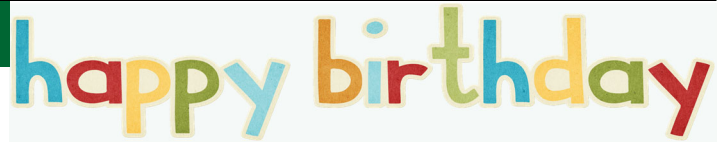

This Week's Do You Know Video:

Protestant and Catholic bibles are essentially the same with the exception of seven Old Testament books that Catholics accept as inspired and Protestants do not. However, the way each is exposed to the bible differs, each having its own plusses and minuses. While most Protestants are exposed to scripture readings using bibles during Sunday services, Catholics do not. Catholics are exposed to scripture through lectionaries, books containing select passages from Scripture, chosen to link with particular themes, feasts or seasons. While different, neither approach is better than the other. However, the different exposures do have unique advantages that both sides can benefit from. Make time to view this week's DYK video and see how all Christians can benefit from our different approaches to Scripture.

En Nuestro Video ¿Sabes...? de Esta Semana:

Las biblias protestantes y católicas son esencialmente iguales con la excepción de siete libros del Antiguo Testamento que los católicos aceptan como inspirados y los protestantes no. Sin embargo, la forma en que cada uno se expone a la Biblia difiere, cada uno tiene sus propias ventajas y desventajas. Mientras que la mayoría de los protestantes están expuestos a las lecturas de las Escrituras usando biblias durante los servicios dominicales, los católicos no lo hacen. Los católicos están expuestos a las Escrituras a través del leccionario, libros que contienen pasajes selectos de las Escrituras, elegidos para vincularlos con temas, festivos o temporadas particulares. Si bien es diferente, ningún enfoque es mejor que el otro. Sin embargo, las diferentes exposiciones tienen ventajas únicas de las que ambas partes pueden beneficiarse. Trust is a difficult thing for most people. It is often difficult to know who to trust. We cannot be sure that what is being said is what is actually intended. We do not know if there are hidden or other agendas involved in our interactions with others. Trust becomes a trying task for all of us. **Sunday's readings tackle this difficulty with wisdom and insight.** The refrain from responsorial Psalm 1 proclaims "Blessed are they who hope (trust) in the Lord." The refrain captures the thematic essence of all three readings.

Psalm 1 acts as the prologue to the book of Psalms, setting the tone for the entire book. This wisdom psalm offers instruction on what "blessedness" or "happiness" in this life entails. One who "delights in the law of the Lord and meditates on his law day and night" will truly find happiness and blessings. Such a person is compared to "a tree planted near running water" yielding fruit when appropriate and always full of life. The wicked are not so blessed because they have no grounding in God; they pay no attention to God's ways and thus "vanish" like chaff in the wind. **The entire book of Psalms is meant to instruct us in the ways of the Lord, while helping us avoid the paths of the wicked.**

In our first reading, Jeremiah also instructs us how to strive for blessings in this life while learning to avoid those paths that lead to destruction. Trust in the Lord's wisdom and counsel is the key. One who trusts in the Lord is like a tree planted besides water, having roots connected to the stream. No matter what happens, such persons have no fear because they are connected to the source of life. They continually bear fruit and are always life-giving. **Those who trust only in themselves while turning away from the Lord are lifeless, barren, and hopeless.**

The second reading from Paul's first letter to the Corinthians chides those who deny the resurrection from the dead by stressing that Christ's resurrection is our only true source of hope for eternal life. Our hope in Christ is not for this life only but for eternal life forever with God. Christ's resurrection assures us richness of life now and for all eternity. Death need not be feared. The Lord of life has overcome it. **Our trust is in Christ, the first fruit of all life, our true Lord of Life.**

Luke presents us with his version of the Sermon on the Mount. Four blessings and four woes characterize his beatitudes. Ultimately Luke's Jesus helps us focus on what is important in life. Whether rich or poor, trust in the Lord is essential if we are to become what God created us to be. **God's kingdom which Jesus preaches reverses much of the wisdom of the world.** The poor, the hungry, the sorrowing and the persecuted are called blessed while those who are rich, well fed, comfortable and well cared for are given dire warnings. **What wisdom of the world do we need to question and reverse, especially when it come to our typical treatment of the poor, the stranger, the immigrant, and those fleeing violence and war who desire a home to care for their families?**

The poor have no one to rely on so potentially they are more open to trusting in the Lord for their care and sustenance. The rich have a greater difficulty trusting in the Lord simply because they tend to rely on themselves and their wealth. **But, whether rich or poor, trust in the Lord and attentiveness to God's justice ways are the only things that lead to true life.**

Today's readings address our trust issues. How do you get beyond your trust issues, and place your cares and concern in the Lord's hands? How do you cultivate a lifestyle which continually attunes itself to God's ways by showing care and concern for all in need?

