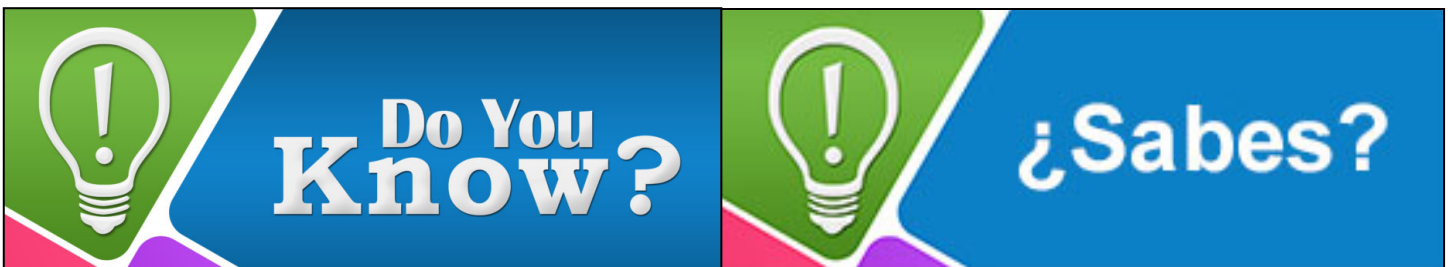


### This Week's Do You Know Video:

Baptism is the key focus of the entire Lent-Easter-Pentecost festival season. Lent originally began as a forty-day intense spiritual preparation for all those adults who had been preparing for three to five years to be fully initiated at the Easter Vigil. With fewer adults and more infants being baptized, Lent shifted to a penance and repentance season for those already baptized. Vatican II restored the Lenten baptismal focus. The Triduum, especially the Easter Vigil, celebrates initiation for those never baptized and renews the baptismal promises and commitment for those already baptized. The baptismal focus of the entire Easter season is expressed each Sunday of Easter through being sprinkled with baptismal water and renewing our baptismal promises in place of the Creed. Make time to view this week's DYK video and immerse yourself in the baptismal experience that is the Easter season.

### En Nuestro Video ¿Sabes...? de Esta Semana:

El bautismo es el enfoque clave de toda la temporada festiva de Cuaresma-Pascua-Pentecostés. Con menos adultos y más niños bautizados, la Cuaresma cambió a una temporada de penitencia y arrepentimiento para los que ya estaban bautizados. El Vaticano II restauró el enfoque bautismal de la Cuaresma. El Triduo, especialmente la vigilia pascual, celebra la iniciación de los nunca bautizados y renueva las promesas bautismales y el compromiso de los ya bautizados. El enfoque bautismal de todo el tiempo de Pascua se expresa cada domingo de Pascua al ser rociados con agua bautismal y renovar nuestras promesas bautismales en lugar del Credo. Tómese un momento para ver el video ¿Sabes? de esta semana y sumérgase en la experiencia bautismal que es la temporada de Pascua.

The fourth Sunday of Easter is known as Good Shepherd Sunday. The gospel reading for all three lectionary years proclaims different verses of the Good Shepherd discourse found in chapter ten of John's gospel.

Biblically speaking, shepherds referred to the leaders of the people, usually kings and priests who were anointed and set aside to be attuned to the needs of the people. They were to make sure that justice, right relationship and inclusivity were hallmarks of their dealings with all people. However, the prophetic tradition clearly expresses the reality that these shepherds were often bad or poor shepherds, taking advantage or lording it over the people under their care. Pope Francis' prophetic directive clearly applies here as he challenges all church leaders to "take on the smell of the sheep." Even Francis' papal cross is that of the Good Shepherd surrounded by sheep who know and recognize his voice.

Chapter ten of John's gospel boldly affirms Jesus to be the Good Shepherd. A good shepherd is one who goes out of his way to care for and protect those under his care. He "knows" his people with intimacy and love, and they respond by listening and following. Jesus faithful gift to his sheep, his people, is eternal life. John images this strong bond of intimacy and love by asserting that we are grasped

and firmly held in Christ's hands, "No one can take them out of my hand." **A good shepherd makes sure that his people are protected at all cost, even if it means risk and danger to his own life.**

The first reading from Acts speaks of both Paul and Barnabas encountering opposition and rejection on their journey of witness and evangelization. Such rejection does not stop them from being faithful to their mission of being a "light to the Gentiles...an instrument of salvation to the ends of the earth." **Those who reject their mission of witnessing to Christ are left to their own devices as Paul and Barnabas direct their efforts to those willing to listen and be changed.**

No matter the struggles, even the dangers to one's life, Jesus' followers are "filled with joy and the Holy Spirit," knowing that they are always held in God's protective hands. **With the psalmist we joyfully sing the refrain of Responsorial Psalm 100 as we affirm our enduring belief, "We are his people, the sheep of his flock."**

The second reading from the book of Revelation proclaims that our Good Shepherd, Jesus, is also the lamb who was slain for his people, and who is now risen. The risen Christ, now victorious, is honored by a countless multitude who stand before him "wearing white robes and holding palm branches in their hands." They sacrificed themselves in witnessing to the Lord and "have survived the time of great distress" by washing their robes and making them "white in the blood of the Lamb."

