

This Week's Do You Know Video:

As we begin a new series on what it means to be Catholic, this week's DYK video focuses on the meaning and significance of the word "catholic" with a small "c". Modeling themselves on Jesus' values and life style, his early followers continued his mission of breaking down boundaries and welcoming all to the table so that all could experience and connect with God's love and mercy. Early Christianity defined itself with the Greek word "katholikos" meaning universal, open, inclusive and welcoming of all without any distinction or boundaries. The essence of being a Christian was to be catholic. Only with the Reformation of 1517 did we begin using "catholic" with a capital "C" to distinguish and separate ourselves from other Christian catholic churches. Did You Know— Health and wellness coaches help people make positive and lasting changes to their health. The health coach guides people through the process of creating a vision for their health and well-being, developing a healthy mindset and healthy habits, and encouraging them every step of the way until the goal is accomplished.

When people come to their first coaching appointment, they come in expecting to be told what to do. What actually happens is the health coach encourages the person to slow down, think about their goals, and then determine the path themselves. No one knows you better than you. Health coaches offer unconditional positive regard for the people they coach. Health coaches honor that each person is the expert on his or her own life.

Here are a few questions to get you thinking:

- Do you have trouble sticking to health-related goals?
- Do you struggle to keep a calm and positive mindset?
- Are you always low on energy and motivation?
- Do you find it difficult to prioritize your health?

Health coaches can help you develop step by step plans to:

- Reduce stress
- Prioritize self-care
- Maintain a positive and healthy mindset

“When they had fulfilled all the prescriptions of the law of the Lord, they returned to Galilee, to their own town of Nazareth. The child grew and became strong, filled with wisdom; and the favor of God was upon him.

Luke 2: 39-40

Our Gospel passage from Luke, recounting the details of the Presentation, teaches us a stewardship lesson through the example of St. Joseph and the Blessed Mother, the “Holy Parents.” Even knowing their Son was God, they still carefully observed the faith practices of their day bringing him to the temple “to present Him to the Lord, just as it is written in the law of the Lord.” Later in the passage we read that, “When they had fulfilled all the prescriptions of the law of the Lord, they returned to their own town of Nazareth.” The Holy Parents were good stewards of their child, teaching Him to live in obedience to the practices of their faith from His infancy and throughout His “growing up” years. Those of us entrusted with the care of children — whether our own children, godchildren, nieces and nephews, grandchildren, or students — have a vital role to play in the faith formation of these young ones. We, like the Holy Parents, must steward these children well, forming them in the faith by both instruction and example throughout their lives. What a privilege and high calling we have as Christian stewards. Plan Your Legacy and Receive Income Charitable Gift Annuity

The diocese sponsors a charitable gift annuity program for donors 65 or older willing to make a gift of at least \$5,000 that will eventually pass to a parish, ministry or the diocese. In return for a gift that will pass after death, a charitable gift annuity generates fixed payments for life to you (and/or someone you designate). The annuity will replace and may increase the cash flow from the assets used to fund it.

How does it work?

The annuity is a simple contract between you and the Diocese of Kansas City-St. Joseph. Annuity payments are a general obligation of the diocese. You may fund your annuity with cash or appreciated property. All property accepted to fund a gift annuity is invested by the diocese to support annuity payments. The amount you receive as income is determined by the amount you contribute and your age; the older you are, the higher your payment rate. Gift annuity rates are those set by the Board of the American Council of Gift Annuities. Payments are generally made quarterly.

Tax Treatment

- If you are one of the annuitants and you fund the annuity with appreciated securities, there is no upfront capital gains tax.
- Your initial contribution is eligible for a charitable tax deduction, if your tax situation allows.
- A portion of each payment is a tax-free return of your principal. If funded with appreciated securities, the taxable portion is taxed at the capital gain rates.



