


Area of Remembrance - All Souls

During the month of November, we celebrate the Feast of All Saints Day November 1, and the Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed (or All Souls Day) on November 2. The church traditionally honors those who have gone before us in faith throughout the entire month. To honor our loved ones who have gone before us we will have an Area of Remembrance in the north alcove. **We invite you to bring a picture of your deceased loved one beginning the weekend of Oct. 28/29.** The display to honor all of our Faithful Departed will remain up through the Feast of Christ the King, Sunday November 26th.

The Book of the Names of the Dead will also be displayed in the gathering space, in which you may write the names of deceased loved ones to remember during this time. The Book will be placed in the church during Mass on November 2 for the Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed as a way to honor those whose names are inscribed there. After that, it will remain in the Area of Remembrance throughout November.

Remembering the Dead

Christian communities remember the names of their dead. These names are heard in the Prayer of the Faithful during Mass and in the chanting of the Litany of the Saints at the Easter Vigil. The names of the deceased are seen on holy cards, memorial cards, and grave markers. Masses are prayed for the repose of souls. These rituals and practices serve to keep the memory of those who have gone before us in faith present in our minds and hearts.



Wellness Center

Did you know the human body is 65-75% water? This water to metabolize the naturally occurring nitrogen in week we'll continue our series on water and staying protein, and cells can become water-depleted. properly hydrated. Drinking enough water is the key to staying hydrated. However, lack of water intake isn't the only cause of chronic dehydration. Some foods, when sodium naturally present in salt. Foods like soy sauce, consumed excessively, can lead to chronic dehydration. Other foods that may have high-sodium content include fast food, canned or frozen meals, condiments, and salad dressings.

Here are 5 foods that can make you dehydrated:

1. **Coffee-** It's well-known that coffee (and caffeinated tea) is a diuretic and caffeine speeds up dehydration. These effects are seen when your caffeine intake exceeds 500 milligrams a day, which is about five cups of coffee. However, if you drink more than two cups a day, you should still increase your water intake to prevent imbalance due to fluid loss.

2. **Alcohol-** Alcohol is also a natural diuretic, which is why when you're drinking, you have the urge to use the restroom frequently. After a night of drinking, you end up dehydrated, which can explain your headache the next day. Alcohol depletes your cells of water, which is responsible for your lack of energy.

3. **High Protein Intake-** If you're on a high-protein diet, you may end up chronically dehydrated if you don't increase your water intake. The body has to use more

5. **Sugary Drinks-** A sugary drink can seem refreshing at first. However, drinks with high-sugar content can increase water loss in your body. Sugary drinks create an acidic environment that can impair enzyme function and decrease your body's water storage capacity, which

Reflection on the Readings



As we approach the end of the liturgical year, the readings focus on the end times. The readings present scenarios that envision what relationship with God will be for those who respond positively to God's invitation as well as the fate of those who reject God's invitation. *Today's readings unpack the Jewish image of eternal life with God as a wedding banquet.* Our God is the loving and generous host and provider who lavishes us with "rich food and choice wines." We are invited to be part of that wedding banquet both now and for all times. How will we respond to God's invitation to the eternal wedding banquet?

God's covenant with all of creation was often understood by the Jewish people as a marriage relationship. God chose to be in close and intimate relationship with all of humanity, with the depth of love and intimacy characteristic of a marriage relationship. The prophets Isaiah and Hosea both express this intimacy with great tenderness. *The marriage relationship image led to picturing our life with God in terms of an eternal wedding banquet, in which God was the bridegroom and we the bride.*

Isaiah in the first reading imagines a time when God, our host and loving provider, will lavish us with a rich banquet. God will wipe away all tears and reproach from the people. This reading is often used at funerals to convey that our relationship with God not only continues with our death, but enters a whole new and more intimate expression, symbolized by a rich and lavish banquet.

Responsorial Psalm 23 emphasizes our desire to be always with the Lord by asking us to affirm in the refrain that "I shall live in the house of the Lord all the days of my life." *Psalm 23, like the Isaiah reading, stresses God's lavish hospitality as host in providing peace, security, a home and food for all those who accept God's invitation to the banquet.* How could anyone refuse such an invitation?

