After two full Synods on the Family in 2014 and 2015, Pope Francis issued the Apostolic Exhortation known as Amoris Laetitia, The Joy of Love. An Apostolic Exhortation attempts to gather the wisdom of the Synod participants, along with the insights and perspective of the pope. These five two-hour sessions will explore select texts from Amoris Laetitia, highlighting the wisdom and the insights into love, family and relationship of both Pope Francis and the synod participants. We will examine Francis' scriptural reflection on love as it impacts real world relationships, and our response to hurting or failed relationships, with special attention paid to divorced and remarried Catholics.

All funds collected will be used to fund our annual celebration in honor of Blessed Oscar Romero.

Kefir???

Yogurt gets a lot of attention for its high levels of good-for-you bacteria, but kefir, a creamy dairy drink, can contain up to six times more probiotics. The live cultures of bacteria and yeast responsible for its health benefits are also what give kefir its tanginess. Extensive research has found that regular



consumption of the probiotics found in kefir may ease hay fever symptoms (probiotic bacteria can stabilize the gut's environment and promote the release of anti-allergic immune factors) as well as inhibit the growth of bad bacteria like E. coli, potentially helping to prevent infections. Kefir can take a little getting used to-some find it too sour-so try mixing it with fresh berries, adding a little honey, or masking the tartness by blending it into fruit smoothies.

Those who would like to participate should be single Catholic women between the ages of 18 and 40. The event is free for those participating.



Usher/Greeter Formation

Please help to meet a great need at our parish and prayerfully consider becoming an Usher/Greeter at St. Sabina. We currently do not have enough ushers to schedule at each weekend Mass. Our goal is to increase the number of active, scheduled ushers so that we can have a team of 6 at each Mass. To do this, we need roughly 24 ushers available to serve at each weekend Mass time. This means we are looking for 50 new parishioners to serve as Usher/Greeters.

Any member of our parish, male, female, age 15-115, can be an Usher/Greeter.

What do ushers/greeters do?

- 🕒 Ushers are responsible for welcoming people as they arrive for Mass.
- 🕒 They create an atmosphere of hospitality and make sure general needs of our community are met as they arrive at church.
- 🕒 Ushers take up the collection and find members of our community to present the offering during Mass.
- 🕒 They help facilitate processions and assist during large or special liturgies, when things may be a bit unfamiliar for the assembly.

Reflection on the Readings



Some parents remind children with unfinished dinner plates that there are many poor children going to bed hungry. The reminder often falls on

deaf ears because the poor are usually an abstract group with which we find difficulty identifying. But what if those poor, starving children had a name, a face and an identity we could connect with. Maybe then the poor would not be so distant and abstract. Luke's gospel parable addresses this very issue.

Lazarus is a poor person, hungry, and with sores, lying at the very door of the rich man. The rich man could not avoid physically seeing him. Yet, no mention is made that the rich man ever notices, pays attention to, is concerned about or cares at all for Lazarus. There is a great divide between the rich man and Lazarus, not because of wealth, but because of the rich man's inability to notice, pay attention to or care for one in need, lying at his very door. Wealth in itself is not being criticized by Luke's Jesus. Rather the critique centers on how wealth can insulate and blind us from noticing or paying attention to others in need.

The first reading from the prophet Amos proclaims the same message of inattention to and uncaring for the poor by the rich. "Lying upon beds of ivory and stretched comfortably on their couches" makes people less attentive to the needs of others. Not that such comfortableness is bad or evil. Rather, it can become a great obstacle in our attentiveness to the needs of others. If we have

what we would like and more, why do we have to bother with the needs of others? That is the danger of wealth and comfortableness.

In contrast, the responsorial psalm boldly proclaims that our God is continually attuned to the poor, caring for them and raising them up. The refrain of Psalm 146 invites us to "Praise the Lord, my soul!" (soul meaning "our entire being.") We are invited to praise the Lord because the Lord continually models for us, reminds us, is a sign for us, of what we are to be about. Our God, who "keeps faith forever," "secures justice for the oppressed, gives food to the hungry...sets captives free...gives sight to the blind...raises up those bowed down...loves the just...protects strangers...sustains the fatherless and the widows." If we are ever confused about our mission as followers of Christ, Psalm 146 clearly, quickly and powerfully dispels that confusion. Dorothy Day, the founder of Catholic Worker houses, summed up our Christian vocation well: "to comfort the afflicted and to afflict the comfortable."

What is demanded of one attuned to the will, desire and intention of our God who "keeps faith forever" and "secures justice?" The righteous person develops an attunement to

the poor, securing justice for them, and continually caring for their needs. A God follower pays attention to what is lying at our door, in our neighborhoods, and in the wider community that needs our care and concern.

