A Vision for our Future

"The community of believers was of one heart and mind." Acts 4:32



One of the most fulfilling things in life is to be a part of something great with others. As we read the Gospels and the Acts of the Apostles, we often

notice the spirit of joy, confidence, and boldness with which the disciples lived and acted. They knew Jesus and they had received the Holy Spirit which filled them with Christ and his power.

I believe this is also what Christ wants to do in us now. God is pleased when we are *"of one heart and mind"* for that is a sign of the Holy Spirit's action in the Church. When we are one as a family, we can do great things for God; or rather, he can do great things in us and through us.

It is for this reason that I believe the Holy Spirit is calling me to lead us in a process of crafting a vision for our immediate future as a diocese. We need to do this not merely for ourselves, but for those who need Christ and what only the Catholic Church can provide. In a sense, our task is to simply discern what God wants us to do, right here, right now, and then act together.

This process will unfold over the next six months or so. To begin, I will be attending ten listening sessions throughout the length and breadth of our diocese. I want to hear about your hopes and dreams for our Church. These sessions will occur in the latter half of July. The places, dates and times of the sessions are included on this page and will be publicized in our parishes and missions. You may attend any session you like. The locations were chosen to provide an accessible session to as many parts of our diocese as possible to give everyone in the diocese a chance to participate in a vital way. It will also allow me to test my own insights and observations about my vision for the diocese and what our focus ought to be.

To assist me, I have assembled a "visioning team" primarily made up of lay people from across our diocese, but also including several members of our clergy. They will do added research and homework, and assist me in not only articulating a vision for the next 3-5 years, but also setting three priorities that express the vision with time-bound, measurable goals to achieve those priorities. I have also enlisted Catholic Leadership Institute to assist us as a consultant.

In my time as your bishop, I have been impressed with how many people are eager to be involved in doing something great for God. We have a great diocese, with great people, and a bright future. I am blessed to be a part of this community.

Please pray for the success of what we begin. Please jump in to the process and share your thoughts and opinions at one of the listening sessions. As we seek to live our Catholic Faith more fully, let us strive to do so as having one heart and mind.

"We are always courageous, although we know that while we are at home in the body we are away from the Lord, for we walk by faith, not by sight. Yet we are courageous, and we would rather leave the body and go home to the Lord."

2 Corinthians 5: 6-8

The word translated as "walk" can also be translated as "live." Thus, we could say "We live by faith, and not by sight." This was a popular and consistent theme for St. Paul, his point being that we need to build our lives around the eternal prospects, not those of this world. In this society "things" seem so important to us. However, the truth is that they have no eternal significance. 

Reflection on the Readings

Since the celebration of Pentecost, we re-entered the season of Ordinary or numbered Sundays that began with the feast of the Baptism of Jesus and was interrupted by the great ninety days of Lent-Easter-Pentecost. Both Trinity Sunday and the feast of the Body and Blood of Christ are part of Ordinary Time, even though we use their festal name and not their numbered name. Last week we picked up the numbered or ordered Sundays and today we reflect on the Eleventh Sunday in Ordinary Time.

Responsorial Psalm 92 clues us in to the theme for this Sunday, that of thanksgiving to God. We are invited to sing the refrain, "Lord, it is good to give thanks to you." The verses specify why thanksgiving is in order. **God's faithful covenant love is always there, always sustaining us in both good and bad. Planted or rooted in the Lord assures the just that they shall flourish and grow as tall and majestic as the cedars of Lebanon.** Even when old age strips us of vitality and energy, still the Lord will cause the just to be vigorous and sturdy. **The Lord can be relied on for life and growth.**

The first reading from Ezekiel is intended as a hopeful message to a dejected and lifeless Israel, destroyed and exiled in Babylonia. Through the prophet, God assures Israel that from this lifeless state, new growth and life will come. God will choose a tender shoot, and plant it on Israel's mountain heights, causing it to grow into a great majestic cedar. It will thus provide hospitality to all, and all will be amazed at its majesty and splendor. **God lifts up the lowly and brings down the mighty. All this is the Lord's doing. Nothing can prevent it from happening.**

The second reading from Paul's Second letter to the Corinthians acknowledges that in life, we "walk by faith and not by sight," since we are already connected to the Lord. Our desire is to be fully connected to the Lord. Since we are not there yet, the best way to fulfill that desire is to "aspire to please" the Lord always and everywhere. One day we will be with the Lord, and will be held accountable for all that we did. **Therefore, if we desire full union with the Lord, let us live in ways that manifest such ardent desire.**

Mark's gospel consists of two parables concerning God's reign. **Parables are stories taken from everyday life experiences intended to stretch people's imaginations, helping them arrive at connections that they would not ordinarily make.** The two parables speak of insignificant seeds that are sown, which grow mysteriously and provide growth, life, hospitality and abundance. This is what the reign of God is all about.