Matthew's parable of the king giving a lavish wedding banquet for his son tells us that the special guests invited to the feast refuse the invitation. In so doing, they are rejecting the special intimacy

and relationship that God desires and invites us to enter. The king is persistent in his invitation and does not give up. He invites any and all who are willing to come to the wedding feast. *God desires to be in intimate relationship with all and invites all to the eternal banquet. But God does not force, leaving it up to us to accept or refuse.*

Accepting the invitation however involves more than just showing up. Such an acceptance implies that we are willing to live and act according to God's will and desires. Jesus is the bridegroom who shows us how to live. *If we accept God's invitation, then we are responsible for living the Jesus life style and values. Refusing to do so will automatically render us unsuitable for the banquet.* In accepting God's loving and generous invitation to the eternal wedding banquet, how will you prepare yourself to be an intimate part of that banquet?



A good measure of our readiness for the banquet might be our readiness for entering into the weekly Eucharistic banquet. *How well do you prepare for entering into intimate relationship with God at our Sunday Eucharist?*

Could it be an indication of your readiness to enter the

eternal banquet with God? Ask God for help and guidance in living daily in such a manner that enables you to prepare for the eternal wedding banquet in the Lord's house.

Reflexión Sobre las Lecturas



Ya que nos acercamos al final del año litúrgico, las lecturas se centran en los tiempos finales. Las lecturas presentan escenarios que prevean como será la relación con Dios para aquellos que responden positivamente a la invitación de Dios, así como el destino de aquellos que rechazan la invitación de Dios. *Las lecturas de hoy desempacan la imagen judía de la vida eterna con Dios como un banquete de bodas.* Nuestro Dios es el anfitrión y proveedor generoso que nos proclama "alimentos ricos y vinos de elección". Estamos invitados a ser parte de ese banquete de bodas tanto ahora como para todos los tiempos. ¿Cómo responderemos a la invitación de Dios al eterno banquete de bodas?

El pacto de Dios con toda la creación era a menudo entendido por el pueblo judío como una relación matrimonial. Dios escogió estar en una relación cercana e íntima con toda la humanidad, con la profundidad del amor y la intimidad característica de una relación matrimonial. Los profetas Isaías y Oseas expresan esta intimidad con gran ternura. *La imagen de la relación matrimonial nos llevó a imaginar nuestra vida con Dios en términos de un eterno banquete de bodas, en el que Dios era el novio y nosotros la novia.*

En la primera lectura Isaías imagina un tiempo en que Dios, nuestro anfitrión y proveedor amoroso, nos prodigará con un rico banquete. Dios enjugará toda lágrima y oprobio del pueblo. Muchas veces esta lectura se utiliza en los funerales para transmitir que nuestra relación con Dios no sólo continúa con nuestra muerte, sino que entra en una nueva y más íntima expresión, simbolizada por un rico y sumptuoso banquete.

El Salmo responsorial 22 enfatiza nuestro deseo de estar siempre con el Señor pidiéndonos que afirmemos en el estribillo que "habitaré en la casa del Señor, por años sin término". *El Salmo 22, como la lectura de Isaías, enfatiza la hospitalidad pródiga de Dios como anfitrión en la provisión de paz, seguridad, hogar y comida para todos aquellos que aceptan la invitación de Dios al banquete.* ¿Cómo podría alguien rechazar tal invitación?

La parábola de Mateo del rey que da un banquete de bodas para su hijo nos dice que los invitados especiales rechazan la invitación. Al hacerlo, están rechazando la intimidad y relación especial que Dios desea y en que nos invita a entrar. El rey es persistente en su invitación

y no se rinde. Invita a todos los que están dispuestos a venir a la fiesta de bodas. *Dios desea estar en íntima relación con todos e invita a todos al banquete eterno. Pero Dios no obliga, dejándonos aceptar o rechazar.*

Aceptar la invitación, sin embargo, implica más que simplemente llegar. Tal aceptación implica que estamos dispuestos a vivir y actuar de acuerdo con la voluntad y los deseos de Dios. Jesús es el novio que nos muestra cómo vivir. *Si aceptamos la invitación de Dios, entonces somos responsables de vivir el estilo de vida y los valores de Jesús. Si se niega a hacerlo, automáticamente nos haremos inadecuados para el banquete.* Al aceptar la amorosa y generosa invitación de Dios al eterno banquete de bodas, ¿cómo se preparará para ser parte íntima de ese banquete?



Una buena medida de nuestra disposición para el banquete podría ser nuestra disposición para entrar en el banquete semanal de la Eucaristía. *¿Qué tan bien se prepara para entrar en una relación íntima con Dios en nuestra Eucaristía dominical?* ¿Podría ser una indicación de su disposición a entrar en el banquete eterno con Dios? Pida ayuda y guía a Dios para vivir diariamente de tal manera que le permita prepararse para el eterno banquete de bodas en la casa del Señor.
