our gifts of time, talent, treasure, and perhaps even influence. Do we use those gifts wisely and with justice? That is the point we must get from this Gospel. Our Holy Father Pope Francis understood the significance of being a steward when he recently said, “In the end, everything has been entrusted to our protection, and all of us are responsible for it. Be protectors of God's gifts.” As the Lord says to the steward in today's Gospel, “The person who is trustworthy in very small matters is also trustworthy in great ones.” — See more at www.catholicsteward.com/blog/

It is very helpful for John to know in advance how many helpers we will have so he can determine how many houses our parish volunteers will be able to help with.

Reflection on the Readings



The refrain from Responsorial Psalm 113, "Praise the Lord who lifts up the poor," offers us the ideal lens for reflecting on today's

readings. The psalm calls upon all of us to praise the Lord who is indeed the master and ruler of the world. Yet, despite all this power and authority, God's primary concern is with the lowly and the poor, continually caring for them and raising them up. God's concerns are to be our concerns. This is the essential message of all the readings.

The prophet Amos speaks of those who cannot wait for the Sabbath to end so that they can continue to become wealthy and powerful by taking advantage of the poor, through cheating, selling inferior products, or by whatever other unjust means they can devise. God, who is continually attentive to the needs of the poor, sees what these people have done, and does not forget. Amos thus warns that unless we model ourselves on our God, we may call God's wrath upon us. Because of our unjust acts, we may have resources now, but a time of reckoning will come. God's justice will eventually set things aright, if not in this life then certainly in the next. Amos the prophet did not mince words when it came to the abuse of justice. No one who abuses or takes advantage of others will escape God's justice.

The second reading from the letter of First Timothy encourages us to pray for all, most especially for kings and those in authority. We pray so

that all, especially those with power and authority, may be attuned, as our God is, to the needs, concerns and cries of the poor. This is the only path leading to a quiet and tranquil life for all. In other words, if we truly seek peace, then we must constantly work for justice and right relationship. Peace will only be realized when all are treated with dignity, when each has what they need to live, when all are treated with respect and honesty, and when right relationship with God, others and all creation dominates our minds and hearts.

Luke's gospel reading is the most challenging of all. Jesus seems to be aware that people in authority or power can and often do take advantage of others to secure their own ultimate ends. This is what the "steward of injustice" is doing. The master even commends the dishonest steward for acting prudently. The steward is commended not for the selfish end he was working toward but for the way he went about achieving it.

In other words, Jesus encourages us to be as industrious and shrewd as the steward in working for our ultimate end, union with God who is continually attuned to the needs of the poor. We are to be as industrious and shrewd in God's affairs, namely being attuned to the poor, as the steward is in his own

affairs. We are to use wealth and power to do God's bidding not ours. This is the meaning behind the proverb that "no servant can serve two masters...you cannot serve both God and money."

Today, Jesus challenges us, the wealthiest of nations, to use all of our shrewdness to lift the poor, giving a home to the homeless, the outcast and the stranger. As we continue to tackle the problem of immigration in our country, the only true perspective that a Christian can embrace is the one that Jesus would have embraced. How shrewd can we be in ensuring that human dignity, respect and right relationship will dominate our discussions and our eventual legislation concerning immigration? Will we choose and support leaders who are willing to sit with and care for the poor, the homeless, and the stranger, leaders who act out of true justice and right relationship?

This week, reflect on how you will use your resources and power shrewdly and prudently so that the poor, the outcast and the alienated will be treated with human dignity and justice. Reflect also on how this mindset will guide you when you vote for leaders in our communities and nation.

Reflexión Sobre las Lecturas



El estribillo del Salmo responsorial 113, "Alaben al Señor que ensalza al pobre", nos ofrece la lente ideal para reflexionar sobre las lecturas de hoy. El salmo nos llama a todos a alabar al Señor, que es en verdad el maestro y gobernante del mundo. Sin embargo, a pesar de todo este poder y autoridad, la principal preocupación de Dios está con

los pequeños y los pobres, continuamente cuidándolos y levantándolos. Las preocupaciones de Dios deberían de ser nuestras preocupaciones. Este es el mensaje esencial de todas las lecturas.

