



Month of All Souls

The origins of the solemnity of All Saints (November 1) and the Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed (All Souls Day, November 2) are connected. Honoring the dead dates to prehistoric times and finds expression in various parts of the world, with tributes given to deceased loved ones and veneration of those most worthy offered on the day of their birth. In the pre-Christian Celtic religion, November 1 and 2 were the celebration of their new year, when dead souls would return for a visit.

From the beginnings of the Church, Christians have cherished the memory of those martyred for the faith as icons of Jesus Christ. The small shrines built where the martyrs' remains were buried became places of prayer and pilgrimage. On the anniversary of a martyr's death, the dies natales, or birth into the new and heavenly Jerusalem, was commemorated at the tomb, with Eucharist celebrated at dawn on their graves. The martyrs became venerated as disciples and imitators of Christ.



All the saints are celebrated each year on November 1; however, most Christian traditions of honoring the dead are linked with All Souls Day on November 2. On this day, we remember our own loved ones who have gone before us in faith. These tributes extend beyond the day itself and last through the month of November, the Month of All Souls. The days are now at their darkest; crops have been harvested; leaves have changed colors and are falling to the ground; the weather turns cold and bitter, while the readings of the liturgy direct our thoughts to the end times, when Christ will return in his full glory restoring the fullness of salvation to all of creation. What a perfect time to remember our beloved dead!



Stewardship

"Is it lawful to pay the census tax to Caesar or not?" Knowing their malice, Jesus said, 'Why are you testing me, you hypocrites? Show me the coin that pays the census tax.' Then they handed him the Roman coin.

He said to them, 'Whose image is this and whose inscription?' They replied, 'Caesar's.' At that he said to them, 'Then repay to Caesar what belongs to Caesar and to God what belongs to God.'

Matthew 22: 17-21

The coin may be stamped with Caesar's image, but each of us is stamped with God's image. Thus, Jesus is implying that the coin may be Caesar's but each of us belongs to God. In that regard we should be striving to be all those things to which Jesus called us. That is in effect what a stewardship way of life is — recognizing that God is in each of us, we are to place ourselves in service to God and to one another. Alzheimer's Empowerment Seminar—Nov. 16

Presented by experts from the KU Alzheimer's Disease Center topics will include; How to Distinguish Concerning Memory Changes from Typical Aging, Current Standard of Treatments, Identifying Risk Factors and Identifying Resources. This seminar is free and open to the public.

Wellness Center

Did you know tap water and bottled water are generally comparable in terms of safety? So, the choice of tap or bottled is mostly a matter of personal preference.

The Food and Drug Administration (FDA) oversees bottled water, while the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) regulates tap water. However, they use similar standards for ensuring safety.

The EPA mandates that water utilities provide annual quality reports to customers. These customer confidence reports provide information, such as source (river, lake, aquifer), contaminant levels and potential health effects. However, the EPA doesn't regulate private wells. So if your tap water comes from a private well, you should test your water every year for contaminants, more frequently if needed.

The FDA has good manufacturing practices specifically for bottled water. They require bottled water producers to:

- Process, bottle, hold and transport bottled water under sanitary conditions
- Protect water sources from bacteria, chemicals and other contaminants
- Use quality control processes to ensure the bacteriological and chemical safety of the water
- Sample and test both source water and the final product for contaminants

It's important to note that some people are more vulnerable to getting sick from contaminants in drinking water. You may be in this group if you are undergoing chemotherapy or have received a transplant. Pregnant women, older adults and children also may be at greater risk. Talk with your doctor about whether you should take additional precautions, such as boiling tap water or drinking bottled water.