Witnessing to the risen Christ in hope and confidence, they are now rewarded for their faithfulness by their Good Shepherd "who will shelter them...lead them to springs of life-giving water...wipe away every tear from their eyes." **They trusted in the Lord, their Good Shepherd, and the risen Christ has not let them down.**

Hearing, following and witnessing to Jesus, our Good Shepherd, means carrying on the mission of Jesus here and now, no matter where we are planted. It necessitates hope, trust and confidence in the risen Lord who grasps us firmly in his hands. It involves care and concern for all God's people, even being willing to risk our own lives so that others may live. **How do you model Jesus, the Good Shepherd, in your multiple interactions with people? On this Good Shepherd Sunday and throughout this week, examine those interactions and ask God to make you more like our risen Lord, our Good Shepherd.**

El cuarto domingo de Pascua es conocido como el Domingo del Buen Pastor. La lectura del evangelio de los tres años leccionarios proclama diferentes versos del discurso del Buen Pastor que se encuentra en el capítulo diez del evangelio de Juan.

Bíblicamente hablando, los pastores se referían a los líderes del pueblo, generalmente reyes y sacerdotes que fueron ungidos y puestos a un lado para estar en sintonía con las necesidades de la gente. Debían asegurarse de que la justicia, la relación correcta y la inclusión fueran características distintivas de sus relaciones con todas las personas. Sin embargo, la tradición profética expresa claramente la realidad de que estos pastores eran a menudo malos o pobres pastores, aprovechándose o enseñoreándose sobre las personas bajo su cuidado. La directiva profética del Papa Francisco se aplica claramente aquí, ya que desafía a todos los líderes de la iglesia a "asumir el olor de las ovejas". Incluso la cruz papal del Papa Francisco es la del Buen Pastor rodeado de ovejas que conocen y reconocen su voz.

El capítulo diez del evangelio de Juan afirma audazmente que Jesús es el Buen Pastor. Un buen pastor es aquel que se desvía de su camino para cuidar y proteger a los que están bajo su cuidado. Él "conoce" a su pueblo con intimidad y amor, y el pueblo responde escuchándolo y siguiéndolo. El fiel regalo de Jesús a sus ovejas, a su pueblo, es la vida eterna. Juan crea una imagen este fuerte vínculo de intimidad y amor al afirmar que estamos firmemente sujetos en las manos de Cristo, "Nadie las arrebatará de mi mano". Un buen pastor se asegura de que su pueblo esté protegido a toda costa, incluso el riesgo y peligro para su propia vida.

La primera lectura de los Hechos habla de que tanto Pablo como Bernabé encontraron oposición y rechazo en su viaje de testimonio y evangelización. Tal rechazo no les impide ser fieles a su misión de ser "una luz de los paganos, para que lleven la salvación hasta los últimos rincones de la tierra". Los que rechazan su misión de testimoniar a Cristo quedan a su suerte como Pablo y Bernabé dirigen sus esfuerzos a aquellos que están dispuestos a escuchar y ser cambiados.

Sin importar las luchas, incluso los peligros para la vida de uno, los seguidores de Jesús están "llenos de alegría y del Espíritu Santo", sabiendo que siempre están en manos protectoras de Dios. Con el salmista cantamos con alegría el estribillo del Salmo 100 cuando afirmamos nuestra creencia perdurable: "Somos su pueblo y ovejas de su rebaño".

La segunda lectura del libro de Apocalipsis proclama que nuestro Buen Pastor, Jesús, es también el cordero que fue sacrificado por su pueblo, y que ahora ha resucitado. El Cristo resucitado, ahora victorioso, es honrado por una multitud innumerable que se presenta ante él "vestidos con una túnica blanca y llevaban palmas en las manos". Se sacrificaron para testificar al Señor y "han pasado por la gran persecución" lavándose sus túnicas y blanqueándolas con la sangre del Cordero.

