Guidelines for Fast and Abstinence During Lent

Abstinence: Abstinence is a penitential practice consisting of refraining from the consumption of meat and is to be observed by all Catholics who are 14 years of age and older. **Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, and the Fridays during Lent are days of abstinence.**

Fast and Abstinence: In addition to abstinence, fasting is to be observed by all Catholics between the ages of 18-59 years (inclusive). On days of fasting, one full meal is allowed. Two smaller meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids are allowed. Note: If a person is unable to observe the above regulations due to ill health or other serious reasons, they are urged to practice other forms of self-denial that are suitable to their condition. **Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of Fasting.**

CRS Rice Bowls



Diaper Drive—Feb 24-Mar 4

Did you know that 1 in 3 Americans struggle to provide diapers for their babies? Join the St. Sabina Love Thy Neighbor Team in collaborating with the Baby Grace Program to help families in our community that are a part of this statistic.

Baby Grace was started almost 11 years ago to offer teen moms help and support by Juli Youcum, Anne Farmer, and a group of volunteers. It has blossomed into much more than Juli and Anne ever thought it would. There are currently 18 chapters that serve different areas of Missouri. All chapters are ran differently, under the umbrella that a mom will not be judged by anyone volunteering in that chapter. The Baby Grace mission is to share God's love and grace by offering material, emotional, and spiritual support and development for families with young children.

Our Baby Grace chapter is located in the Raymore Christian Church. Right now they are only able to help families with 12 diapers per baby, per month and one package of 100 wipes per family. That's maybe two days' worth. We hope that by hosting this diaper drive we will help them to be able to give more and work towards eliminating the diaper need in our community.

Mark 1: 29-31

St. Mark writes, “He (Jesus) approached, grasped her hand, and helped her up. Then the fever left her and she waited on them.” St. Matthew reveals this same fact in his Gospel (Matthew 8:15), and he writes, “He (Jesus) touched her hand and the fever left her, and she got up and began to serve him.” The message for us is very basic. Peter's mother-in-law responded to Jesus the same way we should when Jesus blesses us. She responded to the Lord and immediately served Him out of gratitude. New Tax Benefit for Catholic School Parents

Catholic school parents may benefit from the recent changes to the federal tax code. The recently passed federal tax law allows parents to make contributions to a child's Missouri 529 MOST account for K-12 tuition, in addition to expenses for higher education that are already permitted. The Missouri 529 MOST account is an investment program sponsored by the Missouri State Treasurer's office. **Anyone can open a MOST account, including parents, grandparents, or friends of K-12 or college-aged students.** In this way, if parents lack financial resources, others can contribute to the family's MOST account. Interest earnings on contributions made by parents to MOST accounts are not subject to state or federal taxes. Furthermore, qualified distributions from the account (those for higher education expenses, and now K-12 tuition) are also not taxed. Parents can withdraw up to \$10,000 annually for private K-12 tuition per student as an eligible distribution from a MOST account. Parents can elect to make contributions to the MOST account according to their own timetable, such as monthly. Parents may want to consult with their local bank or financial advisor regarding the advisability of setting up a 529 MOST account. 3. **After reporting to these civil and law enforcement authorities, report suspected sexual abuse of a minor or vulnerable adult to the Diocesan Ombudsman, Jenifer Valenti, at 816.812.2500 or JeniferValenti@att.net, if the abuse involves a priest, deacon, employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Kansas City-St. Joseph.**

Reflection on the Readings

We have all experienced times when life's circumstances and events create an overwhelming feeling of hopelessness, despair and sorrow. Everything seems like it is falling apart around us. Life seems so burdensome and hope seems completely distant and out of reach. What would restore hope?


Hope and comfort are usually restored through people who reach out in care and compassion to us, enabling us to see correctly once again. Such people restore our confidence by showing that life is hopeful and that pain and suffering do not control or defeat us. This is exactly the message of today's readings.

The first reading from Job sounds rather depressing and negative. Job is experiencing the pain and despair of life that at times overwhelms all of us. In the passage that we hear proclaimed, it seems as if Job sees no hope or remedy to his situation. He is so afflicted by his suffering that he cannot focus on anything else. It dominates all that he does, thinks or says. *Yet we know that ultimately Job acknowledges that God, the master and lord of all creation, is the source of restoring hope and trust in life. Through his suffering, he learns to place his trust in the Lord, his redeemer and his savior.*

The refrain of responsorial Psalm 147, "Praise the Lord who heals the brokenhearted," affirms Job's ultimate understanding of God and sets the tone for our Sunday communal celebration. While acknowledging that broken hearts, wounds and suffering are a real part of life, Psalm 147 affirms without any hesitation that our God heals, rebuilds, binds up, and sustains the brokenhearted, the suffering, the wounded and the lowly.

Both Paul, in the passage from his first letter to the Corinthians, and Jesus, in the

gospel according to Mark, are about the ministry of preaching the gospel, the good news of God's care, love, compassion and concern for all of creation. They both work tirelessly to establish what the gospel refers to as the reign or kingdom of God. *Both preach the message at great cost to their personal lives. Why? Because through prayer, both have attuned themselves to God's perspective and now feel called by God to proclaim this wonderful good news to all.*



For Mark, Jesus is the vehicle and minister of God's healing and compassion. Mark symbolically uses demons to represent the pain, evil and suffering of life. Jesus, the living compassion of God among us, acts to alleviate the suffering of life by continually attacking and driving out the demons that often overwhelm us. *For Mark, this is a clear indication that the kingdom of God has arrived,*

offering hope and compassion in the midst of human suffering, despair and hopelessness. Jesus reaches out with healing, care, and concern for all that overwhelms and oppresses us.