Child Safety

The Diocese of Kansas City-St. Joseph is committed to combatting sexual abuse in the Church. If you are a victim of sexual abuse, or if you observe or suspect sexual abuse:

1. Call the Missouri Child Abuse Hotline at 1.800.392.3738 (if the victim is currently under the age of 18), and
2. Contact your local law enforcement agency or call 911, and
3. Reflection on the Readings



Responsorial Psalm 96 sets the tone for the focus of this Sunday's readings. It acknowledges that God is king and governs the people with equity or justice. Because of this we are called upon to "Give the Lord glory and honor." All nations are called upon to worship the Lord, to honor and praise God for acting with justice and compassion toward all creation. *The other readings enter into dialogue with each other and the psalm, challenging us to understand and acknowledge God as the ultimate source of power and might in the world.*

The first reading from Isaiah refers to Cyrus, the mighty king of the Persians who overwhelmed the Babylonians and restored the Jewish people to their land, as God's anointed. *Cyrus, a Gentile, is recognized as messiah by Isaiah because Cyrus, by his actions, accomplished the will and desire of God for the chosen people.* God chose and empowered Cyrus for this very purpose even though Cyrus did not know or acknowledge the Lord. *Our God is inclusive beyond anything we could fathom, and we are called to that same inclusiveness in all our dealings.*

Isaiah concludes by saying that all power rests in God who uses it justly and expects those who wield power in the world to use it justly and wisely as well. God, our guide and model, exercises power for the common good of all with inclusivity beyond imagining, most especially toward the poor, the powerless, and the stranger. *All of us, especially those who exercise power in any fashion, are to attune ourselves to acting justly, modeling ourselves on our God.*


Paul in the beginning of his first letter to the Thessalonians, praises the community for their living faith, always acting with love and continually hopeful in Christ Jesus. The gospel, the good news of Christ Jesus, empowers Paul and his companions to live lives of conviction, guided by the Spirit, in modeling the Jesus life style with all they encounter. *For Paul, the ultimate power in life to live like Jesus comes from God through the Spirit. True discipleship for Paul is our attunement to God's*

power at work in our lives.

Matthew's Jesus is caught up in a controversy with some Pharisees and Herodians, strange bedfellows who usually would not pal around together. But in their desire to trap and discredit Jesus, they have teamed up to question him about the legitimacy of paying taxes to Caesar. *Jesus eludes them by affirming that legitimate human power is to be respected, as long as God, the ultimate source of power is acknowledged as well.*

In so doing, Jesus affirms that all power is to be subject to the way God exercises power, namely with justice and compassion.

Whenever human power is attuned to divine power, then both work collaboratively, accomplishing God's plans, wishes and desires for all people.



"Repay to Caesar what belongs to Caesar, and to God what belongs to God."

— Matthew 22:21

This week, make time to reflect on how you exercise power in your life. Is that power aligned to God's desire to make justice and compassion a lived reality? Do we acknowledge God and not ourselves as the ultimate source of power and might? If so, how do we manifest that acknowledgment in the way we live our lives? *Let us pray for the Spirit's wisdom and guidance that we, along with all those who exert power in any way, most especially all our elected leaders, may exercise power justly and with compassion.*



Reflexión Sobre las Lecturas



El Salmo Responsorial 95 establece el tono para el enfoque de las lecturas de este domingo. Reconoce que Dios es el rey y gobierna al pueblo con equidad o justicia. Debido a esto, estamos llamados a aclamar "la gloria y el poder del Señor". Todas las naciones están llamadas a adorar al

Señor, honrar y alabar a Dios por actuar con justicia y compasión hacia toda la creación. *Las otras lecturas dialogan entre ellas y el salmo, desafiándonos a comprender y reconocer a Dios como la máxima fuente de poder en el mundo.*

La primera lectura de Isaías se refiere a Ciro, el poderoso rey de los persas que abrumó a los babilonios y restauró al pueblo judío en su tierra, como el ungido de Dios. *Ciro, un gentil, es reconocido como mesías por Isaías porque Ciro, por sus acciones, cumplió la voluntad y el deseo de Dios por el pueblo elegido.* Dios eligió y dio poder a Ciro para este mismo propósito a pesar de que Ciro no conocía ni reconocía al Señor. *Nuestro Dios es inclusivo más allá de cualquier cosa que podamos comprender, y estamos llamados a esa misma inclusividad en todos nuestros negocios.*

