

Canonization of Oscar Romero - Oct 14



On Sunday, October 14th Pope Francis is expected to canonize Pope Paul VI and Oscar Romero. Our Salvadoran community will celebrate the canonization of Oscar Romero at the 12:30 Mass on Sunday, October 14th with our Romero choir providing music for the Mass and a reception in the gym following Mass. All are invited to attend.

Oscar Romero, Archbishop of San Salvador, El Salvador, spoke out often against his government and the human rights violations perpetrated by those in power. He persistently defended the rights of the people, calling government leaders to conversion and challenging them to uphold God's law. He reminded the people that they were loved by God and that fighting back with Christian charity was the way to victory. His vocal response to government violence against the poor led to difficulties with other clergy members and his religious superiors, as well as death threats from government accomplices. Despite these challenges, he continued to speak out on behalf of the poor. He was assassinated while celebrating Mass on March 24, 1980.

This Week's Do You Know Video:



As we continue our series on the key principles of the Second Vatican Council, this week's DYK video addresses why Vatican II insisted on dialogue with non-Christian religions. For centuries, the church treated non-Christian religions in the same manner that it treated other Christian denominations, with both suspicion and hatred. We were to have nothing to do with people who did not believe in Christ, other than attempt to convert them from their pagan ways. This was especially true with Judaism, resulting in a horrendous and violent history of persecution and killing of Jews. Vatican II, inspired by Pope John XXIII and reacting to the atrocity of the Holocaust, initiated a significant shift in our relationship to non-Christian religions, most especially with Jews, including also Muslims, Buddhists and Hindus. Hatred and suspicion were replaced by dialogue and respect for the riches of non-Christian religions, and how they could enhance our own Christian beliefs and practices. Interreligious dialogue respects the values of the other and seeks out ways that we can cooperate to build up the reign of God. Missionary work is now no longer primarily for conversion but rather for dialogue and mutual understanding, leading to cooperative action on behalf of the human family and all of creation. Make time to view this week's DYK video and enter into the reasons why Vatican II insisted on dialogue with non-Christian religions.

RESPECT LIFE REFLECTION

Every Life: Cherished, Chosen, Sent

In 1531, when the indigenous peoples of Mexico were subjugated and the practice of human sacrifice was still a recent memory, the Mother of God appeared to St. Juan Diego as a pregnant native woman, now known as Our Lady of Guadalupe.

She sent him with miraculous flowers in his cloak to tell the bishop to build a church where people could receive her Son and her loving, tender care. When St. Juan Diego opened the cloak before the bishop, an image of Our Lady was revealed that remains to this day. The chapel was quickly built, millions embraced Christianity, and the Church increased its protection of the indigenous peoples.

By embracing the mission entrusted to him, St. Juan Diego helped bring Christ's transforming love to cultures gripped by oppression and death.

Today, we again see the dignity of human life disregarded. Unborn children are destroyed through abortion, and ill people are encouraged and assisted to take their own lives. How do we respond?

The essence of our identity is that we are created in God's image and likeness and loved by Him. Nothing can diminish the priceless worth of any human life. Every person is **cherished**.

God creates every person for eternal union with Himself and continually invites us to embrace a loving relationship with Him. Every person is **chosen**.

We are called to be messengers of God's love, treating one another as cherished and chosen by Him. In doing so, we help build a culture that respects all human life. Every person is **sent**.

Like St. Juan Diego, let us embrace our daily mission to help others encounter God's transforming, life-giving love.

El Salvador Scholarship Appeal

On the weekend of October 6-7 we will have our annual appeal for the university students in Cinquera, El Salvador.

Cinquera is a small town of 800 people, who totally rebuilt their town after the civil war ended in 1992. The majority of the families in Cinquera live in poverty, and their only hope for financial stability is to have one child graduate from university and find employment.

Along with our students in Cinquera, we also have students that live in the very rural communities that lie just outside of Cinquera. Often the students that live in these communities do not have running water or indoor bathrooms. Most families in these rural areas make a living from farming.

With the help from St. Sabina, eleven young people are attending university. While on scholarship, the students are required to attend a monthly meeting and do a monthly community service project. In Cinquera there is a forest reserve, and many of the community projects are centered around this reserve, working to keep it clean. Other projects involve the scholarship students teaching the younger children of Cinquera certain skills, such as English, math, or sports.

Most of our students in Cinquera go to university in San Salvador, which is a 3-hour bus ride from Cinquera. Their scholarships help to provide an apartment for the students to live in during the week. All of the students come home each weekend to be with their families and to attend the required meetings and community service projects.

