# ADULT FAITH FORMATION

## REFLECTION ON THE THIRTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME , YEAR B

This Lectionary year B focuses on the gospel according to Mark. Mark's community understands Jesus to be the long awaited Messiah, who came to establish God's kingdom by battling and eventually overcoming the forces of evil. Throughout the gospel, Mark recounts how Jesus' teachings and actions manifest his power over the forces of evil. However, the evil forces do not give in so easily, pushing back and opposing Jesus all the way. Such opposition and rejection will be experienced by anyone who commits themselves to carrying on the mission and ministry of Jesus.

**Using Jesus as the model, Mark counsels courage and strength, faith and persistence.** Only with faith in God and persistence in living out the values and life style of Jesus will evil be defeated and God's kingdom be established. Responsorial Psalm 30 clearly links with Mark's message. The psalm is a song of praise and thanksgiving by one rescued from death and destruction through God's saving help. It provides a rich lens to this Sunday's theme of God as the author and the sustainer of life. By placing complete trust and confidence in God, the psalmist is rescued from death and given richness of life.

**The first reading from the book of Wisdom clearly states that God did not make death,** the implication being that it was the result of humanity's inability to be content with creature-hood, desiring to be Godlike instead. Death entered the world through the "envy of the devil" and will be experienced by all those who prefer the devil's company rather than God's. However, the author believes that "justice is undying" and that God formed humanity to be "imperishable," having been created in the very image and likeness of the imperishable God. The gist of the reading presents God as the creator and sustainer of enduring and imperishable life, clearly linking it with the responsorial psalm and the gospel.

**The second reading from Paul's Second Letter to the Corinthians** encourages the followers of Jesus to imitate him in his willingness to become "poor" so that we "might become rich." Paul is attempting to motivate his community to contribute to other Jesus followers who are in need. Sharing resources so as to meet the basic needs of others

should be the concern of all. Justice demands as much, and so does our relationship to God, who gives to all according to their needs. God's gift of manna in the desert manifested this shared equality of needs and so it should be among those who claim to be Jesus' disciples.



**Mark's Jesus performs actions and deeds that overwhelm his followers,** forcing them to seek deeper understanding of who Jesus is and what following him demands. Mark recounts the miracle of the raising of Jairus' daughter intermingled with the cure of the woman afflicted with a blood disease. While totally marvelous in themselves, Mark uses the events to teach the disciples and ourselves the virtues and attitudes required of any follower of Jesus.

**Both miracles challenge Jesus' disciples not to be afraid but to have faith** even in the face of overwhelming odds and circumstances. The woman had been suffering with a blood disease for twelve years. Yet her courage and faith in Jesus and his power over evil has her dare to reach out and touch the fringes of Jesus' garment. Once she is discovered she fears the worst, yet she is not afraid to reveal her faith and belief. Jesus directly connects her healing with her faith.

**The same message is evident in the account of the raising of Jairus' daughter,** a young girl of twelve. While others pronounced her dead, Jesus counsels Jairus: "Do not be afraid. Just have faith." Jesus can and does bring even the dead back to life. Faith can overcome all sorts of fear and limitations, even death. Faith thus becomes the essential component in overcoming evil, suffering and fear, enabling us with God's help to make real God's reign.

**How is this message of trust and faith operative in your life as a follower of Jesus?** How does this stance help you come to a deeper awareness of who Jesus is and what following him entails? Let us help one another to be people of faith.


## UPLIFT COOKS!

## SUMMER SOFTBALL





## FORM FOR COMMUNICATION WITH MINORS



## RCIA

### ST. SABINA RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS – 2015-2016

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults, the RCIA, is a process which welcomes all who are interested in becoming Catholic, or any Catholic wishing to deepen their understanding of the faith. The Rite involves the formation of a community that learns, shares, builds community and prays together to deepen their relationship to God and to the parish family. During the next few weeks, we will be asking if you are aware of anyone who would benefit from participation in this faith learning process. Below are some of the values that we hold as Catholic Christians, which we readily share with all who desire to journey with us through the RCIA.

**WHY BE CATHOLIC?** The Catholic Church has consistently believed that God has a universal will and desire to save all people. Our God is the God of all people. God has initiated this love relationship with all creation and desires to bring all to fullness through total union with God for all eternity. Each one is called to union with God through the faith path and tradition that they feel God is leading them.

If this is so, then why be Catholic? One is Catholic, not because it is the only way to God, but because one feels attracted to the things that the Catholic tradition offers. One feels at home more in the Catholic tradition than in other faith traditions. The following list is meant to highlight some of those aspects of the Catholic tradition that have attracted others to it.

Catholics are not the only ones that value these qualities. Nor have we been consistent in following through on them. But, no matter the history, we seem to have held onto these values rather consistently.

#### See if these are values and attractions for you.

1. We affirm a belief in the goodness of all creation.
2. We have a universal sense of openness to all people and all cultures.
3. We affirm that we are all called to holiness.
4. We are committed to continual growth as persons.
5. We are challenged to change the world and society into the reign of God.
6. We are called to live in community.
7. We have historical roots and identity.
8. We respect reason, human knowledge and human exploration.

## AREA INFORMATION

### DACA RENEWALS

Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA) must be renewed every two years. If you have DACA status, please be aware that the renewal process takes about 7 months. Please refer to the following timeline to ensure that you renew your DACA on time:

1. Check the expiration date on your work permit
  2. Gather proof of presence in the United States since applying for DACA
  3. Save money for the filing fee and for an attorney
- Processing a DACA renewal takes approximately 6 months. To ensure timely renewal, 7 months prior to your DACA expiration you should begin the renewal process.




