As we continue our series on the History of the Mass, this week's video focuses on the impact that the Reformation had on the Mass. Many church people over several centuries were calling for reform of the Mass, along with many other reforms. Most of them were not successful, but Martin Luther was, but at the cost of church unity. Nevertheless, Luther called for a more full and active participation on the part of the community in the Mass celebration. Mass in the vernacular, singing at all Masses, homilies based on scripture, preaching that inspired, the cup as well as the bread, the priesthood of all the faithful, and many other reforms were at the heart of Luther's call to return the liturgy to the whole community instead of leaving it in the hands of the ordained. 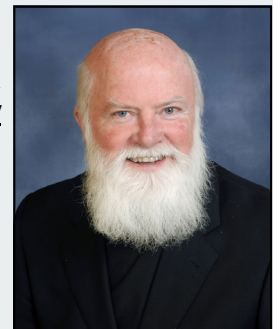

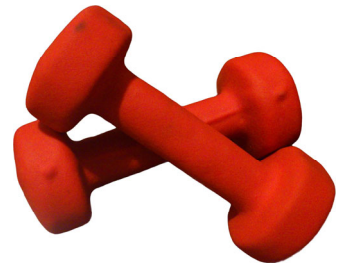

Did you know you don't have to become a gym rat to reap the rewards of physical activity? Simply making modest modifications throughout your daily routine that allow you to incorporate small bursts of activity (taking the stairs, parking farther away, doing jumping jacks during TV commercials) can have a significant impact on reducing your risk for disease.

Many older adults would love to exercise more to improve their health, but knowing where to start seems too daunting a task. Just begin one step at a time. Strength training can be effective in reducing the risk factors for many chronic conditions and diseases, and reverse the disease process. The benefits of strength training include:

- ✔ Increased muscle mass and strength
- ✔ Restoration of balance and flexibility
- ✔ Improved bone density and reduced risk of osteoporosis and related fractures
- ✔ Decreased arthritis pain
- ✔ Weight maintenance
- ✔ Reduced risk of diabetes, heart disease and depression
- ✔ Improved stress management
- ✔ Improved self-confidence, sleep quality and physical vitality

Tax and Estate Planning

Use tax and estate planning as a way to share God’s blessings with your parish ministries and those that they serve. Under the new tax law, the standard deduction threshold increased to \$12,000 for an individual and \$24,000 for a couple.

- Pick a target year to itemize and bundle your charitable gifts to exceed the threshold.
- Create a donor advised fund with a large charitable contribution that exceeds the threshold.

The limitation on deductions for charitable contributions increased from 50% to 60% of adjusted gross income. If you can afford to forego the income, help grow your parish and its ministries.

Reflection on the Readings

"Lord, send out your Spirit and renew the face of the earth." Psalm 104, the responsorial psalm for Pentecost resounds with this rich refrain. **What focus does this psalm present as we try to gain wisdom from the other Pentecost readings?**

What is the Lord's spirit and how does it bring about the renewal of the earth? ***Ruah*, the Hebrew word for "spirit," can mean "wind, breath, soul, spirit."** Psalm 104 depicts God as the giver and sustainer of life, the one who continually creates and re-creates. **It is God's breath or *ruah*, which creates, sustains and re-creates life. Without that breath, we perish.** Thus, we praise God for continually creating and re-creating us. What are the concrete manifestations of this re-creation? The other readings provide strong clues as to what re-creation entails.

The first reading, unique to Luke's Acts of the Apostles, is the narrative of Pentecost. **The backdrop to the descent of the Spirit is the Jewish feast of Weeks (Shavuot), or Pentecost, occurring exactly fifty days after Passover. The narrative specifies two aspects of re-creation.** One is the attitude of receptiveness needed if we are to be open to the presence of the Spirit. This requires the support and encouragement of a community that attunes itself to the direction of the spirit. Once such attunement is cultivated, then the Spirit can do its work. **The powerful result is a two-fold miracle, corresponding to the two things that most humans find challenging: speaking and listening meaningfully.**

Speaking in a language that all can understand is a miracle in itself for most of us. However, listening and understanding something we find difficult or strange is an even greater miracle. **In other words, the Spirit reverses the confusion and tyranny of the Tower of Babel syndrome (Gen 11), gifting us with wisdom, along with understanding hearts and minds, so that God's presence, mission and reign become living realities.** This gifting is intended for all, achieving a universalism consistent with God's intention and purpose from the beginning of creation.

The second reading from Paul's first letter to the Corinthians proclaims that the presence of the Spirit manifests diversity in thought, gifts, feelings and presence. Our oneness in the Spirit manifests itself through the many diverse gifts

given to build up the entire body of Christ. **Diversity is not destructive of unity but rather is the essential component of unity.** Jesuit Pierre Teilhard de Chardin perfectly expressed this reality by stating, "unity is achieved by honoring the differences."