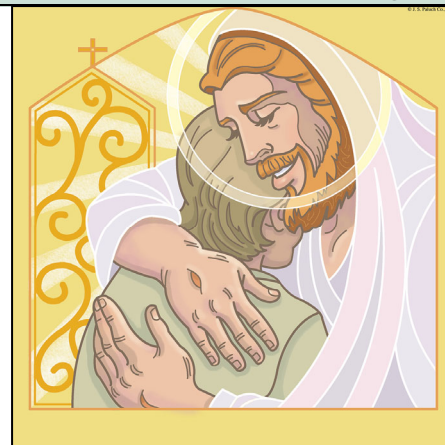
1st Reading: 1 Samuel 26:2, 7-9, 12-13, 22-23

La confianza es algo difícil para la mayoría de las personas. Muchas veces es difícil saber en quién confiar. No podemos estar seguros de que lo que se dice es lo que realmente se pretende. No sabemos si hay agendas ocultas implicadas en nuestras interacciones con los demás. La confianza se convierte en una tarea difícil para todos nosotros. **Las lecturas del domingo abordan esta dificultad con sabiduría y perspicacia.** El estribillo del Salmo responsorial 1 proclama "Dichoso el hombre que ha puesto su confianza en el Señor". El estribillo capta la esencia temática de las tres lecturas.



El Salmo 1 actúa como el prólogo del libro de los Salmos, estableciendo el tono de todo el libro. Este salmo de sabiduría ofrece instrucciones sobre lo que significa la "bienaventuranza" o "felicidad" en esta vida. Quien "su gozo es la ley del Señor, y medita su ley día y noche" realmente encontrará la felicidad y las bendiciones. Dicha persona se compara con "un árbol plantado al borde de la acequia", lo cual produce frutos cuando es apropiado y siempre está lleno de vida. Los malvados no son tan bendecidos porque no tienen base en Dios, no prestan atención a los caminos de Dios y, por lo tanto, se arrebatan como la paja en el viento. **El libro entero de los Salmos está destinado a instruirnos en los caminos del Señor, mientras nos ayuda a evitar los caminos de los malvados.**

En nuestra primera lectura, Jeremías también nos enseña cómo luchar por las bendiciones en esta vida mientras aprendemos a evitar esos caminos que llevan a la destrucción. Confiar en la sabiduría y el consejo del Señor es la clave. Quien confía en el Señor es como un árbol plantado al borde de la acequia, que tiene raíces conectadas a la corriente. Pase lo que pase, estas personas no tienen miedo porque están conectadas a la fuente de la vida. Continuamente dan fruto y siempre dan vida. **Aquellos que confían solo en sí mismos mientras se alejan del Señor están sin vida, infértiles y sin esperanza.**

La segunda lectura de la primera carta de Pablo a los Corintios reprende a los que niegan la resurrección de los muertos al enfatizar que la resurrección de Cristo es nuestra única fuente verdadera de esperanza para la vida eterna. Nuestra esperanza en Cristo no es solo para esta vida, sino para la vida eterna, siempre con Dios. La resurrección de Cristo nos asegura la riqueza de la vida ahora y por toda la eternidad. No hay que temer la muerte. El Señor de la vida la ha vencido. **Nuestra confianza está en Cristo, el primer fruto de toda la vida, nuestro verdadero Señor de la Vida.**

Lucas nos presenta su versión del Sermón del Monte. Cuatro bendiciones y cuatro males caracterizan sus bienaventuranzas. En última instancia, el Jesús de Lucas nos ayuda a concentrarnos en lo que es importante en la vida. Ya sea rico o pobre, la confianza en el Señor es esencial si queremos convertirnos en lo que Dios nos creó para ser. **El reino de Dios que Jesús predica invierte gran parte de la sabiduría del mundo.** Los pobres, los hambrientos, los tristes y los perseguidos son llamados bienaventurados, mientras que aquellos que son ricos, bien alimentados, cómodos y bien cuidados reciben advertencias terribles. **¿Qué sabiduría del mundo necesitamos cuestionar y revertir, especialmente cuando se trata de nuestro tratamiento típico de los pobres, los extranjeros, los inmigrantes y quienes huyen la violencia y la guerra, quienes desean un hogar para cuidar de sus familias?**