Testificando al Cristo resucitado con esperanza y confianza, ahora son recompensados por su fidelidad por su Buen Pastor quien "los protegerá continuamente... los conducirá a las fuentes del agua de la vida... 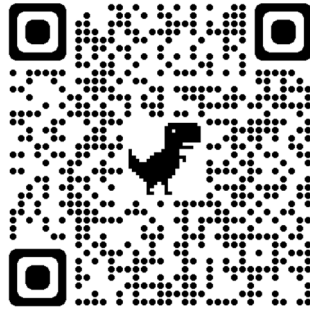
Hechos 13:48-49

**In God's Image - A Peace and Justice Column On War**

- When Jesus was surrounded and seized by an armed mob in the Garden of Gethsemane, one of his followers jumped to his defense striking the chief priest's servant and cutting off his ear. Jesus said, "Put your sword back into its sheath, for all who take the sword will perish by the sword." (Mt 26:52, NABRE) Then Jesus performed one last miracle before his death: he healed the man's ear in a sign of reconciliation.
- In 1219, on a battlefield of the Crusades, Saint Francis of Assisi (a former soldier turned Catholic friar) risked his life by crossing enemy lines to approach the Sultan of Egypt and greeted him saying, "May the Lord give you peace." The Sultan, experiencing the love of Christ through Saint Francis' words and actions, entered into dialogue with him about the conflicts and war between Muslims and Christians and about the search for mutual respect and peace.
- In 1917, our Blessed Mother appeared to three children in Fatima, Portugal. In a series of visits and messages, she expressed her concern for her children, explaining the horrors of World War I and warning about future wars. She begged her children - all of God's children, "Continue the Rosary, my children. Say it every day that the war may end." We celebrate the Feast of Our Lady of Fatima on May 13.
- On October 4, 1965, during the height of the Cold War, Pope Paul VI addressed the United Nations calling on the leaders of all countries to become peacemakers. He said, "No more war, war never again! Peace, it is peace which must guide the destinies of people and of all mankind."
- Saint John Paul II, having lived under both Nazi and Communist rule in Poland, called war "a defeat for humanity." In his homily on the Solemnity of Pentecost in 1982, he said, "Today, the scale and horror of modern warfare - whether nuclear or not - makes it totally unacceptable as a means of settling differences between nations. War should belong to the tragic past, to history; it should find no place on humanity's agenda for the future."
- Pope Francis, ever since the Russian invasion of Ukraine, has made repeated statements decrying war and urging the faithful to pray for peace. In an April Vatican address he said, "Cruelty that is increasingly horrendous, also against civilians, defenseless women and children. They are victims whose innocent blood cries out up to heaven and implores: 'Stop this war! Let the weapons fall silent! Stop sowing death and destruction'."

**A Imagen de Dios -Una Columna de Paz y Justicia Sobre la Guerra**

- Cuando Jesús fue rodeado y apresado por una multitud armada en el Huerto de Getsemaní, uno de sus seguidores saltó en su defensa golpeando al sirviente del sumo sacerdote y cortándole una oreja. Jesús dijo: "Guarda tu espada, porque los que a hierro matan, a hierro mueren." (Mt 26:52, NVI) Entonces Jesús realizó un último milagro antes de su muerte: curó la oreja del hombre en un señal de reconciliación.
- En 1219, en un campo de batalla de las Cruzadas, San Francisco de Asís (un ex soldado convertido en fraile católico) arriesgó su vida cruzando las líneas enemigas para acercarse al Sultán de Egipto y lo saludó diciendo: "Que el Señor te dé la paz". El Sultán, experimentando el amor de Cristo a través de las palabras y acciones de San Francisco, dialogó con él sobre los conflictos y la guerra entre musulmanes y cristianos y sobre la búsqueda del respeto mutuo y de la paz.
- En 1917, nuestra Santísima Madre se apareció a tres niños en Fátima, Portugal. En una serie de visitas y mensajes expresó su preocupación por sus hijos, explicando los horrores de la Primera Guerra Mundial y advirtiendo sobre futuras guerras. Ella rogó a sus hijos, todos los hijos de Dios: "Continúen el Rosario, hijos míos. Récenlo todos los días para que termine la guerra". Celebramos la Fiesta de Nuestra Señora de Fátima el 13 de mayo.
- El 4 de octubre de 1965, durante la cumbre de la Guerra Fría, el Papa Pablo VI se dirigió a las Naciones Unidas llamando a los líderes de todos los países a convertirse en pacificadores. Dijo: "¡No más guerra, guerra nunca más! La paz, es la paz la que debe guiar los destinos de los pueblos y de toda la humanidad".
- San Juan Pablo II, habiendo vivido bajo el gobierno nazi y comunista en Polonia, llamó a la guerra "una derrota para la humanidad". En su homilía en la Solemnidad de Pentecostés en 1982, dijo: "Hoy, la escala y el horror de la guerra moderna, ya sea nuclear o no, la hace totalmente inaceptable como medio para resolver las diferencias entre las naciones. La guerra debería pertenecer al pasado trágico, a la historia; no debería encontrar lugar en la agenda de la humanidad para el futuro".
- El Papa Francisco, desde la invasión rusa de Ucrania, ha hecho repetidas declaraciones denunciando la guerra e instando a los fieles a rezar por la paz. En un discurso en el Vaticano de abril dijo: "crueldades cada vez más horribles, realizadas contra civiles, mujeres y niños indefensos. Son víctimas cuya sangre inocente grita hasta el Cielo e implora: ¡se ponga fin a esta guerra! ¡Callen las armas! ¡Se deje de sembrar muerte y destrucción!".