Jesus came to preach and model the reign of God, inviting others to imitate and live God's values and life style. As disciples, we do our best to plant and sow our own insignificant seeds – our words, our actions, our lives – trusting that God will cause life, growth, and abundance to happen. **Often God's reign is realized in the most unexpected and insignificant persons, times, places and events.** The poor, the oppressed, the marginalized and those suffering become mediums or vehicles, the fertile ground, of God's abundant life-giving growth and harvest. **This is the essential mystery of God's reign.**

As we "walk by faith and not by sight" we are invited to be part of building up God's reign. Jesus tells us that God's reign is assured. Paul invites us to do our own insignificant part in making that reign a reality. We know and trust that God will do the rest, and that nothing will stop that from happening.

This Sunday, reflect on how you cooperate with God in building up God's reign, no matter where you are planted. **How do you plant those insignificant seeds that God causes to sprout into majestic cedars, offering life, nourishment, shelter and security to all?** Ask God for help and strength to do all you can do make God's reign real and active today.

Reflexión Sobre las Lecturas

Desde la celebración de Pentecostés, volvimos a entrar en la temporada de los domingos ordinarios o numerados que comenzó con la fiesta del Bautismo de Jesús y fue interrumpida por los grandes noventa días de Cuaresma, Pascua y Pentecostés. Tanto el Domingo de la Trinidad como la fiesta del Cuerpo y la Sangre de Cristo son parte del Tiempo Ordinario, aunque usamos su nombre festivo y no su numero. La semana pasada volvimos a los domingos numerados u ordenados y hoy reflexionamos sobre el Undécimo Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario.

El Salmo responsorial 91 nos indica el tema de este domingo, el de la acción de gracias a Dios. Estamos invitados a cantar el estribillo, "Es bueno dar gracias al Señor". Los versos especifican por qué la acción de gracias está en orden. **El fiel amor de pacto de Dios siempre está presente, siempre nos sostiene tanto en lo bueno como en lo malo. Plantado o arraigado en el Señor asegura al justo que florecerán y crecerán tan altos y majestuosos como los cedros del Líbano.** Incluso cuando la vejez nos despoja de vitalidad y energía, el Señor hará que los justos sean vigorosos y fuertes. **Se puede confiar en el Señor para la vida y el crecimiento.**

La primera lectura de Ezequiel pretende ser un mensaje de esperanza para un Israel desanimado y sin vida, destruido y exiliado en Babilonia. A través del profeta, Dios le asegura a Israel que desde este estado sin vida, vendrá un nuevo crecimiento y una vida. Dios elegirá un brote tierno y lo plantará en las alturas de las montañas de Israel, haciendo que crezca hasta convertirse en un gran cedro majestuoso. Por lo tanto, proporcionará hospitalidad a todos, y todos se sorprenderán de su majestuosidad y esplendor. **Dios levanta a los humildes y derriba a los poderosos. Todo esto es obra del Señor. Nada puede evitar que suceda.**

La segunda lectura de la Segunda carta de Pablo a los Corintios reconoce que en la vida, "caminamos guiados por la fe, sin ver todavía", ya que estamos conectados con el Señor. Nuestro deseo es estar completamente conectado con el Señor. Como todavía no lo estamos, la mejor manera de cumplir ese deseo es "procurar agradarle" al Señor siempre y en todas partes. Algun día estaremos con el Señor y seremos responsables de todo lo que hicimos. **Por lo tanto, si deseamos la unión plena con el Señor, vivamos en formas que manifiesten ese ardiente deseo.**

El evangelio de Marcos consiste en dos parábolas sobre el reino de Dios. **Las parábolas son historias tomadas de experiencias de la vida cotidiana con la**

intención de darle alas a la imaginación de las personas, ayudándolas a llegar a conexiones que normalmente no harían. Las dos parábolas hablan de semillas insignificantes que se siembran, que crecen misteriosamente y proporcionan crecimiento, vida, hospitalidad y abundancia. De esto se trata el reino de Dios.

Jesús vino a predicar y modelar el reino de Dios, invitando a otros a imitar y vivir los valores y el estilo de vida de Dios. Como discípulos, hacemos nuestro mejor esfuerzo para plantar y sembrar nuestras semillas insignificantes, nuestras palabras, nuestras acciones, nuestras vidas, confiando en que Dios hará que la vida, el crecimiento y la abundancia sucedan. **Muchas veces, el reinado de Dios se realiza en las personas, tiempos, lugares y eventos más inesperados e insignificantes.** Los pobres, los oprimidos, los marginados y los que sufren se convierten en medios o vehículos, el terreno fértil, del crecimiento y la cosecha abundante y vivificante de Dios. **Este es el misterio esencial del reino de Dios.**

Mientras "caminamos guiados por la fe, sin ver todavía", se nos invita a ser parte de la construcción del reino de Dios. Jesús nos dice que el reino de Dios está asegurado. Pablo nos invita a hacer nuestra parte insignificante para hacer que ese reinado se haga realidad. Sabemos y confiamos en que Dios hará lo demás, y que nada impedirá que eso suceda.

Este domingo, reflexiona sobre cómo coopera con Dios para edificar el reino de Dios, sin importar dónde esté plantado. **¿Cómo planta esas semillas insignificantes que Dios hace brotar en majestuosos cedros, ofreciendo vida, alimento, refugio y seguridad a todos?** Pídale a Dios ayuda y fuerza para hacer todo lo que pueda hacer para que el reino de Dios sea real y activo hoy.


