Diocesan Visioning Process – You Are Invited

Bishop Johnston recently instituted a “visioning” process to develop a Mutually Shared Vision for our diocese.

The purpose of the process is to create a compelling Vision statement (unifying theme) for the diocese. It will include three priorities—major areas of focus—for the diocese for the next 3 years and six goals (two within each priority) that will lead to specific outcomes in the next 2-3 years.

Bishop Johnston described the process as a way to “honestly assess our needs as a diocese and align them to the larger call of living as households of faith united in one Church as disciples of Jesus Christ.”

Bishop Johnston invites every member of our local church to participate in their regional listening session in July. The locations have been chosen to reach as much of the diocese as possible in the time frame available. You may attend any one of the sessions. We will have a session here at St. Sabina on Wednesday, July 25, 7:00pm.

Throughout the process Bishop Johnston asks everyone to join him in prayer for the fruitfulness of this effort. Prayer cards have been made available for this effort and distributed to parishes in late June. 


us to celebrate our local history as a part of the universal church. It also gives us a chance to reflect on the fact that the church

Blood Drive - July 15

Our next blood drive will be held on Sunday, July 15th from 8am-1pm in the gym. Please consider sharing your time. Each donation saves lives! Here are 10 facts about blood donations.

1. Blood fights against infection and helps heal wounds, keeping you healthy.
2. There are four main blood types: A, B, AB and O. AB is the universal recipient and O negative is the universal donor.
3. Blood centers often run short of type O and B blood.
4. Shortages of all types of blood occur during the summer and winter holidays.
5. If all blood donors gave 2 to 4 times a year, it would help prevent blood shortages.
6. If you began donating blood at age 17 and donated every 56 days until you reached 76, you would have donated 48 gallons of blood.
7. About three gallons of blood supports the entire nation's blood needs for one minute.
8. Blood donation takes four steps: medical history, quick physical, donation, and snacks.
9. The actual blood donation usually takes less than 10 minutes. The entire process takes about 45 minutes from when you sign in to the time you leave.
10. Giving blood will not decrease your strength.

Consider Making a Bequest to St. Sabina Bequests in a will or trust

The most basic estate planning tools are wills and trusts. “Bequests” are established by wills and trusts. Bequests are not payable until death, so they do not affect your assets or cash flow during your lifetime. You can change the provisions of your will or a revocable trust at any time.

To make a bequest you will most likely engage an estate planning attorney. This professional can guide you to make sure all legal necessities are followed. Charitable bequests are private. Your will is not filed or made public until your death. Trusts are never made public unless you instruct otherwise.

Frequently Asked Questions

Q What's the difference between a will and a trust?

A will is your instructions to your survivors and to the probate court about how you want your property distributed. It is a revocable, private document that only takes effect after your death.

A revocable trust -- sometimes called a living trust -- is a legal document that is always private and holds assets during your lifetime. After death, the trust transfers your assets -- or benefit from them -- to family and charity. Unlike a will, a trust must take title to assets before it can pass them to your survivors.

Q What if I already have written my will or trust?

You can amend a will or trust to make a new gift. Your attorney can prepare a simple document, called a codicil or amendment that adds a new charitable bequest while reaffirming the other terms of your will or trust.

Please consult with your own attorney and other professional advisors regarding your personal tax and financial situation.

Child Safety

The Diocese of Kansas City-St. Joseph is committed to combatting sexual abuse in the Church. If you are a victim of sexual abuse, or if you observe or suspect sexual abuse:

After reporting to these civil and law enforcement authorities, report suspected sexual abuse of a minor or vulnerable adult to the Diocesan Ombudsman, Jenifer Valenti, at 816.812.2500 or JeniferValenti@att.net, if the abuse involves a priest, deacon, employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Kansas City-St. Joseph.

Reflection on the Readings

The readings for this Sunday focus our attention on the human experience of opposition, contempt, rejection and misunderstanding. All four readings clearly state that pursuing God's agenda and carrying on the mission and ministry of Jesus will result in opposition, rejection and misunderstanding. This reality is an integral part of our baptismal commitment that we usually find difficult to face, respond to and live with. Today's readings offer various ways to deal with this pervasive human experience.

Responsorial Psalm 123 offers the strongest clue to facing this most difficult of life's dilemmas. The refrain challenges us to fix our eyes on the Lord, from whom comes all mercy, faithfulness, support and guidance. With the whole assembly we are invited to sing, "Our eyes are fixed on the Lord, pleading for his mercy." Through the psalm's prayer focus we come to understand that it is only in and with the Lord that we can face rejection and opposition with integrity and steadfastness. The Lord does not take away the reality, but rather helps us confront our distress and come to a sense of wholeness and peace in the face of it.

The first reading speaks of Ezekiel being called by the Lord to be a prophet to the people. In his vocation call, Ezekiel comes to the realization that a prophet, one who speaks on behalf of the Lord, will experience opposition and rejection by the people. It seems as if this reality is part and parcel of what it means to speak on behalf of God. The passage states that people in general have a pattern of rejecting anyone who reminds them of God's values and intentions. Since such words usually go against the prevailing attitude and perspective of most people, they are difficult to accept, leading to a pattern of rejection and opposition to anyone who claims to speak on behalf of God. As with all who are called to speak on behalf of the Lord, Ezekiel realizes that only with the Lord is this life adventure truly possible.


