# Stewardship

"You are not in the flesh; on the contrary, you are in the spirit, if only the Spirit of God dwells in you.

## The Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick

The Apostolic Constitution *Sacram unctionem infirmorum*, following upon the **Second Vatican Council**, established that henceforth, in the Roman Rite the following be observed: The sacrament of anointing of the Sick is given to those who are seriously ill by anointing them on the forehead and hands with duly blessed oil-pressed from olives or from other plants-saying, only once: "Through this holy anointing may the Lord in his love and mercy help you with the grace of the Holy Spirit. May the Lord who frees you from sin save you and raise you up. (CCC 1513)

## Need to receive Anointing of the Sick?

If you suffer from a chronic illness, the affect of advanced years or have an upcoming surgery and wish to receive this sacrament, let Fr. Jeff know before the Mass you attend and he will be glad to anoint you after Mass. ### Strength Training

You'll see the biggest health improvements by combining strength and cardio exercise, but if you must choose, you may be better off hitting the weights. A study of overweight and obese adults in BMC Public Health found that over a 12-week period, resistance training tended to

be more effective at improving cardiorespiratory fitness, long associated with decreased death. And we also know that strength training decreases the risk of osteoporosis. You'll get a great benefit from lifting weights two times per week. So lift!

## Reflection on the Readings

This Sunday, **Responsorial Psalm 145** invites us to sing praises to God's name forever, our true king and Lord. Why? The psalmist quickly responds by affirming that "the Lord is gracious and merciful, slow to anger and of great kindness...compassionate toward all." How does God's compassion and love manifest itself? Again, the psalmist proclaims that "the Lord lifts up all who are falling and raises up all who are bowed down." *Our great and mighty God chooses to be concerned about all those who are bowed down by life in any way. God's compassion is so overwhelming that it knows no bounds and sets no limits.* For the psalmist, our only response to such great love and kindness is to praise God's name forever.

**The first reading from the prophet Zechariah** recounts the coming of a future king who will be a "just savior...meek, and riding on ass." Symbolically, Zechariah is affirming that this future king will be a king of peace, riding an ass, the symbol of peace. The passage contrasts the ass to the horse and chariot, symbols of violence and war, which will be driven out of Jerusalem, the city of peace, the literal meaning of the word "Jeru salem."

This future king "shall proclaim peace to the nations" and his "dominion shall be...to the ends of the earth." This future king will model king Solomon, whose name literally means "peace," and who rode to his coronation on an ass, the symbol of peace (1 Kings 1:38). *We Christians believe that Jesus is the long awaited king of peace, who came to Jerusalem, the city of peace, riding on a donkey, the symbol of peace. Jesus is God's compassion made real and enfleshed among us.* We have much reason to give praise to God.

**Paul's letter to the Romans** boldly affirms that, if we have the Spirit of God dwelling in us, then we are people of the spirit and not of the flesh. Paul's language here is not to be misunderstood as a denigration of the body or of our human flesh. *For Paul, those of the flesh symbolically represent all who live contrary to God's desires. Those of the spirit are people open to God's way of living and acting.* Whoever allows the Spirit of God to dwell within them are enfleshed people who now

live oriented towards God. They commit themselves to the same purpose and aim as Jesus, namely to live in accordance with God's intentions and desires. This is our only source of true life. Paul challenges us to live our lives accordingly.

**Matthew's gospel** has Jesus praise God for allowing the weak and the little to know of the richness and wisdom of God. Jesus' intimacy with God enables him to know God intimately and to share that wisdom with whoever is open to deepening their relationship with God through Jesus. *The "weak" and "little" know this wisdom experientially for they know and trust in God, their only source of hope, confidence and strength.*

In the Jewish scriptures, these are the "anawim" or the poor of the Lord, who rely exclusively on the Lord, no matter their intellectual or social situations in life. Those who "labor and are burdened" are invited to learn from and model themselves on the meekness and humility of Jesus. In so doing, they "will find rest" and come to know the Lord.

Name times when you experienced God's "compassion and kindness" in your life. How did you feel and what return did you make to the Lord? How does such awareness and experience affect the way you now live and act?

