St. Sabina, a Catholic faith community committed to total and lifelong faith formation, is offering an adult faith formation program titled, Foundations for Living Stones. ADULT FAITH FORMATION

REFLECTION ON THE SEVENTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME , YEAR B

From the Seventeenth to the Twenty-first Sunday in Ordinary Time Year B, the semi-continuous reading of Mark is interrupted with the proclamation of John chapter 6, the “Bread of Life” discourse. Why does the Lectionary insert such a major interruption into a year devoted to the gospel according to Mark?

Vatican II’s revision of the Lectionary developed a three-year structure with each year containing a semi-continuous proclamation of the gospels according to Matthew, Mark and Luke. No Lectionary year is devoted to John’s gospel, since John is so prominently proclaimed in the Lent/Easter season and is more difficult to break up into short passages for proclamation.

Nowhere during these Sundays was John’s powerful chapter 6, the discourse on the bread of life, ever proclaimed. This was a significant lack in a Lectionary aimed at emphasizing Eucharistic celebration and reflection on the Eucharistic mystery. The revision committee decided to insert John’s discourse for five consecutive Sundays instead of Mark’s account of the feeding of five thousand. Rather than Mark’s brief narrative, John’s longer and more elaborate account was inserted.

The focus of this Sunday’s readings, as well as that of the whole chapter is summed up well in the refrain from responsorial Psalm 145: “The hand of the Lord feeds us; he answers all our needs.” The first reading from 2 Kings has the prophet Elisha multiply bread so that all can have their fill along with leftovers. This account provides a backdrop for Jesus’ multiplication of resources so that all can eat. John’s account of the multiplication of the loaves and fishes has Jesus, and not his disciples, directly feeding the crowd of five thousand with a mere five loaves and two fish. John’s message stresses that God, in the person of Jesus, is attuned to our needs and desires to meet those needs.

It is the Lord who feeds us and answers all our needs. This demands trust in a loving God who can do wonders with the little we have. Do we really believe this? If we do, how do we conduct our lives and relationships in accordance with that belief?

The letter to the Ephesians urges us to “live in a manner worthy of the call you have received.” What are the characteristics of such a life? It is life lived with humility, gentleness, with patience and kindness, bearing with one another, striving for peace and unity while respecting differences. This manner of living is the necessary precondition for building community and for caring for one another.

God has given us more than enough to sustain the entire human family. It is we who need to use what we have been given in a way that benefits the entire human family and not just a few members. On our own, we find this difficult to do. It is necessary for all of us to take on the mind and heart of Jesus, reaching out in care and concern for all, no matter how overwhelming the odds or how scarce the resources. Doing so will not only result in all having their various hungers met, but there will be more than enough left over. Again, do we really believe this? If so, how do we conduct our lives and relationships in accordance with that belief?

As we proclaim and reflect on John’s “bread of life” discourse these next five Sundays, think of the many ways in which God has nourished and sustained you. Reflect on how you can be a source of nourishment for others who hunger and thirst, not only for food but for justice and righteousness. Commit yourself to feed others the way God has fed you.

SETON CENTER DISC GOLF TOURNAMENT



ST. SABINA RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS – 2015-2016

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults, the RCIA, is a process which welcomes all who are interested in becoming Catholic, or any Catholic wishing to deepen their understanding of the faith. The Rite involves the formation of a community that learns, shares, builds community and prays together to deepen their relationship to God and to the parish family. During the next few weeks, we will be asking if you are aware of anyone who would benefit from participation in this faith learning process. Below are some of the values that we hold as Catholic Christians, which we readily share with all who desire to journey with us through the RCIA.

WHY BE CATHOLIC? The Catholic Church has consistently believed that God has a universal will and desire to save all people. Our God is the God of all people. God has initiated this love relationship with all creation and desires to bring all to fullness through total union with God for all eternity. Each one is called to union with God through the faith path and tradition that they feel God is leading them.

If this is so, then why be Catholic? One is Catholic, not because it is the only way to God, but because one feels attracted to the things that the Catholic tradition offers. One feels at home more in the Catholic tradition than in other faith traditions. The following list is meant to highlight some of those aspects of the Catholic tradition that have attracted others to it.

Catholics are not the only ones that value these qualities. Nor have we been consistent in following through on them. But, no matter the history, we seem to have held onto these values rather consistently.

See if these are values and attractions for you.

1. We affirm a belief in the goodness of all creation.
2. We have a universal sense of openness to all people and all cultures.
3. We affirm that we are all called to holiness.
4. We are committed to continual growth as persons.
5. We are challenged to change the world and society into the reign of God.
6. We are called to live in community.
7. We have historical roots and identity.
8. We respect reason, human knowledge and human exploration.

AREA INFORMATION

DACA RENEWALS

Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA) must be renewed every two years. If you have DACA status, please be aware that the renewal process takes about 7 months. Please refer to the following timeline to ensure that you renew your DACA on time:

1. Check the expiration date on your work permit
 2. Gather proof of presence in the United States since applying for DACA
 3. Save money for the filing fee and for an attorney
- Processing a DACA renewal takes approximately 6 months. To ensure timely renewal, 7 months prior to your DACA expiration you should begin the renewal process.

By law, ingredients have to be listed in order of weight, so by using just a little of five different sugars, sugar won't necessarily be the first ingredient on the label, even though the product may have more sugar in it than any other ingredient!

Por ejemplo, limpiando en bosque de Cinquera, refuerzo académico en las escuelas de los alrededores y participo en actividades en la comunidad.

A través del programa de becas, solo un niño puede tener beca de universidad a la vez. Mientras que uno de los hermanos de Idalia solo tiene educación de segundo grado, su hermano mayor completo el programa de becas y ahora es un doctor en medicina.

Idalia describe sus mayores dificultades y desafíos como, "Uno de los retos es la distancia de mi casa a la escuela, y los escasos recursos económicos, así como la situación actual de la seguridad."