The gospel reading from John comes from Jesus' Last Supper Farewell Discourse to his disciples. Jesus promises that upon his return to the Father, he will send the Spirit, whom he names as both the Spirit of truth and the Advocate. The Spirit will testify to Jesus, just as the disciples will testify to Jesus. They have come to believe Jesus as the one sent by God, having been with him from the beginning and thus coming to intimacy and knowledge of him. The Spirit of truth who knows the Father and Son intimately will guide the disciples to all truth, something they cannot now bear. **Upon his coming, the Spirit will declare that truth and intimacy to them so that they can be effective and powerful witnesses to Jesus and to the one who sent him.** The Spirit is our guarantee of the truth of what Jesus is about, along with being our Advocate in our call to testify to the Lord in all that we say and do. **The Spirit empowers us to speak truth to power and assures us of help and guidance every step of the way.**

The responsorial psalm focuses the wisdom from the other readings by dialoguing with them about the essentials involved in being renewed and re-created by God in and through the Spirit. God is the giver of all life, continually renewing and re-creating us. **When we choose to speak and listen with open hearts, when diversity is seen as a rich blessing, when we can and do speak truth to power no matter the cost, then we can be certain that the Spirit is present, renewing, re-creating, and empowering us for abundant life.**

Reflexión Sobre las Lecturas

"Envía tu Espíritu, Señor, y repuebla la faz de la tierra". El salmo 103, el salmo responsorial de Pentecostés resuena con este rico refrán. **¿Qué enfoque presenta este salmo mientras tratamos de obtener sabiduría sobre las otras lecturas de Pentecostés?**

¿Cuál es el espíritu del Señor y cómo produce la renovación de la tierra? **Ruah**, la palabra hebrea para "espíritu", puede significar "viento, aliento, alma, dador y sustentador de la vida, el que continuamente crea y recrea. Es el aliento de Dios o **ruah**, que crea, sostiene y recrea la vida. Sin ese aliento, perecemos. Por lo tanto, alabamos a Dios por creamos y volver a creamos continuamente. ¿Cuáles son las manifestaciones concretas de esta recreación? Las otras lecturas proporcionan fuertes pistas sobre lo que implica la recreación.

La primera lectura, exclusiva de los Hechos de los Apóstoles de Lucas, es la narración de Pentecostés. El **telón de fondo del descenso del Espíritu es la fiesta judía de Semanas (Shavuot), o Pentecostés, que ocurre exactamente cincuenta días después de la Pascua. La narración especifica dos aspectos de la reacción. Una es la actitud de receptividad necesaria si queremos estar abiertos a la presencia del Espíritu. Esto requiere el apoyo y el aliento de una comunidad que se sintoniza con la dirección del espíritu. Una vez que tal sintonización es cultivada, entonces el Espíritu puede hacer su trabajo. El resultado poderoso es un milagro doble, que corresponde a las dos cosas que la mayoría de los humanos encuentran desafiantes: hablar y escuchar de manera significativa.**

Hablar en un idioma que todos puedan entender es un milagro en sí mismo para la mayoría de nosotros. Sin embargo, escuchar y entender algo que nos resulta difícil o extraño es un milagro aún mayor. **En otras palabras, el Espíritu revierte la confusión y la tiranía del síndrome de la Torre de Babel (Gen 11), dándonos sabiduría, junto con la comprensión de corazones y mentes, para que la presencia, la misión y el reinado de Dios se conviertan en realidades vivientes.** Este regalo está destinado a todos, logrando un universalismo consistente con la intención y el propósito de Dios desde el comienzo de la creación.

La segunda lectura de la primera carta de Pablo a los Corintios proclama que la presencia del Espíritu **manifiesta diversidad en pensamientos, dones, sentimientos y presencia.** Nuestra unidad en el Espíritu se manifiesta a través de los muchos dones diversos que se dan para construir todo el cuerpo de Cristo. **La diversidad no es destructiva a la unidad, sino**

que es el componente esencial de la unidad. El jesuita Pierre Teilhard de Chardin expresó perfectamente esta realidad al afirmar que "la unidad se logra honrando a las diferencias".

La lectura del evangelio de Juan viene del Discurso del Adios de Jesús a sus discípulos en la Última Cena. Jesús promete que a su regreso al Padre, él enviará el Espíritu, a quien él nombra como el Espíritu de la verdad y el Protector. El Espíritu testificará de Jesús, así como los discípulos testificarán de Jesús. Han llegado a creer a Jesús como el enviado por Dios, habiendo estado con él desde el principio y llegando así a la intimidad y el conocimiento de él. El Espíritu de verdad que conoce íntimamente al Padre y al Hijo guiará a los discípulos hacia toda la verdad, algo que ahora no pueden soportar. **A su venida, el Espíritu declarará esa verdad e intimidad a ellos para que puedan ser testigos efectivos y poderosos de Jesús y de quien lo envió.** El Espíritu es nuestra garantía de la verdad de lo que trata Jesús, junto con ser nuestro Protector en nuestro llamado a testificar del Señor en todo lo que decimos y hacemos. **El Espíritu nos autoriza a decir la verdad al poder y nos asegura ayuda y guía en cada paso del camino.**

El salmo responsorial enfoca la sabiduría de las otras lecturas dialogando con ellas sobre los aspectos esenciales involucrados en la renovación y recreación de Dios en y a través del Espíritu. Dios es el dador de toda vida, continuamente renovando y recreándonos. Cuando elegimos hablar y escuchar con los corazones abiertos, cuando la diversidad se ve como una gran bendición, cuando podemos y sí decimos la verdad al poder sin importar el costo, podemos estar seguros de que el Espíritu está presente, renovando, recreando y empoderándonos para una vida abundante.

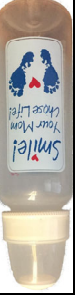