Los pobres no tienen a nadie en quien confiar, así que potencialmente están más abiertos a confiar en el Señor para su cuidado y sustento. Los ricos tienen mayor dificultad al confiar en el Señor simplemente porque tienden a depender de sí mismos y de su riqueza. **Pero, sean ricos o pobres, la confianza en el Señor y la atención a los caminos de la justicia de Dios son las únicas cosas que llevan a la vida verdadera.**

“And raising his eyes toward his disciples he said: ‘Blessed are you who are poor, for the kingdom of God is yours. Blessed are you who are now hungry, for you will be satisfied. Blessed are you who are now weeping, for you will laugh.’”

Luke 6:20-21

In today's Gospel from Luke, Jesus describes the true richness of life that is possible for those of us who are willing to live as his hope-filled disciples. We are all familiar with this passage in which Jesus reveals the Beatitudes: blessed are the poor; they have the kingdom of God. Blessed are those now hungry because they will be satisfied. Blessed are those who weep because they will laugh. Blessed are those who are hated, excluded, and insulted because they are disciples of Jesus; they will be greatly rewarded in heaven. Jesus is describing here the character of one who is living a life of hope – the life of a Christian steward whose trust is firmly rooted in God and who is focused on others and eternity. It is not always an easy life, but it is a deeply meaningful life and one that leads to eternal reward.

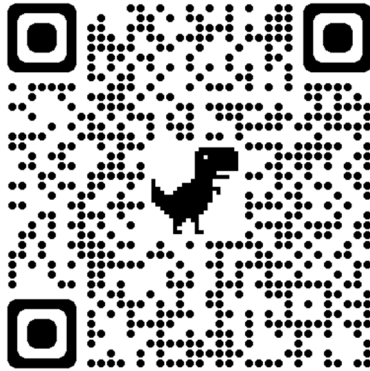

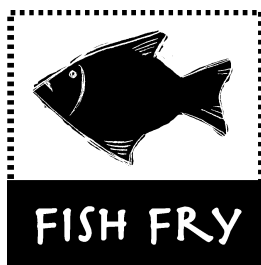

Catholic Charities Emergency Assistance Fund

Catholic Charities Emergency Assistance Fund (CCEAF) is a local fund. The money is raised primarily as a second collection every February, and all this money stays in Catholic Charities' 27-county service area. This money supplements the Welcome Center and funds a variety of services for the most vulnerable in our community. No one that seeks help at the Welcome Center is turned away. The Welcome Center is the entry point to Catholic Charities for families coming for help. The Welcome Center provides immediate, critical care to families in crisis. It can provide emergency food and hygiene products for one day, while connecting the family to the food pantry which provides food for the month. The Welcome Center can provide rent and utility assistance that helps prevent homelessness in our community. Many families need just a little help and can stay housed. It is incredibly hard to get housing once an eviction is on your record. Assistance with diapers, formula and baby supplies are also available, as well as the connection to the Child and Family Services Department, which can provide ongoing support and resources to families in need. **This collection will take place February 19-20.**

Pope Francis Calls for a Gathering (Synod) of the Whole Church to Discuss the Issue of Synodality, on Walking Together as God's Family.

Synodality means walking together as the pilgrim people of God, reflecting, listening, sharing, and discerning together where the Spirit is leading. In this process of walking and discerning together, Pope Francis stresses the need to listen to the voices of all, especially the "marginalized." The marginalized include women, refugees, migrants, the poor, the elderly, the disabled, the LGBTQ community, the oppressed and rejected, those who have left the church and even those who have no church. In this synodal process, we are called to ensure the full and active participation of the marginalized. Since they are an integral component of the people of God, it is important to hear their voices, their sense of the faith, regarding what the Spirit is saying to them in their life experience. The St. Sabina Parish Community is in the process of putting together a survey that will be made available to all who desire to engage in the synodal process. When the survey becomes available, do participate, encourage others to participate, and do share it with any and all marginalized individuals or communities. This will ensure that some of the main goals of the synodal process, building bridges and healing wounds, are being concretely addressed. Stay tuned for future bulletin information on this important synodal process.