This is what Jesus came to model for us. We are in relationship with all of God's family. God's reign demands justice. Justice demands right relationship with all, so that all have what they need. God's reign demands that our choices be aligned with God's criteria for true justice, such that the great chasms or divides which usually occur between people can be bridged in this life. The Lazarus story proclaims that unless we bridge those divides in this life, they might be completely unbridgeable in the next life.

This week pay attention to those who might be "lying at your door." How attuned are you to the needs of the poor, the "stranger...the fatherless and the widow?" How can you be more like Jesus and not like the rich man? How can we contribute to actualizing such a Jesus-stance in our communities and our nation?

Reflexión Sobre las Lecturas



Algunos padres recuerdan a los niños con platos sin terminar que hay muchos niños pobres

que se van a dormir con hambre. El recordatorio a menudo cae en saco roto porque los pobres son, por lo general, un grupo abstracto con el que se nos hace difícil identificar. Pero ¿si esos pobres niños hambrientos, tenían un nombre, un rostro y una identidad con que nos podríamos conectar? Tal vez entonces los pobres no serían tan lejanos y abstractos. La parábola del Evangelio de Lucas aborda esta misma cuestión.

Lázaro es una persona pobre, hambrienta y con llagas, situada en la misma puerta del hombre rico. El rico no podía evitar verlo físicamente. Sin embargo, no se hace mención de que el hombre rico lo ve, le presta atención, le preocupa o le importa en absoluto a Lázaro. Hay una gran división entre el rico y Lázaro, no a causa de la riqueza, pero debido a la incapacidad del hombre rico a notar, prestar atención a uno o cuidar de los necesitados de uno que está postrado a su misma puerta. El Jesús de Lucas no está criticando a la riqueza en sí misma. Más bien, la crítica se centra en cómo la riqueza puede aislar y cegarnos de notar o prestar atención a otros en necesidad.

La primera lectura del profeta Amós proclama el mismo mensaje de falta de atención e indiferencia a los pobres por los ricos. "Reclinándose sobre divanes adornados con marfil, y recostándose sobre almohadones" hace la gente menos atento a las necesidades de los demás. No es

que tal comodidad es malo. Más bien, puede convertirse en un gran obstáculo en nuestra atención a las necesidades de los demás. Si tenemos lo que queremos y mucho más, ¿por qué tenemos que molestarlos con las necesidades de los demás? Ese es el peligro de la riqueza y comodidad.

Por el contrario, el salmo responsorial proclama confiadamente que nuestro Dios está en sintonía con los pobres continuamente, cuidándolos y levantándolos. El estribillo del Salmo 146 nos invita a "Alabar, alma mía, al Señor!" (Alma que significa "todo nuestro ser.") Se nos invita a alabar al Señor, porque el Señor continuamente modela para nosotros, nos recuerda, es una señal para nosotros, de lo que hemos de ser. Nuestro Dios, quien "mantiene su fidelidad perpetuamente," "hace justicia a los oprimidos, da pan a los hambrientos ... a los cautivos ... abre los ojos al ciego ... endereza a los que ya se doblan... ama a los justos ... guarda a los peregrinos ... sostiene al huérfano y la viuda." Si volvemos a estar confundidos acerca de nuestra misión como seguidores de Cristo, el Salmo 146 con claridad, rapidez y potencia disipa la confusión. Dorothy Day, el fundador de Catholic Worker Houses, resumió nuestra vocación cristiana así: "para consolar a los afligidos y afligir a los cómodos."

¿Qué es lo que se exige de uno que está en sintonía con la voluntad, el deseo y la intención de nuestro Dios, que "mantiene su fidelidad" y "hace justicia?" La persona justa desarrolla una sintonía a los pobres, asegurando la justicia para ellos, y continuamente

cuidando de sus necesidades. Un seguidor de Dios presta atención al que está tumbado en la puerta, en nuestros barrios, y en la comunidad más amplia que necesita de nuestro cuidado y preocupación.

Esto es lo que Jesús vino a modelar para nosotros. Estamos en relación con toda la familia de Dios. El reino de Dios exige justicia. La justicia exige una relación correcta con todos, para que todos tengan lo que necesitan. El reino de Dios exige que nuestras elecciones estén alineadas con los criterios de Dios para la justicia verdadera, de tal manera que los grandes simas o divisiones que generalmente se producen entre la gente se pueden ser salvadas en esta vida. La historia de Lázaro proclama que a menos que salvamos esas divisiones en esta vida, podrían ser completamente insalvables en la próxima vida.

Esta semana ponga atención a aquellos que podrían "yacer en la entrada de su casa." ¿Qué tan en sintonía está con las necesidades de los pobres, el "extraño ... el huérfano y la viuda?" ¿Cómo puede ser más como Jesús y no como el hombre rico? ¿Cómo podemos contribuir a actualizar tal postura de Jesús en nuestras comunidades y nuestra nación?


