

Canonization of Oscar Romero - Oct 14

On Sunday, October 14th Pope Francis is expected to canonize Pope Paul VI and Oscar Romero. Our Salvadoran community will celebrate the canonization of Oscar Romero at the 12:30 Mass on Sunday, October 14th with our Romero choir providing music for the Mass and a reception in the gym following Mass. All are invited to attend.

Oscar Romero, Archbishop of San Salvador, El Salvador, spoke out often against his government and the human rights violations perpetrated by those in power. He persistently defended the rights of the people, calling government leaders to conversion and challenging them to uphold God's law. He reminded the people that they were loved by God and that fighting back with Christian charity was the way to victory. His vocal response to government violence against the poor led to difficulties with other clergy members and his religious superiors, as well as death threats from government accomplices. Despite these challenges, he continued to speak out on behalf of the poor. He was assassinated while celebrating Mass on March 24, 1980.

The Book will be placed in the church during Mass on November 2 for the Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed as a way to honor those whose names are inscribed there. After that, it will remain in the Area of Remembrance throughout November.



Parish Happenings/Information

This Week's Do You Know Video:



As we continue our series on the key principles of the Second Vatican Council, this week's DYK video speaks of how Vatican II addressed the social mission of the church. For many centuries, especially since the Reformation, the mission of the church was focused on the salvation of its members, without much attention to the transformation of the social order. In the late 19th century, Pope Leo begins to focus the church's attention on social justice issues that emanated from the principles of natural law. With Pope John XXIII and the Vatican II participants, social justice and the transformation of social order was grounded in the modeling of Jesus and on gospel values. Much progress was made in this direction by Pope Paul VI, the Synod on Justice in the World, and the Latin American Bishops both at Medellin and Puebla -- all insisted that the transformation of the social order and the preferential option for the poor is a constitutive dimension of the mission of the church and all its members. While the church has a duty and obligation to speak to justice issues on behalf of the poor and oppressed, it must also respect the freedom of others, even its own members, to disagree on how to achieve such a desired goal. Make time to view this week's DYK video and immerse yourself in how Vatican II challenges us regarding the social mission of the church.



Pyx—Sign Out Sheet



But he rightfully suspects there is more to being a disciple of Jesus than just following the external rules. We are called to be so much more than rule-followers; we are called to be Christ followers. Reflection on the Readings

The refrain from responsorial Psalm 90 sums up well this Sunday's focus, "Fill us with your love, O Lord, and we will sing for joy." Psalm 90 expresses a song of joy, delighting in God's faithful love (hesed). Such faithful love is freely given without limits. Yet limitless love costs God a great deal. A steep price is asked of anyone who chooses to love so totally. **Yet in loving so, one begins to enter the very self of God.** Today's readings touch on this search for wisdom: what it involves, the price demanded, and the consequent rewards.

Psalm 90, a communal lament, contains many themes borrowed from wisdom literature. The community seems to be experiencing distress and turns to God for help. Beginning with a meditation on life's fragility and brevity (verses 1-6), the psalmist seeks reconciliation with God over any sinfulness that might have led to this state of distress. The psalmist prays for wisdom in the midst of life's sorrows and fragility (verses 7-12).

The last portion of the psalm (verses 13-17) consists of a lament prayer. The psalmist waits on daybreak, the traditional time for anticipating God's deliverance, after passing a long night in prayer and fasting, waiting upon the Lord. The psalm ends on a note of trust, calling upon the Lord to be faithful to covenant love. **Trusting in God's faithful love is the wisdom that one hangs on to in the midst of everything that seems to contradict that love.**

The first reading comes from the book of Wisdom, attributed to Solomon by an unknown author. **In this passage, Solomon asks God not for riches or fame but for wisdom. In doing so, Solomon opens himself up to all that wisdom demands, as well as all the rewards that come with practicing wisdom.** Such wisdom is to be prized above all else for it is the source of all other good things in life. Such is the reward of those whose faith and trust enables them to rely upon God's faithful love.