***This week take time to rest in the Lord and learn from Jesus, our fountain of life.***

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## Reflexión Sobre las Lecturas



de Dios para siempre.

Este domingo, el **Salmo responsorial 144** nos invita a cantar alabanzas al nombre de Dios para siempre, nuestro verdadero rey y Señor. ¿Por qué? El salmista responde rápidamente afirmando que "el Señor es clemente y misericordioso, lento a la cólera y rico en piedad; el Señor es bueno con todos". ¿Cómo se manifiesta la compasión y el amor de Dios? Otra vez, el salmista proclama que "el Señor sostiene a los que van a caer, endereza a los que ya se doblan". *Nuestro Dios grande y poderoso elige preocuparse por todos aquellos que están abatidos por la vida de alguna manera. La compasión de Dios es tan abrumadora que no conoce ni establece límites.* Para el salmista, nuestra única respuesta a tal gran amor y bondad es alabar el nombre

**La primera lectura del profeta Zacarías** relata la llegada de un futuro rey que será el "justo y victorioso, humilde... montado en un burrito". Simbólicamente, Zacarías está afirmando que este futuro rey será el rey de la paz, montado en un burro, el símbolo de la paz. El pasaje contrasta el burro con el caballo y el carro, símbolos de violencia y guerra, que serán expulsados de Jerusalén, la ciudad de la paz, el significado literal de la palabra "Jerusalem".

Este futuro rey "anunciará la paz a las naciones" y su "poder se extenderá ... hasta los últimos rincones de la tierra". Este futuro rey modelará al rey Salomón, cuyo nombre significa literalmente "paz", y quien llegó a su coronación sobre un burro, el símbolo de la paz (1 Reyes 1:38). *Los cristianos creemos que Jesús es el esperado rey de la paz, que vino a Jerusalén, la ciudad de la paz, montado en un burro, símbolo de paz. Jesús es la compasión de Dios hecha real y encarnado entre nosotros.* Tenemos muchas razones para alabar a Dios.

**La carta de Pablo a los Romanos** afirma claramente que si tenemos el Espíritu de Dios habitando en nosotros, entonces somos personas del espíritu y no de la carne. El lenguaje de Pablo aquí no debe ser mal interpretado como una denigración del cuerpo o de nuestra carne humana. *Para Pablo, los de la carne representan simbólicamente a todos los que viven en contra de los deseos de Dios. Los del espíritu son personas abiertas a la manera de Dios de vivir y actuar.* Quien permite que el Espíritu de Dios habite en ellos, son personas encarnadas que ahora viven orientadas hacia Dios. Se comprometen con el mismo propósito y objetivo que Jesús, es decir, vivir de acuerdo con las intenciones y deseos de Dios. Esta es nuestra única fuente de la vida verdadera. Pablo nos desafía a vivir nuestras vidas como corresponde.

**El evangelio de Mateo** tiene a Jesús alabando a Dios por permitir que la gente sencilla conozca la riqueza y sabiduría de Dios. La intimidad de Jesús con Dios le permite conocer a Dios íntimamente y compartir esa sabiduría con quien está abierto a profundizar su relación con Dios a través de Jesús. *La "gente sencilla" conoce esta sabiduría experimentalmente porque conoce y confía en Dios, su única fuente de esperanza, confianza y fortaleza.*

En las escrituras judías, estos son los "anawim" o los pobres del Señor, que confían exclusivamente en el Señor, sin importar su situación intelectual o social en la vida. Aquellos que están "fatigados y agobiados por la carga" están invitados a aprender y modelarse en la mansedumbre y humildad de Jesús. Al hacerlo, "encontrarán descanso" y llegarán a conocer al Señor.

Nombre unas veces que sintió la "compasión y bondad" de Dios en su vida. ¿Cómo se sintió y qué hizo? ¿Cómo afecta este conocimiento y esta experiencia la forma en que vive y actúa ahora?

*Esta semana tome tiempo para descansar en el Señor y aprender de Jesús, nuestra fuente de vida.*