Child Safety

The Diocese of Kansas City-St. Joseph is committed to combatting sexual abuse in the Church. If you are a victim of sexual abuse, or if you *observe or suspect* sexual abuse:

1. **Call the Missouri Child Abuse Hotline at 1.800.392.3738 (if the victim is currently under the age of 18), and**
2. **Contact your local law enforcement agency or call 911, and**
3. **After reporting to these civil and law enforcement authorities, report suspected *sexual abuse of a minor or vulnerable adult* to the Diocesan Ombudsman, Joe Crayon, at 816.812.2500 or crayon@ombudsmankcsj.org, if the abuse involves a priest, deacon, employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Kansas City-St. Joseph.**

Reflection on the Readings

It does not happen very often, but whenever February 2 occurs on a Sunday, the solemnity of the Presentation of the Lord replaces the Sunday readings, in this case taking priority over the Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time. February 2, exactly forty days after Christmas, is also known as Candlemas day, in which candles used during the liturgical year both in church and at home are traditionally blessed. **This blessing of candles is clearly associated with the gospel reading which refers to Jesus as the “light of revelation to the Gentiles and a glory for your people Israel.”**

In 1570, our pre-Vatican II missal from the Council of Trent named this feast “the Purification of Mary.” **The focus was on Mary’s need, along with all Jewish mothers, to be purified by the temple priests forty days after giving birth to a male child, (eighty days for a female child).** This feast also led to the Catholic custom known as “the churching of women.” **A mother, after giving birth, had to wait forty days to be integrated once again into church services, sacramental celebrations, and community by undergoing a special purification ritual done by the priest.** In 1970, the Vatican II missal restored this feast to its proper focus on Jesus, and his presentation in the temple. The need to “present” your first born male child to God in the temple was associated with the Exodus tenth plague in which the angel of death spared every first born Israelite child. Since then, it was accepted that every first born belonged to God and had to be redeemed from God by parents through the offering of a sacrifice to God. **This is the biblical backdrop to the feast of the Presentation of the Lord, along with its association with Candlemas day.**

The lectionary readings for the feast focus more on the coming of the Lord as a light to the nations. The gospel account, unique to Luke, has Mary and Joseph, models of faithful Jews, present their child in the temple according to Jewish religious custom and belief. Simeon and Anna, both religious and righteous Jews, had waited patiently and prayerfully for the fulfillment of God’s promises made long ago to send God’s anointed (messiah) as a light to the nations. **Recognizing God’s intimate presence among the people in this little child was the gift of faith and trust that both Simeon and Anna were given.** In their faithful stance of patient waiting and prayer, they came to recognize the Lord in this little child. **In so doing, both loudly proclaim God’s gift to all, while Simeon highlights the reality that God’s salvation has come, not only for all God’s people, but for all nations as well.**

Psalm 24 invites us to the same gift of faith and acknowledgment when we are invited to joyfully sing the refrain, “Who is this king of glory? It is the Lord!” **The king of glory has come to his temple and now great intimacy, peace and tranquility will be the effect of his presence among us.** The first reading from the prophet Malachi inserts the sobering thought that the “day of the Lord’s” coming will also be one of judgment for the wicked and purification for the righteous. **God comes to aid us in our relationship and to ready us for intimate and lifelong companionship.**

The second reading from the letter to the Hebrews asserts that in Christ, God has freely chosen to be one of us. As fully one of us, Christ was tested and suffered as we do, so that he could sympathize with our human condition and thus “be able to help those who are being tested.” **Jesus, God’s compassion and greatest gift, is God’s final and complete revelation for all humanity, “a light of revelation” to all nations.**

This week, strive to recognize God’s presence in your life, in your encounters with others, in your daily ups and downs, and in all you do. Give thanks to God for choosing to dwell among us and for gifting us always with Jesus, God’s intimate presence, compassion, life and love.