The rich young man in Mark's gospel is, like the disciples, on a search for the true wisdom, desiring to do what is required in order to inherit eternal life. Jesus challenges him with the ethical life style of the commandments. Having

adhered to them, the rich young man desires more, seeking a path to greater intimacy with God. **Jesus' response gets at that very wisdom of God: to be like God, one has to let go of all that one values and take on the wisdom of God.**

This challenge is just too much for the rich young man, and he goes away sad, because he could not let go of what he valued. The disciples are dismayed and wonder what will happen to them who have let go of all for the sake of God. **Jesus responds that those who have let go, choosing the path of God's wisdom, will have all good things, including persecutions, and eternal life. God's wisdom is the source of all good things that have true meaning in this life and beyond.**

The selection from Hebrews speaks of this search for wisdom by asserting that true wisdom requires attuning ourselves to the word of God. To know God, to acquire the wisdom of God, one is to dwell in the word of God, confronting its challenge ("sharper than any two-edged sword"), and conforming to it, allowing it to penetrate "soul and spirit, joints and marrow." In seeking wisdom, are you ready to pay the price demanded? **Where will your reflection lead you as you confront the word of God, living and effective this Sunday in our community celebration? May your search and reflection lead you joyously to God's wisdom.**



Esta semana, tomese el tiempo para reflexionar sobre cómo busca la sabiduría en su vida y cómo esa búsqueda es una relación con Dios y con los demás. Esta disputa a aceptar el desafío que requiere la búsqueda de la sabiduría? Responde como Salomon, o como el joven rico? ¿Por qué exigido? ¿A donde le lleva la reflexión cuando confronte la Palabra de Dios, viva y efectiva es la que suscita y reflexión le guie albergemente a la sabiduría de Dios.

La selección de Hebreos habla de esta búsqueda de sabiduría al afirmar que la verdadera sabiduría requiere sinfonizarnos con la Palabra de Dios. Para conocer a Dios, para adquirir la sabiduría de Dios, uno debe morar en la Palabra de Dios, confrontando su desafío ("más penetrante que una espada de dos fillos"), y conformándose a ella, permitiéndole penetrar en "hasta lo más íntimo del alma, hasta la médula de los huesos". Esto lo pone a uno en contacto con el mismísimo ser de Dios, trayendo la sabiduría y sus alegrias consueñadas.

Este desafío es demasiado para el joven rico, y se va tristíte porque no pudo dejar de lado lo que vale más. Los discípulos están consternados y se preguntran qué sucederá a los que han abandonado todo por Dios. Jesús responde que aquello que lo han dejado, escogiendo el camino de la sabiduría de Dios, tendrán todas cosas buenas, incluidas las persecuciones y la vida eterna. La sabiduría de Dios es la fuente de todas las cosas buenas que tienen un verdadero significado en esta vida más allá.

a esa misma sabiduría de Dios; para ser como Dios, uno tiene que dejar ir todo lo que uno valora y asumir la sabiduría de Dios.

La última parte del salmo (versos 13-17) consiste en una oración de lamento. El salmista espera al liberación de Dios, tiempo tradicional para anticipar la amanecer, el lamento despierta para unirse a la oración y ayuno, esperando al Señor. El salmo termina con una nota de confianza, diciendo al Señor que sea fiel al pacto de amor. Confiar en el amor fiel de Dios es la sabiduría a la que uno se aferra en medio de todo lo que parece contradecir ese amor.

La primera lectura proviene del libro de la Sabiduría, atribuido a Salomón por un autor desconocido. En este pasaje, Salomón le pide a Dios no por riquezas o fama, sino por sabiduría. Al hacerlo, Salomón se abra a todo lo que exige la sabiduría, así como a todas las recompensas que se obtiene con la práctica de la sabiduría. Tal sabiduría debe ser apreciada por encima de todo porque es la fuente de todas las demás cosas buenas de la vida. Tal es la recompensa de aquello que se y confianza les permite confiar en el amor fiel de Dios.

EI joven rico en el evangelio de Marcos está, como los discípulos, en una búsqueda de la verdad para saberdumbre, deseando hacer lo que se requiere para heredár la vida eterna. Jesús lo desafía con el estilo de vida ético de los mandamientos. Al adentrarse a ellos, el joven rico deseaba que se respetara su camino hacia una mayor intimidad con Dios. La respuesta de Jesús le

El estribillo del Salmo 89 resume bien el entoque de este domingo: "Sacianos, Señor, de tu misericordia, y toda nues tra vida será alegría y jubilo". El Salmo 89 expresa una canción de alegría de infinita y total libertad sin límites. Sin embargo, uno comienza a sentir en el mismo ser de Dios. Las lecciones de hoy abordan el tema de la comunión con Dios en el lenguaje de la literatura de sabiduría. La comunión con Dios es la experiencia angustiosa y acude a Dios en busca de ayuda. Comenzando con una meditación sobre la fragilidad y brevedad de la vida (versos 1-6), el salmista busca la reconciliación con Dios por cualquier pecado que pudiera haber conducido a este estado de angustia. El salmista ora por sabiduría en medio de las tristezas y la fragilidad de la vida (versos 7-12).