Our baptismal call as disciples engages all of us in the ministry of care and compassion toward all, especially the powerless, the oppressed and those in pain or despair. To do such ministry well and effectively, an active prayer life is essential. During his life and ministry, Jesus continually attuned himself to God through prayer, drawing sustenance and strength from God's power and presence, enabling him to confront and eventually overcome the evil experiences of life.

Ultimately, the good news that Jesus preaches and that we are all called to preach and minister to through our baptism is that, in the midst of life's difficulties, pains, sorrows and disappointments, God cares, God intervenes, God heals and God restores our hope.

How do you maintain hope in the midst of life's difficulties? How is your baptismal commitment a call to preach and minister Jesus' good news of God's compassion and care? *This week, reach out to someone who needs to hear the good news that God cares, heals, and restores hope and life.*

Reflexión Sobre las Lecturas

Todos hemos experimentado momentos en que las circunstancias y los acontecimientos de la vida crean una sensación abrumadora de desesperanza, desesperación y dolor. Todo parece que se está derrumbando a nuestro alrededor. La vida parece tan pesada y la esperanza parece completamente distante y fuera de alcance. ¿Qué restauraría la esperanza?


La esperanza y la comodidad generalmente se restauran a través de personas que nos contactan con cuidado y compasión, permitiéndonos ver correctamente una vez más. Tales personas restauran nuestra confianza al mostrar que la vida es esperanzada y que el dolor y el sufrimiento no nos controlan ni nos derrotan. Este es exactamente el mensaje de las lecturas de hoy.

La primera lectura de Job suena bastante deprimente y negativa. Job está experimentando el dolor y la desesperación de la vida que a veces nos abruma a todos. En el pasaje que escuchamos, parece que Job no ve esperanza ni remedio a su situación. Está tan afligido por su sufrimiento que no puede concentrarse en nada más. Domina todo lo que hace, piensa y dice. *Sin embargo, sabemos que, en última instancia, Job reconoce que Dios, el amo y señor de toda la creación, es la fuente de la restauración de la esperanza y la confianza en la vida. A través de su sufrimiento, aprende a confiar en el Señor, en su redentor y en su salvador.*

El estribillo del Salmo responsorial 146, "El justo brilla en las tinieblas como una luz", afirma el entendimiento último de Job sobre Dios y establece el tono para nuestra celebración comunal dominical. Al reconocer que los corazones destrozados, las heridas y el sufrimiento son una parte real de la vida, el Salmo 146 afirma sin vacilación que nuestro Dios sana, reconstruye, une y sostiene a los destrozados del corazón, los que

sufren, los heridos y los humildes.

Tanto Pablo, en el pasaje de su primera carta a los Corintios, como Jesús, en el evangelio según Marcos, tratan sobre el ministerio de la predicación del Evangelio, las buenas nuevas del cuidado, amor, compasión y preocupación de Dios por toda la creación. Ambos trabajan incansablemente para establecer a lo que el evangelio se refiere como el reino de Dios. *Ambos predicán el mensaje a un gran costo para sus vidas personales. ¿Por qué? Porque a través de la oración, ambos se han sintonizado con la perspectiva de Dios y ahora se sienten llamados por Dios para proclamar estas maravillosas buenas nuevas a todos.*



Para Marcos, Jesús es el vehículo y el ministro de la curación y compasión de Dios. Marcos usa simbólicamente los demonios para representar el dolor, el mal y el sufrimiento de la vida. Jesús, la compasión viva de Dios entre nosotros, actúa para aliviar el sufrimiento de la vida al atacar y expulsar continuamente a los demonios que a menudo nos abruma. *Para Marcos, esta es una clara indicación de que el reino de Dios ha llegado, ofreciendo esperanza y compasión en medio del sufrimiento humano, la desesperación y la desesperanza.* Jesús ofrece ayuda con curación, cuidado y preocupación por todo lo que

nos agobia y oprime.

Nuestro llamado bautismal como discípulos nos involucra a todos en el ministerio del cuidado y la compasión hacia todos, especialmente a los que no tienen poder, los oprimidos y los que sufren o sienten desesperación. Para hacer tal ministerio bien y efectivamente, una vida de oración activa es esencial. Durante su vida y ministerio, Jesús continuamente se sintonizó con Dios a través de la oración, obteniendo sustento y fortaleza del poder y la presencia de Dios, lo que le permitió enfrentar y eventualmente superar las malas experiencias de la vida.

En definitiva, las buenas nuevas que Jesús predica y que todos estamos llamados a predicar y ministrar a través de nuestro bautismo es que, en medio de las dificultades, dolores, tristezas y desilusiones de la vida, Dios se preocupa, Dios interviene, Dios sana y Dios restaura nuestra esperanza.

¿Cómo mantiene la esperanza en medio de las dificultades de la vida? ¿De qué manera su compromiso bautismal es un llamado a predicar y ministrar las buenas nuevas de la compasión y el cuidado de Dios? *Esta semana, busque a alguien que necesita escuchar las buenas nuevas de que Dios se preocupa, sana y restaura la esperanza y la vida.*


