During the month of November, we celebrate the Feast of All Saints Day November 1, and the Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed (or All Souls Day) on November 2. This Week's Do You Know Video:

Luke's gospel offers many lessons for disciples who claim to follow Jesus.



The gospel for the 28th Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year C deals with the healing of ten lepers and Jesus' reaction when only one of the lepers, a Samaritan, returned to give thanks to God. While the obvious lesson for disciples focuses on the need to give thanks for God's many blessings, an even more important lesson is how Jesus breaks boundaries not only by traveling through Samaria, a territory not welcoming to Jews, but also by entering the space of a leper community, something that no Jew would have dared. Make time to view this week's DYK video and learn the lesson in discipleship that Jesus models for us in this Sunday's gospel reading.

Gratitude is the key to a stewardship way of life. Today's readings demonstrate the power and vital importance of gratitude in the life of the Christian disciple, for gratitude leads us to worship God, who offers us salvation. Our very lives and every breath we take are His gift to us. But we can get so caught up in the stresses and distractions of daily life that we lose touch with this truth. The Samaritan reacts to his gift of healing with the proper response to our loving God. Recognizing what he had just received from the Lord, he "returned, glorifying God in a loud voice; and he fell at the feet of Jesus and thanked Him." He was grateful for what God had done for him and this gratitude led to worship. And because of this response, Jesus offered him a far more precious gift than physical healing; He offered him the gift of salvation. "Stand up and go; your faith has saved you." Too often we hear the phrase, "Count your blessings," and write it off as nothing more than a trite saying. Today's Gospel shows us otherwise. Gratitude is powerful. IRA Required Minimum Distribution

When you make a gift of a distribution from your IRA to your parish, it allows you to demonstrate a legacy of love for Christ and His Church. If you're over 70 ½, donating your IRA Required Minimum Distribution can also save on taxes. To make a Qualified Charitable Distribution from your IRA, contact Kris in the parish office with questions. Or, contact Laura Gray at gray@diocesekcsj.org, 816-714-2363.

To leave your parish a bequest (e.g. will) or name it as a beneficiary (e.g. life insurance, an annuity), make sure your intentions are understood by providing as much identifying information as possible. Ideally, state the Legal Name, Tax ID Number, Address, City, State, and Zip.

Delegation to El Salvador - February 10-17

Due to responses from parishioners interested in working to build homes in Paso Puente, we have changed the itinerary and the dates of our delegation to El Salvador. Our new dates of the delegation will be February 10-17. While in El Salvador, we will spend the majority of our time in Paso Puente, as well as try to arrange to visit with some of our scholarship students. This will be an incredible experience, joining our brothers and sisters in solidarity to build dignified homes for families. The children living in Paso Puente have never lived in a dignified home, instead they've only lived in shacks assembled from scrap materials. Our delegation will also have the opportunity to visit Romero Community, which is a neighborhood across the street from Paso Puente. Just four years ago, Romero Community was living in squalor, like Paso Puente is now. They received title to their land and, through many generous donations, 65 dignified homes have been built in Romero Community. 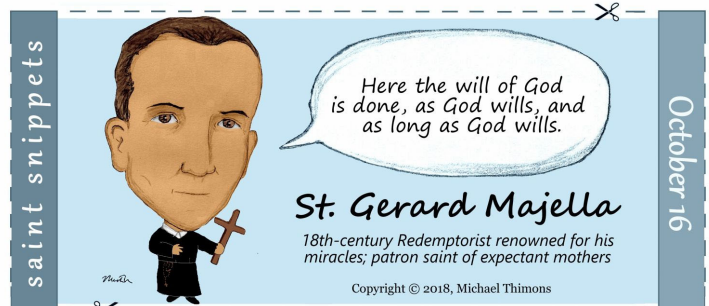
Child Safety

1. Call the Missouri Child Abuse Hotline at 1.800.392.3738 (if the victim is currently under the age of 18), and
2. Contact your local law enforcement agency or call 911, and
3. After reporting to these civil and law enforcement authorities, report suspected **sexual abuse of a minor or vulnerable adult** to the Diocesan Ombudsman, Joe Crayon, at 816.812.2500 or crayon@ombudsmankcsj.org, if the abuse involves a priest, deacon, employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Kansas City-St. Joseph.

The Diocese has a sincere commitment to providing care and healing resources to victims of sexual abuse and their families. Please contact Victim Advocate, Kathleen Chastain, at 816.392.0011 or chastain@diocesekcsj.org for more information.

