Did you know you can save money by creating a meal plan for the week before heading to the grocery store? Buying for the week means you'll make fewer shopping trips and buy only the items you need. Here are some basic tips for creating your menu and grocery list:

1. See what you already have. Look in your freezer, cabinets, and refrigerator. Make a note of what you currently have on hand. You can save money by using these items in the upcoming week's meals.
2. Use a worksheet to plan your meals. As we head into football season, think of creating a "shopping playbook" to help you plan your meals and develop your shopping list.
3. Create a list of recipes to try. Find new ideas for healthy and low-cost meals based on what you have on hand, foods your family enjoys, and foods that are good buys.
4. Visit What's Cooking? for recipe inspiration. Search recipes by ingredient using What's Cooking? USDA Mixing Bowl is an interactive tool to help with healthy meal planning, cooking, and grocery shopping. Be sure to include some family favorites along with the new recipes.
5. Think about your schedule. Choose meals you can easily prepare when you don't have a lot of time. Save recipes that take longer for days off. You also can prepare meals in advance to heat and serve on your busiest days.
6. Plan to use leftovers. Think about larger recipes with enough servings for multiple meals. This can reduce the number of ingredients you need to buy, and save you time preparing another meal.

Reflection on the Readings

The refrain from Psalm 95 captures well the focus of this Sunday's readings: "If today you hear his voice, harden not your hearts." Listening with an open heart and mind to how God speaks in and through others and all of creation will lead to an attunement of mind and heart to God. *True discipleship entails and demands a constant discipline of listening to how God might be speaking to us in all the events of life.*

Psalm 95 is used daily in the morning prayer of the Liturgy of the Hours. *The psalm sets the appropriate context for beginning the day's journey, alerting those praying to the constant need throughout the day to be attuned to God's voice in life's many and various encounters.* The psalm verses chosen for this Sunday call us to come into God's presence, praising and thanking God for shepherding and guiding us through life. They also include a warning not to harden our hearts lest we cut ourselves off from the wisdom and guidance that the Lord continually provides throughout our days.

Ezekiel in the first reading is reflecting on his role as God's prophet. He is to listen to God's word with open heart and mind so that he can be the instrument of God's wisdom and guidance to others. *Having listened, Ezekiel has the added responsibility to announce God's words to the people.* If they listen and act on God's wisdom and guidance, they will live and grow. If they harden their hearts and refuse to listen, they cut themselves off from God's life and guidance, ultimately lifeless and dying.

Paul's letter to the Romans offers us the general thrust of God's wisdom which, if acted upon, does lead to abundant life. *Following Jesus' lead, Paul stresses that loving our neighbor as ourselves is the soul and substance, the "fulfillment," of the law. Love does no evil, overcoming evil with good while bringing about new life and meaning.*

The law is perfectly fulfilled in love of God through love of neighbor. All else is merely commentary and footnote.

Matthew's gospel has Jesus address his followers concerning the existence of conflicts and disagreements within the community. The presumption in Jesus' directives is that the community's integrity is based

on its daily attempt to attune itself to God's wisdom and guidance. Only such a community can approach an erring member and strive to heal, reconcile and reintegrate the sinner into the community. If the erring member does not listen, then two or more members of the community are asked to come along to witness to the response of the erring member. If the erring member still refuses to listen and respond then the matter is to be brought to the whole community.

If the erring member cannot heal and reconcile with the community, then the member chooses no longer to be an integral member of the community, thus severing the relationship. The community affirms the personal choice of its erring member who consistently refuses God's wisdom and guidance as expressed through the community. In Matthew's gospel, Jesus gives this authority to Peter in chapter 16 and to the whole community in chapter 18. *However, that authority must consistently be tested against the discipline of attunement to God's wisdom and guidance. Failure to do so leads to a loss of integrity and a profound rupture in the community's exercise of authority.*

Matthew's gospel passage ends with Jesus affirming the rich reality that whenever two or three are gathered in his name, he is there in the midst of them. This assures the community that God listens to the community, especially in its continued attempt to attune itself to God's wisdom and guidance.

How do you attune yourself to God's wisdom and guidance articulated in and through your faith community? Ask God for the grace to listen attentively and not to harden your heart.