Isaías concluye diciendo que todo el poder estriba en Dios quien lo usa con justicia y espera que aquellos que ejercen el poder en el mundo lo usen con justicia y sabiduría. Dios, nuestra guía y modelo, ejerce el poder para el bien común de todos con una inclusividad más allá de la imaginación, especialmente hacia los pobres, los impotentes y los extranjeros. *Todos nosotros, especialmente aquellos que ejercen el poder de cualquier manera, debemos sintonizarnos con la actuación justa, modelando nuestro propio Dios.*

Pablo, al comienzo de su primera carta a los tesalonicenses, alaba a la comunidad por su fe viva, siempre actuando con amor y continuamente esperanzada en Cristo Jesús. El evangelio, las buenas nuevas de Cristo Jesús, faculta a Pablo y sus compañeros a vivir vidas de convicción, guiados por el Espíritu, modelando el estilo de vida de Jesús con todos los que encuentran. *Para Pablo, el poder supremo en la vida para vivir como Jesús proviene de Dios a través del Espíritu. El verdadero discípulo para Pablo es nuestra sintonía con el poder de Dios trabajando en nuestras vidas.*

El Jesus de San Mateo está atrapado en una controversia con algunos fariseos y herodianos,

extraños asociados que por lo general no se complacen juntos. Pero en su deseo de atrapar y desacreditar a Jesús, se han unido para interrogarlo sobre la legitimidad de pagar impuestos a César. *Jesús los elude afirmando que el poder humano legítimo debe ser respetado, siempre y cuando se reconozca también a Dios, la fuente última de poder.*

Al hacerlo, Jesús afirma que todo poder está sujeto a la forma en que Dios ejerce el poder, es decir, con justicia y compasión.

Siempre que el poder humano esté en sintonía con el poder divino, ambos trabajan en colaboración, cumpliendo los planes y deseos de Dios para todas las personas.

Esta semana, tome tiempo para reflexionar sobre cómo ejercita el poder en su vida. ¿Ese poder está alineado con el deseo de Dios de hacer la justicia y la compasión una realidad viva? ¿Reconocemos a Dios y no a nosotros mismos como la máxima fuente de poder? Si es así, ¿cómo manifestamos ese reconocimiento en la forma en que vivimos nuestras vidas? *Oremos por la sabiduría y la guía del Espíritu para que, junto con todos los que ejercemos el poder de cualquier manera, y especialmente todos nuestros líderes elegidos, podamos ejercer el poder con justicia y con compasión.*

El Mes de Todos los Difuntos

Los orígenes de la solemnidad de Todos los Santos (1º de noviembre) y de la conmemoración de Todos los Fieles Difuntos (2 de noviembre) están relacionados entre sí. El día del aniversario de la muerte de un mártir, el dies natalis, el cual celebra el nacimiento del mártir en la Jerusalén nueva y celestial, se conmemoraba junto a su tumba, con la celebración de la Eucaristía al alba sobre la tumba. Los mártires se convirtieron en objeto de veneración como discípulos e imitadores de Cristo.

Cada año celebramos a todos los santos el 1º de noviembre. Sin embargo, la mayoría de las tradiciones cristianas que honran a los difuntos están asociadas al Día de Todos los Fieles Difuntos, que se celebra el 2 de noviembre. Ese día recordamos a todos nuestros seres queridos que nos han precedido en esta vida en la fe. Estos tributos van más allá de un solo día y duran todo el mes de noviembre, el mes de Todos los Difuntos. Durante esta época del año los días son más oscuros, la cosecha ha tenido lugar, las hojas de los árboles han cambiado color y están cayéndose, el clima se endurece y enfriá, y todo mientras las lecturas litúrgicas dirigen nuestros pensamientos hacia el fin del tiempo, cuando Cristo regresará con toda su gloria para restaurar la plenitud de la salvación para toda la creación. ¡Qué ocasión tan perfecta para recordar a nuestros queridos difuntos!