Reflection on the Readings

The readings this Sunday address an issue that often challenges most Christians. **Is God's saving power intended just for those who believe the way we do, or is God's saving power for all, no matter what they believe? Is the Christian journey the only path to salvation or are there other paths?** The refrain from Responsorial Psalm 98, "The Lord has revealed to the nations his saving power" gives a definite answer to our query. **Our God is the God of all, securing justice for all, ever mindful of fidelity and covenant love. God's saving power knows no boundaries, limits or particularities.**

Luke's Jesus consistently crosses boundaries so that God's love, presence and power can be showered on all, especially the stranger, the foreigner, the outcast, the marginalized and the sinner. In Luke, this crossing of boundaries is often done in the context of table sharing. In today's reading, the context is the healing of ten lepers, a story unique to Luke. **While the usual focus of this story is thankfulness for God's healing power and grace, the theme of God's love and power knowing no boundaries is more consistent with Luke's themes and message.** It speaks powerfully to the many ways in which we humans consistently create boundaries that divide rather than bridges that unite and connect.

Jesus' travel to Jerusalem brings him to the border between Galilee and Samaria. **This border breaching by Jesus offers us an opportunity to learn what our God is all about. Approaching lepers and speaking with them is another example of border breaching.** Jews did not cross such boundaries for many reasons: socially unacceptable, not our kind, not holy enough, and ritual impurity.

The usual thought pattern was that if others do not do or see things our way, then we will separate ourselves from them, because we believe that God is on our side of the border and not on theirs. **Jesus profoundly challenges this distorted image of God by deliberately crossing boundaries to show that God's love is for all, even those we would not ordinarily welcome to our side.** Such a lesson is usually rather difficult for most people to understand, much less accept and do likewise. **We humans seem to be more comfortable building walls or fences to keep people on their side of the border.** But, building a wall or a fence to keep the needy and the

oppressed out is in no way consistent with what Jesus teaches and what we claim to believe and follow.

Jesus heals all ten lepers, and does not ask for their Jewish identity papers. Only later do we find out that the one who returned to give thanks was a Samaritan, an outsider despised and hated by the Jews. "This foreigner" was the only one to return and give thanks while the others, presumably all Jews, did not. **Could it be that the foreigner is more attuned to love manifested by those from whom it was least expected?** Luke does not give us an answer, leaving it up to us to discern the motives. **Rather Luke focuses on God's love and saving power available to all. Shouldn't our love and ability to help others be the same? As disciples, we are called to model ourselves on Jesus' welcoming, hospitable and inclusive manner of interacting with all, most especially those despised by others?**

Elisha, the man of God, is a Jew, while Naaman the leper is a foreigner. Elisha had every right to refuse help to Naaman since he was not Jewish. **But Elisha freely and willingly heals Naaman through God's saving power available to all.** Second Timothy clearly reminds us that "the word of God is not chained." **There are no limits placed on God's word, love, grace and touch. Shouldn't our word, love, grace and touch imitate God's?**

The readings speak of thanksgiving to God for gracing all with love and saving power, and for shattering our boundaries and restrictive images of God. **As we partake of Eucharist, our cherished thanksgiving to God, reflect on how open you are in breaking boundaries so that God's healing power and love can benefit all, most especially the stranger and the immigrant.** What will you do this week in response to Jesus' challenge to welcome the stranger and to heal the foreigner?

Reflexión Sobre las Lecturas

Las lecturas de este domingo abordan un problema que a menudo desafía a la mayoría de los cristianos. **¿El poder salvador de Dios está destinado solo para aquellos que creen de la manera que nosotros creemos, o es el poder salvador de Dios para todos, sin importar lo que crean? ¿Es el camino cristiano el único camino a la salvación o hay otros caminos?** El refrán del Salmo Responsorial 98, "El Señor revela a las naciones su justicia" da una respuesta definitiva a nuestra pregunta. **Nuestro Dios es el Dios de todos, asegurando la justicia para todos, siempre atento a la fidelidad y al amor de alianza. El poder salvador de Dios no conoce límites, o particularidades.**

El Jesús de Lucas constantemente cruza los límites para que el amor, la presencia y el poder de Dios se puedan derramar sobre todos, especialmente sobre el desconocido, el extranjero, el marginado y el pecador. En Lucas, este cruce de límites a menudo se realiza en el contexto del compartir mesa. En la lectura de hoy, el contexto es la curación de diez leprosos, una historia única de Lucas. **Si bien el enfoque habitual de esta historia es el agradecimiento por el poder sanador y la gracia de Dios, el tema del amor y el poder de Dios sin conocer límites es más consistente con los temas y el mensaje de Lucas.** Habla poderosamente de las muchas formas en que los humanos creamos constantemente límites que dividen en lugar de puentes que unen y conectan.