Paul in his second letter to the Corinthians speaks of a "thorn in the flesh" that he feels God had given him in order to curb his pride. In his ministry on behalf of the Lord, Paul feels that he was granted many spiritual gifts from God. This could have easily given Paul a "big head."

This "thorn in the flesh" is a sign that he is human just like everyone else. He seems to use this weakness, whatever it might be, to alert him to his need for the Lord. This weakness causes him to fix his "eyes" on the Lord alone. In this fashion, Paul can put up with any rejection and opposition, "for when I am weak, then I am strong." Rejection and opposition causes him to place his trust completely in the Lord, thus making him strong, and not his own weak and haughty self.

Mark's gospel has Jesus visit his hometown of Nazareth only to experience rejection, contempt and opposition from those closest to him, "from his own kin and in his own house." Jesus is so amazed at their "lack of faith" that he could not perform mighty deeds there. Their "lack of faith" meant that they could not perceive the presence and action of God in their midst. They had their minds and hearts closed to what God was accomplishing in the person of Jesus. Such blindness is often the main source of rejection and opposition to God. In such a context, God is powerless. God cannot and will not force faith. Faith can only operate when we allow it to take root in our hearts.

How have you learned to perceive the presence of God in your life? How have you handled rejection and opposition for your fidelity to your baptismal commitment? Ask God for help and guidance in fixing your "eyes" only on the Lord, trusting in God's mercy, support and faithfulness. Truly, only this makes us strong.

Reflexión Sobre las Lecturas


Las lecturas de este domingo centran nuestra atención en la experiencia humana de la oposición, el desprecio, el rechazo y la incomprensión. Las cuatro lecturas claramente declaran que seguir la agenda de Dios y llevar a cabo la misión y el ministerio de Jesús resultará en oposición, rechazo e incomprensión. Esta realidad es una parte integral de nuestro compromiso bautismal que generalmente nos resulta difícil enfrentar, responder y vivir. La lectura de hoy ofrece varias formas de lidiar con esta experiencia humana generalizada.

El Salmista Responsorial 122 ofrece la mejor pista para enfrentar el más difícil de los dilemas de la vida. El estribillo nos desafía a fijar nuestros ojos en el Señor, de quien proviene toda la misericordia, la fidelidad, el apoyo y la guía. Con toda la asamblea somos invitados a cantar: "Nuestros ojos están en el Señor Dios nuestro, esperando su misericordia". A través del enfoque de la oración del salmo llegamos a comprender que es solo en y con el Señor que podemos enfrentar el rechazo y la oposición con integridad y firmeza. El Señor no quita la realidad, sino que nos ayuda a enfrentar nuestra angustia y llegar a una sensación de plenitud y paz frente a ella.

La primera lectura habla de que Ezequiel fue llamado por el Señor para ser un profeta del pueblo. En su llamado vocacional, Ezequiel llega a la conclusión de que un profeta, alguien que habla en nombre del Señor, experimentará oposición y rechazo por parte del pueblo. Parece como si esta realidad fuera parte integrante de lo que significa hablar en nombre de Dios. El pasaje afirma que las personas en general tienen un patrón de rechazo a cualquiera que les recuerde los valores e intenciones de Dios. Dado que tales palabras generalmente van en contra de la actitud y la perspectiva prevalentes en la mayoría de las personas, son difíciles de aceptar, lo que lleva a un patrón de rechazo y oposición a cualquiera que diga hablar en nombre de Dios. Como todos los llamados a hablar en nombre del Señor, Ezequiel se da cuenta de que solo con el Señor es esta aventura de la vida realmente posible.

Pablo, en su segunda carta a los Corintios, habla de una "espina clavada en la carne" que siente que Dios le había dado para controlar su orgullo. En su ministerio en nombre del Señor, Pablo siente que recibió muchos dones espirituales de parte de Dios. Esto podría haberle hecho subir los humos a la cabeza. Esta "espina en la carne" es una señal de que es humano como todos los demás. Parece usar esta debilidad, cualquiera que sea, para alertarlo sobre su necesidad del Señor. Esta debilidad lo lleva a fijar sus "ojos" solo en el Señor. De esta manera, Pablo puede

soportar cualquier rechazo y oposición, "porque cuando soy más débil, soy más fuerte". El rechazo y la oposición lo hacen depositar su confianza completamente en el Señor, haciéndolo fuerte, y no ser débil y altivo.



? Como ha aprendido a percibir la presencia de Dios en su vida? Como ha manejado el rechazo y la oposición por su fidelidad a su compromiso bautismal? Pídale a Dios ayuda y guía para fijar sus "ojos" solo en el Señor, confiando en la misericordia, el apoyo y la fidelidad de Dios. En verdad, solo esto nos hace fuertes.