Reflexión Sobre las Lecturas

El refrán del Salmo 94 capta bien el enfoque de las lecturas de este domingo: "Ojalá escuchen hoy su voz: 'No endurezcan su corazón'". Escuchar con el corazón y mente abiertos a cómo Dios habla en y a través de los demás y toda la creación conducirá a una sintonía de mente y corazón con Dios. *El verdadero discipulado implica y exige una disciplina constante de escuchar cómo Dios podría estar hablando con nosotros en todos los eventos de la vida.*

El Salmo 94 se usa diariamente en la oración matutina de la Liturgia de las Horas. *El salmo establece el contexto apropiado para comenzar el viaje del día, alertando a los que oran a la necesidad constante durante todo el día para estar en sintonía con la voz de Dios en los encuentros múltiples y diversos de la vida.* Los versículos del salmo elegidos para este domingo nos llaman a entrar en la presencia de Dios, alabando y agradeciendo a Dios por pastorearnos y guiarnos toda la vida. También incluyen una advertencia para no endurecer nuestros corazones para que no nos separemos de la sabiduría y la guía que el Señor provee continuamente durante nuestros días.

Ezequiel en la primera lectura está reflexionando sobre su papel como profeta de Dios. Él debe escuchar la palabra de Dios con corazón y mente abiertos para que pueda ser el instrumento de la sabiduría y guía de Dios para los demás. *Habiendo escuchado, Ezequiel tiene la responsabilidad adicional de anunciar las palabras de Dios a la gente.* Si ellos escuchan y actúan según la sabiduría y guía de Dios, ellos vivirán y crecerán. Si endurecen sus corazones y se niegan a escuchar, se cortan de la

vida y guía de Dios, en última instancia, sin vida y muriéndose.

La carta de Pablo a los romanos nos ofrece el empuje general de la sabiduría de Dios que, si se actúa sobre ella, conduce a una vida abundante. *Siguiendo el ejemplo de Jesús, Pablo subraya que amar al prójimo como a nosotros mismos es el alma y la sustancia, el "cumplimiento" de la ley. El amor no hace ninguna maldad, vence la maldad con el bien mientras que trae nueva vida y significado.* La ley se cumple perfectamente en el amor de Dios a través del amor al prójimo. Todo lo demás es meramente comentario y nota de pie de página.

El evangelio de Mateo hace que Jesús se dirija a sus seguidores acerca de la existencia de conflictos y desacuerdos dentro de la comunidad. *La presunción en las directivas de Jesús es que la integridad de la comunidad se basa en su intento cotidiano de sintonizarse con la sabiduría y la guía de Dios.* Sólo tal comunidad puede acercarse a un miembro erróneo y esforzarse por sanar, reconciliar y reintegrar al pecador en la comunidad. Si el miembro erróneo no escucha, entonces se pide a dos o más miembros de la comunidad que vengan a atestigar la respuesta del miembro erróneo. Si el miembro erróneo todavía se niega a escuchar y responder, entonces el asunto debe ser llevado a toda la comunidad.

Si el miembro erróneo no puede sanarse y reconciliarse con la comunidad, entonces el miembro elige dejar de ser un miembro integral de la comunidad, rompiendo así la relación. La comunidad afirma la elección

personal de su miembro erróneo que rechaza constantemente la sabiduría y guía de Dios expresada a través de la comunidad. En el evangelio de Mateo, Jesús le da esta autoridad a Pedro en el capítulo 16 y a toda la comunidad en el capítulo 18. *Sin embargo, esa autoridad debe ser probada constantemente contra la disciplina de sintonía con la sabiduría y guía de Dios. El no hacerlo conduce a una pérdida de integridad y a una ruptura profunda en el ejercicio de la autoridad por parte de la comunidad.*

El pasaje evangélico de Mateo termina con Jesús afirmando la rica realidad de que cuando dos o tres están reunidos en su nombre, él está allí en medio de ellos. Esto asegura a la comunidad que Dios escucha a la comunidad, especialmente en su intento continuo de sintonizarse con la sabiduría y guía de Dios.

¿Cómo se sintoniza con la sabiduría y la guía de Dios articuladas en y a través de su comunidad de fe? Pídale a Dios la gracia de escuchar atentamente y de no endurecer su corazón.


