

Reflection on the Readings

As we plunge ourselves once again into the season of Ordinary Time it is important to remember that this rich season of numbered Sundays focuses our attention on walking with Jesus on his paschal journey. As we transition from the festal season of Lent-Easter-Pentecost to Ordinary Time, we make time to reflect weekly on our paschal journey with Christ, along with the demands and rewards of discipleship. *This Sunday's readings highlight integral components of both discipleship and the paschal journey.*

The refrain of Responsorial Psalm 89, “Forever I will sing the goodness of the Lord,” reminds us that in both good and bad times, disciples always sing the goodness of the Lord. God’s love (*hesed*) and faithfulness (*’emunah*) permeate the psalm, manifested in the wonders of creation, and in God’s loving covenant care for the people mediated through the Davidic king. *The only fitting response to God’s love and faithfulness is that of forever singing the goodness of the Lord.*

The first reading from 2 Kings tells of a Shunemite “woman of influence” who not only recognizes Elisha as a holy servant of God but welcomes him into her home and provides room and board for him. Elisha desires to do something in return and realizing that she does not have a son and her husband is old, promises that in a year’s time she “will be fondling a baby son.” The woman’s kindness toward God’s servant is rewarded with a key sign of God’s goodness, namely the gift of life and creation. *As disciples, we manifest God’s goodness by always affirming God’s creative love in our lives and that of others.* It is a key reward of a life of discipleship.

Paul’s letter to the Romans also affirms God’s goodness in raising Jesus from death and through baptism, enabling us to participate in Jesus’ death and resurrection. Baptism calls us to die to our old self (the cross) and, through God’s gracious love, to rise with Christ to new life. *Just as death no longer has any power over Jesus, so in Christ, sin no longer has any power over us.*

In Baptism, we are strengthened on our paschal journey with Christ through the power of his resurrection. However, this discipleship journey always involves the cross, namely, death to the old self so as to rise to new

life in Christ. *The paschal journey always involves the cross as the only path to new risen life in Christ. The rewards of discipleship must always confront the demands of discipleship.*

The gospel reading from Matthew 10, Jesus’ missionary discourse to his disciples as he sends them out to spread the word, emphasizes once again both the demands and rewards of discipleship. Discipleship demands that we place our relationship with Christ above all others, including family relationships. *Disciples must be willing to take up their cross and to lose their life so that they can attune themselves to what God desires and become living examples of Christ to all they encounter.* To lose one’s life is to move away from selfishness (those who find life) and be willing to sacrifice oneself for others as Jesus modeled for us.

The gospel also speaks of rewards for hospitality offered to those sent out by Jesus. In welcoming those who are carrying on Jesus’ mission and ministry, we also welcome Christ, and the Father who sent him. *When we care for one another, we show care, love and intimate relationship with God as well.* Such care and concern will never be forgotten and will ultimately be rewarded, if not in this life, then in the next.

As disciples, how willing are you to take up your cross and “lose” your life so as to find it? 

Reflexión Sobre las Lecturas

Ya que nos sumergimos una vez más en la temporada del Tiempo Ordinario, es importante recordar que esta temporada de domingos enfoca nuestra atención en caminar con Jesús en su viaje pascual. Mientras pasamos de la temporada festiva de Cuaresma-Pascua-Pentecostés al Tiempo Ordinario, hacemos tiempo semanalmente para reflexionar sobre nuestro viaje pascual con Cristo, junto con las demandas y recompensas del discipulado. *Las lecturas de este domingo recalcan los componentes integrales tanto del discipulado como del viaje pascual.*

El refrán del Salmo Responsorial 89, "Cantaré eternamente las misericordias del Señor", nos recuerda que en los tiempos buenos y malos, los discípulos siempre cantan la misericordia del Señor. El amor de Dios (hesed) y la fidelidad de Dios ('emunah) impregnan el salmo, manifestado en las maravillas de la creación, y en el cuidado del pacto amoroso de Dios al pueblo mediado por el rey Davídico. *La única respuesta apropiada al amor y la fidelidad de Dios es la de cantar siempre la bondad del Señor.*

La primera lectura de 2 Reyes habla de una "mujer distinguida" de Sunem que no sólo reconoce a Eliseo como un siervo santo de Dios sino que le da la bienvenida a su casa y le provee habitación y comida. Eliseo desea hacer algo a cambio y al darse cuenta de que no tiene hijos y su marido ya es anciano, promete que en un año ella "tendrá un hijo en sus brazos". La bondad de la mujer hacia el siervo de Dios es recompensada con una señal clave de la bondad de Dios, es decir, el regalo de la vida y la creación. *Como discípulos,*

manifestamos la bondad de Dios al afirmar siempre el amor creativo de Dios en nuestras vidas y en las de los demás. Es una recompensa clave de una vida del discipulado.

La carta de Pablo a los Romanos también afirma la bondad de Dios al resucitar a Jesús de la muerte y mediante el bautismo, permitiéndonos participar en la muerte y resurrección de Jesús. El bautismo nos llama a morir al pasado de uno mismo (la cruz), y a través del amor misericordioso de Dios, a resucitarnos con Cristo a la nueva vida. *Así como la muerte no tiene poder sobre Jesús, así en Cristo, el pecado ya no tiene ningún poder sobre nosotros.* En el Bautismo, estamos fortalecidos en nuestro camino pascual con Cristo a través del poder de su resurrección. Sin embargo, este viaje del discipulado siempre implica la cruz, es decir, la muerte al pasado de uno mismo, para resucitarse a una nueva vida en Cristo. *El viaje pascual siempre implica la cruz como el único camino a la nueva vida resucitada en Cristo. Las recompensas del discipulado deben enfrentar siempre las demandas del discipulado.*

La lectura del evangelio según San Mateo 10, el discurso misionero de Jesús a sus discípulos cuando los envía para difundir la palabra, enfatiza una vez más las demandas y recompensas del discipulado. El discipulado exige que pongamos nuestra relación con Cristo sobre todos los demás, incluyendo las relaciones familiares. *Los discípulos deben estar dispuestos a tomar su cruz y perder su vida para que puedan sintonizarse con lo que Dios desea y convertirse en*

ejemplos vivos de Cristo a todos los que encuentran. Perder la vida es alejarse del egoísmo (los que encuentran la vida) y estar dispuesto a sacrificarse a sí mismo por los demás como Jesús modeló para nosotros.

El evangelio también habla de recompensas por la hospitalidad ofrecida a los enviados por Jesús. Al dar la bienvenida a aquellos que están llevando a cabo la misión y ministerio de Jesús, también damos la bienvenida a Cristo, y al Padre que lo envió. *Cuando nos cuidamos uno al otro, mostramos el cuidado, amor y relación íntima con Dios también.* Tal cuidado y preocupación nunca será olvidado y será recompensado, si no en esta vida, será en la siguiente.

Como discípulos, ¿cuán dispuesto está a tomar su cruz y "perder" su vida para poder encontrarla? Reflexione sobre la forma en que ha recibido o dado la bienvenida a otros, especialmente al extranjero, a los perdidos, a los alienados y a los oprimidos. *Esta semana busque ocasiones de ser acogedor y hospitalario para aquellos que más lo necesitan.*