For one student to complete one year of university studies, the cost is approximately \$1300. This cost covers their tuition, apartment, and helps to cover a few incidental costs like internet access and bus fare.

Last January we sent a 6-person delegation to El Salvador to meet our scholarship students and to learn about the difficulties faced by the people there. With generous donations like yours, we hope to continue to help the students there. Their hope is to graduate, take care of their families, find work in their communities, and stay in El Salvador to continue to re-shape their country.

Along with sending money to cover the university costs of our students, we are also trying to raise funds to bring 2 students to St. Sabina every 2 or 3 years. By having the students visit our parish community, all of our parishioners that attend Mass on weekends have a chance to meet and know personally at least one or two of our students. This helps immensely to build our relationship between the students and the parishioners.

Each year Fr. Jeff personally donates his Chiefs season tickets for a raffle as his way to raise funds for our students. Please join him generously in supporting our students in El Salvador by making a donation at our second collection on October 6-7.

Wellness Center



Did you know that the annoying symptoms you experience when you feel the onset of the common cold are part of the natural healing process -- evidence that the immune system is battling illness? For instance, a fever is your body’s way of trying to kill viruses by creating a hotter-than-normal environment. Here are a few tips to get you back on the road to wellness--

- **Treat that stuffy nose with a warm salt water rinse-** Salt-water rinsing helps break nasal congestion.
- **Stay warm and rested-** Staying warm and resting when you first come down with a cold or the flu helps your body direct its energy toward the immune battle.
- **Gargle-** Gargling can moisten a sore throat and bring temporary relief. Gargle with half a teaspoon of salt dissolved in 8 ounces warm water, four times daily.
- **Drink hot liquids-** Hot liquids relieve nasal congestion, prevent dehydration, and soothe the uncomfortably inflamed membranes that line your nose and throat.
- **Eat infection-fighting foods**
 - ◆ Bananas and rice to soothe an upset stomach
 - ◆ Chili peppers may open sinuses, and help break up mucus in the lungs
 - ◆ Onions contain phytochemicals purported to help the body clear bronchitis and other infections

Last, but certainly not least, be light in spirit-- *A cheerful heart is a good medicine, but a downcast spirit dries up the bones. Proverbs 17:22*

Reflection on the Readings

Many themes surface in today's readings - marriage and divorce, the attitude towards children, the willing sacrifice of self for another, the dignity and equality of all human beings, along with other themes. Responsorial Psalm 128 offers a way of dealing with these themes by giving us a lens that helps focus our thoughts.

Psalm 128 offers a picture of several moments in the life of a wise person. The psalm presents rich images concretizing the fruits of those who search for wisdom. The fruits are specified in terms of a happy, contented and fruitful home, with abundant food, and with relationships in their proper order. A fruitful, happy home symbolizes the blessings of God upon the people and the land, ultimately resulting in shalom. **Shalom results in a sense of wholeness that is the reward of anyone who continually searches for wisdom by fearing the Lord and walking in God's ways.**

The sacrament of marriage is often portrayed as the primary sacrament of human community. It is a sign of what all of life is meant to be, a life lived in relationship with others and focused on fearing the Lord and walking in God's ways. **This does not mean that all are intended to be married. Rather it focuses on marriage as the model of what human relating is about.** It highlights the insight and wisdom that God expresses in the first reading: "It is not good for the human being to be alone."

The first reading tells of God creating animals for that very purpose, i.e. to be in relationship with the human. But none proves to be a suitable partner. God finally creates another human being. When the first human being sees the second human being, recognition of difference as well as equality is acknowledged, along with a strong affinity for union. **The longing for unity, while acknowledging differences, is the foundation of any relationship, especially marriage.**

In the second reading from Hebrews, the author shows how Jesus modeled for us the essential component of any relationship - the willingness to give of oneself totally for the other. Jesus' attitude enables us to come into filial relationship with God in and through Jesus' association with us as brother. **The willingness to**

give of self for the sake of the other strengthens the bonds of any relationship. This modeling becomes the source of strength and peace for those finding relationships difficult. Jesus enables us to be linked in familial relationship with all those who are attempting to live a life in fear of the Lord, walking in God's ways. Such is the true source and strength of any community.