El viaje de Jesús a Jerusalén lo lleva a la frontera entre Galilea y Samaria. **Esta violación de fronteras por parte de Jesús nos ofrece la oportunidad de aprender de qué se trata nuestro Dios. Acercarse a los leprosos y hablar con ellos es otro ejemplo de violación de fronteras.** Los judíos no cruzaron tales límites por muchas razones: socialmente inaceptable, no de nuestro tipo, no lo suficientemente santo, e impureza ritual.

El patrón de pensamiento habitual era que si otros no hacen o ven las cosas a nuestra manera, entonces nos separaremos de ellos, porque creemos que Dios está de nuestro lado de la frontera y no el de ellos. **Jesús desafía profundamente esta imagen distorsionada de Dios al cruzar deliberadamente los límites para mostrar que el amor de Dios es para todos, incluso aquellos que normalmente no recibiríamos de nuestra parte.** Dicha lección suele ser bastante difícil de entender para la mayoría de las personas, mucho menos para aceptar y hacer lo mismo. **Los humanos parecemos estar más cómodos construyendo muros o cercas para mantener a las personas a su lado de la frontera.** Pero, construir un muro o una cerca para mantener a los necesitados y los oprimidos no es de ninguna manera consistente con lo que Jesús enseña y lo que afirmamos creer y seguir.

Jesús sana a los diez leprosos y no pide sus documentos de identidad judíos. Solo más tarde descubrimos que el que volvió a dar gracias fue un samaritano, un desconocido despreciado y odiado por los judíos. "Este extranjero" fue el único que regresó y dio gracias, mientras que los demás, presumiblemente todos judíos, no lo hicieron. **¿Podría ser que el extranjero esté más en sintonía con el amor manifestado por aquellos de quienes menos se esperaba?** Lucas no nos da una respuesta, dejándonos a nosotros discernir los motivos. **Más bien, Lucas se enfoca en el amor de Dios y el poder salvador disponible para todos. ¿No deberían ser iguales nuestro amor y nuestra capacidad para ayudar a los demás? Como discípulos, estamos llamados a modelarnos sobre la manera acogedora, hospitalaria e inclusiva de Jesús de interactuar con todos, ¿especialmente con aquellos despreciados por otros.**

Eliseo, el hombre de Dios, es judío, mientras que Naamán el leproso es extranjero. Eliseo tenía todo el derecho de rechazar la ayuda a Naamán ya que él no era judío. **Pero Eliseo sana libremente y voluntariamente a Naamán a través del poder salvador de Dios disponible para todos.** 2 Timoteo nos recuerda claramente que "la palabra de Dios no está encadenada". **No hay límites para la palabra, el amor, la gracia y el tacto de Dios. ¿No deberían nuestra palabra, amor, gracia y tacto imitar las de Dios?**

Las lecturas hablan de dar gracias a Dios por agradar a todos con amor y poder salvador, y por romper nuestros límites e imágenes restrictivas de Dios. **A medida que participamos de la Eucaristía, nuestra apreciada acción de gracias a Dios, reflexione sobre que tan abierto está a romper los límites para que el poder sanador y el amor de Dios puedan beneficiar a todos, especialmente al extranjero y al inmigrante.** ¿Qué hará esta semana en respuesta al desafío de Jesús de dar la bienvenida al desconocido y sanar al extranjero?

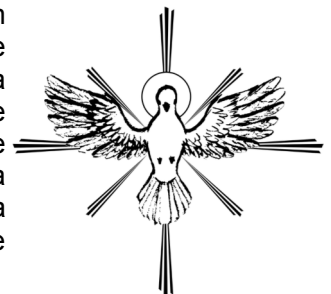

En Nuestro Video ¿Sabes...? de Esta Semana:

El evangelio de Lucas ofrece muchas lecciones para los discípulos que dicen seguir a Jesús. El evangelio para el vigésimo octavo domingo del tiempo ordinario, año C, se trata de la curación de diez leprosos y la reacción de Jesús cuando solo uno de los leprosos, un samaritano, regresó para dar gracias a Dios. Si bien la lección obvia para los discípulos se centra en la necesidad de dar gracias por las muchas bendiciones de Dios, una lección aún más importante es cómo Jesús rompe los límites no solo al viajar a través de Samaria, un territorio que no acoge a los judíos, sino también al entrar en el espacio de una comunidad leprosa, algo que ningún judío se hubiera atrevido a hacer.