El profeta Amós habla de aquellos que no pueden esperar para que termine el sábado para que puedan continuar a ser rico y poderoso mediante el aprovechamiento de los pobres, a través del engaño, la venta de productos de calidad inferior, o por cualquier otro medio injusto que pueden concebir. Dios, que es continuamente atento a las necesidades de los pobres, ve lo que estas personas han hecho, y no se olvida. Por lo tanto Amós advierte que a menos que se modela a nosotros mismos en nuestro Dios, que podemos llamar la ira de Dios sobre nosotros. A causa de nuestros actos injustos, podemos tener recursos ahora, pero llegará un momento del ajuste de cuentas. La justicia de Dios, con el tiempo, se restablecerá todo, si no en esta vida, entonces sin duda en la próxima. Amós el profeta no tenía pelos en la lengua cuando se trataba de los abusos de la justicia. Nadie que abusa o se aprovecha de los demás va a escapar la justicia de Dios.

La segunda lectura de la carta de Primera Timoteo nos anima a orar por todos, sobre todo para los reyes y las autoridades. Oramos para que todos, especialmente los que tienen el poder y la autoridad, pueden estar en sintonía, como está nuestro Dios, a las necesidades, las preocupaciones y los gritos de los pobres. Este es el único camino que resulta en una vida tranquila y apacible para todos. En otras palabras, si verdaderamente buscamos la paz, entonces debemos trabajar constantemente por la justicia y la relación correcta. La paz sólo se realizará cuando todos son tratados con dignidad, cuando cada uno tiene lo que necesita para vivir, cuando todos son tratados con respeto y honestidad, y cuando una relación correcta con Dios, los demás y toda la creación domina nuestras mentes y corazones.

La lectura del Evangelio de Lucas es el más difícil de todos. Jesús parece ser consciente de que las personas con autoridad o poder se pueden aprovechar y, muchas veces si se aprovechan de los demás para conseguir sus propios fines. Esto es lo que el "administrador de la injusticia" está haciendo. El maestro incluso elogia al

administrador deshonesto por actuar con prudencia. El administrador está elogiado no por el fin egoísta en que estaba trabajando, pero por la forma en que lo realizó.

En otras palabras, Jesús nos anima a ser tan laborioso y astuto como el administrador en trabajar para nuestro fin, la unión con Dios, que está continuamente en sintonía con las necesidades de los pobres. Hemos de ser tan laborioso y astuto en los asuntos de Dios, es decir, estar en sintonía con los pobres, como es el administrador en sus propios asuntos. Tenemos que usar la riqueza y el poder para hacer la voluntad de Dios, no la nuestra. Este es el significado detrás del proverbio de que "ningún siervo puede servir a dos señores ... No se puede servir a Dios y al dinero."

Hoy, Jesús nos desafía, la más rica de las naciones, para utilizar toda nuestra astucia para sacar a los pobres, dar un hogar a las personas sin hogar, los marginados y el extranjero. Mientras continuamos a abordar el problema de la inmigración en nuestro país, la única perspectiva cierto que un cristiano puede abarcar es la que Jesús habría abrazado. ¿Que tan astutos podemos estar en asegurar que la dignidad humana, el respeto y la relación correcta dominarán nuestras discusiones y nuestra legislación eventual a relación a la inmigración? ¿Vamos a elegir y apoyar a líderes que están dispuestos a sentarse con y cuidar de los pobres, las personas sin hogar, y el extranjero, líderes que actúan con la verdadera justicia y la relación correcta?

Esta semana, reflexione sobre cómo va a utilizar sus recursos y poder con astucia y prudencia para que los pobres, los marginados y los alienados serán tratados con la dignidad humana y la justicia. Refleje también en cómo esta forma de pensar le guiará a la hora de votar para los líderes en nuestras comunidades y nación.