Reflexión Sobre las Lecturas

No sucede con mucha frecuencia, pero cada vez que el 2 de febrero ocurre un domingo, la solemnidad de la Presentación del Señor reemplaza las lecturas del domingo, en este caso, tiene prioridad sobre el Cuarto Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario. El 2 de febrero, exactamente cuarenta días después de Navidad, también se conoce como el Día de la Candelaria, en el cual las velas usadas durante el año litúrgico tanto en la iglesia como en el hogar son tradicionalmente bendecidas. **Esta bendición de velas está claramente asociada con la lectura del evangelio que se refiere a Jesús como la "luz que alumbr a las naciones y gloria de tu pueblo, Israel".**

En 1570, nuestro misal anterior al Concilio Vaticano II del Concilio de Trento llamó a esta fiesta "la Purificación de María". **El enfoque estaba en la necesidad de María, junto con todas las madres judías, de ser purificada por los sacerdotes del templo cuarenta días después de dar a luz a un niño varón (ochenta días para una niña).** Esta fiesta también llevó a la costumbre católica conocida como "la bendición de la mujer después del parto". **Una madre, después de dar a luz, tuvo que esperar cuarenta días para integrarse una vez más en los servicios de la iglesia, celebraciones sacramentales y la comunidad al someterse a un ritual de purificación especial por el sacerdote en 1970, el misal del Vaticano II restauró esta fiesta a su enfoque apropiado en Jesús, y su presentación en el templo.** La necesidad de "presentar" a su hijo varón primogénito a Dios en el templo se asoció con la décima plaga del Éxodo en la cual el ángel de la muerte salvó a cada hijo primogénito israelita. Desde entonces, se aceptó que todos los primogénitos pertenecían a Dios y que los padres debían redimirlos de Dios mediante la ofrenda de un sacrificio a Dios. **Este es el telón de fondo bíblico para la fiesta de la Presentación del Señor, junto con su asociación con el día de la Candelaria.**

Las lecturas para la fiesta se centran más en la llegada del Señor como una luz para las naciones. **El relato del evangelio, exclusivo de Lucas, muestra a María y José, ejemplos de judíos fieles, que presentan a su hijo en el templo de acuerdo con las costumbres y creencias religiosas judías.** Simeón y Ana, judíos tanto religiosos como justos, habían esperado pacientemente y en oración el cumplimiento de las promesas de Dios hechas hace mucho tiempo para enviar al ungido (mesías) de Dios como una luz para las naciones. **Reconocer la presencia íntima de Dios entre las personas en este pequeño niño fue el regalo de la fe y la confianza que se les dio a**

Simeón y a Ana. En su fiel postura de espera y oración paciente, llegaron a reconocer al Señor en este niño pequeño. **Al hacerlo, ambos proclaman en voz alta el regalo de Dios para todos, mientras que Simeón destaca la realidad de que la salvación de Dios ha llegado no solo para todo el pueblo de Dios sino también para todas las naciones.**

El Salmo 24 nos invita al mismo don de fe y reconocimiento cuando se nos invita a cantar alegremente el estribillo: "El Señor Dios de los ejércitos; él es el rey de la gloria". **El rey de la gloria ha venido a su templo y ahora una gran intimidad, paz y tranquilidad será el efecto de su presencia entre nosotros.** La primera lectura del profeta Malaquías inserta el pensamiento aleccionador de que "el día de su venida" del Señor también será uno de juicio para los impíos y purificación para los justos. **Dios viene a ayudarnos en nuestra relación y a prepararnos para una compañía íntima y de por vida.**

La segunda lectura de la carta a los Hebreos afirma que en Cristo, Dios ha elegido libremente ser uno de nosotros. Como completamente uno de nosotros, Cristo fue probado y sufrió como nosotros sufrimos, para que pueda simpatizar con nuestra condición humana y así "ayudar a los que están sometidos a la prueba". **Jesús, la compasión y mayor regalo de Dios, es la revelación final y completa de Dios para toda la humanidad, una "luz que alumbr a las naciones".**

Esta semana, esfuércese por reconocer la presencia de Dios en su vida, en sus encuentros con los demás, en sus altibajos diarios y en todo lo que haga. Dé gracias a Dios por elegir morar entre nosotros y por regalarnos siempre a Jesús, la presencia íntima, la compasión, la vida y el amor de Dios.