In the gospel reading, Mark has Jesus focus on the demands of relationship, most especially marriage. To fear the Lord and to walk in God's ways is to cultivate unity amidst differences. God intends such unity for all humanity in the Genesis reading, while the Hebrews reading has Jesus model how such unity is to be achieved. Working towards such unity presents many obstacles. **Our call is to cultivate an attitude of working through obstacles, even to the point of being willing to sacrifice self for the other.**

We commit ourselves to work toward creating community to ensure that human relationship is fostered and human dignity is respected. This is difficult work. Relationships can fall apart. Mark has Jesus continue to model what such work entails by taking a little child whose dignity, equality and worth was questioned by the culture. In so doing, **Jesus makes the childlike attitude of trust and dependence the hallmark of what fearing the Lord and walking in God's ways entails.** If we do this, then no matter what happens, peace will come upon us and upon the entire human family.

Let us recommit ourselves to fostering human relationships by fearing the Lord and walking in God's ways. This week, let this mindset dominate all your relationships.

Reflexión Sobre las Lecturas

Muchos temas surgen en las lecturas de hoy: el matrimonio y el divorcio, la actitud hacia los niños, el sacrificio voluntario de uno mismo por otro, la dignidad y la igualdad de todos los seres humanos, junto con otros temas. El salmo responsorial 127 ofrece una forma de tratar estos temas al darnos una lente que ayuda a enfocar nuestros pensamientos.

El Salmo 127 ofrece una imagen de varios momentos en la vida de una persona sabia. El salmo presenta ricas imágenes que concretan los frutos de quienes buscan la sabiduría. Los frutos se especifican en términos de un hogar feliz, contento y fructífero, con abundante comida y con las relaciones en el orden correcto. Un hogar fructífero y feliz simboliza las bendiciones de Dios sobre la gente y la tierra, que finalmente resultan en "Shalom", "Shalom" resulta en un sentido de integridad que es la recompensa de cualquier persona que continuamente busca sabiduría temiendo al Señor y caminando en los caminos de Dios.

Muchas veces el sacramento del matrimonio se retrata como el sacramento principal de la comunidad humana. Es un signo de lo que toda la vida debe ser, una vida que se vive en relación con los demás y que se centra en temer al Señor y caminar en los caminos de Dios. **Esto no significa que todos estén destinados a casarse. Más bien, se centra en el matrimonio como el modelo de lo que se trata la relación humana.** Resalta la percepción y sabiduría que Dios expresa en la primera lectura: "No es bueno que el ser humano esté solo".

La primera lectura dice que Dios creó animales para ese propósito, es decir, estar en relación con el humano. Pero ninguno demuestra ser un compañero adecuado. Dios finalmente crea otro ser humano. Cuando el primer ser humano ve al segundo ser humano, se reconoce la diferencia y la igualdad, junto con una fuerte afinidad por la unión. **El anhelo por la unidad, aunque reconoce las diferencias, es la base de cualquier relación, especialmente el matrimonio.**

En la segunda lectura de Hebreos, el autor muestra cómo Jesús modeló para nosotros el componente esencial de cualquier relación: la disposición a entregarse totalmente por el otro. La actitud de Jesús nos permite entrar en una relación filial con Dios en y a través de la asociación de Jesús con nosotros como hermano. **La disposición de dar de sí mismo por el bien del otro fortalece los vínculos de cualquier relación. Este modelo se convierte en la fuente de fortaleza y paz para quienes encuentran difíciles las relaciones.** Jesús nos permite estar vinculados en una relación familiar con todos aquellos que intentan vivir una vida con temor al Señor, caminando en los caminos de Dios. Tal es la verdadera fuente y fuerza de cualquier comunidad.

Trabajar hacia tal unidad presenta muchos obstáculos. Nuestro llamado es cultivar una actitud de superar los obstáculos, incluso hasta el punto de estar dispuestos a sacrificarlos por el otro.

Nos comprometemos a trabajar para crear una comunidad para garantizar que se fomente la relación humana y se respete la dignidad humana. Este es un trabajo difícil. Las relaciones pueden desmoronarse. Marcos tiene a Jesús modelando continuamente lo que implica tal trabajo al llevar a un niño cuya dignidad, igualdad y valor fueron cuestionados por la cultura. **Al hacerlo, Jesús hace que la actitud infantil de confianza y dependencia sea el sello distinto de lo que implica temer al Señor y caminar en los caminos de Dios.** Si hacemos esto, pase lo que pase, la paz vendrá sobre nosotros y sobre toda la familia humana.

Volvamos a comprometernos a fomentar las relaciones humanas temiendo al Señor y caminando en los caminos de Dios. Esta semana, deje que esta mentalidad domine todas sus relaciones.

A pesar de estos desafíos, continuó hablando en nombre de los pobres. Fue asesinado mientras celebraba la Misa el 24 de marzo de 1980.
