This Week's Do You Know Video:

At Eucharist we are fed from two tables, the table of God's Word, called the Ambo and the table of the God's body, called the Altar. The Ambo is the table which is reserved exclusively for the proclamation of God's Word along with the homily, a reflection on the proclaimed Word. Previous to Vatican II God's Word was proclaimed exclusively by the priest in silence from the missal on a book stand placed on the altar. Vatican II focused on the public proclamation of the Word rediscovered and reclaimed the Ambo as the exclusive table of God's Word. Some are more visible, others can be harder to see when you're not looking for them. But, they are still there. These statistics provide a look at how many people face a mental health or substance use challenge, whether we see it or not:

- In the United States, almost half of adults (46.4 percent) will experience a mental illness during their lifetime.
- 5 percent of adults (18 or older) experience a mental illness in any one year, equivalent to 43.8 million people.
- Half of all mental disorders begin by age 14 and three-quarters by age 24.
- In the United States, only 41 percent of the people who had a mental disorder in the past year received professional health care or other services.

What if we put that kind of effort into our own tasks as good stewards of all God's gifts to us? Into our ministries, into the ways we could make more time for prayer as individuals, as couples, as families and as a parish? What if we got as creative as the "bad steward" in the use of our finances so that we could give more generously to the poor and to the advancement of God's kingdom on the earth? You can purchase pupusas after Masses. Or if you'd like to avoid the wait, stop at our table on your way to Mass to place your order. All proceeds will be used to support our scholarship students in Cinquera, El Salvador.

Leaving a Legacy Gift

Have you wondered how your faith can create a legacy? Your retirement plan assets can create a financial support legacy that enables your parish to nourish faith in others. By designating on a "beneficiary designation form" the amount and the proper legal name of the parish, school, other ministry or the Diocese, you can create your own legacy gift. You can find beneficiary forms on the website of your IRA, 401 k, 403 b Administrator.

To leave your parish a bequest (e.g. will) or name it as a beneficiary (e.g. life insurance, an annuity), make sure your intentions are understood by providing as much identifying information as possible. Ideally, state the Legal Name, Tax ID Number, Address, City, State, and Zip.

El Salvador Scholarship Appeal

On the weekend of October 5-6, we will have our annual appeal for the university students in Cinquera, El Salvador.

Cinquera is a small town of 800 people, who totally rebuilt their town after the civil war ended in 1992. The majority of the families in Cinquera live in poverty, and their only hope for financial stability is to have one child graduate from university and find employment.

Along with our students in Cinquera, we also have students that live in the very rural communities that lie just outside of Cinquera. Often the students that live in these communities do not have running water or indoor bathrooms. Most families in these rural areas make a living from farming.

With the help from St. Sabina, thirteen young people are attending university. While on scholarship, the students are required to attend a monthly meeting and do a monthly community service project. In Cinquera there is a forest reserve, and many of the community projects are centered around this reserve, working to keep it clean. Other projects involve the scholarship students teaching the younger children of Cinquera certain skills, such as English, math, or sports.

Most of our students in Cinquera go to university in San Salvador, which is a 3-hour bus ride from Cinquera. Their scholarships help to provide an apartment for the students to live in during the week. All of the students come home each weekend to be with their families and to attend the required meetings and community service projects.

For one student to complete one year of university studies, the cost is approximately \$1300. This cost covers their tuition, apartment, and helps to cover a few incidental costs like internet access and bus fare.

In January of 2018 we sent a 6-person delegation to El Salvador to meet our scholarship students and to learn about the difficulties faced by the people there. With generous donations like yours, we hope to continue to help the students there. Their hope is to graduate, take care of their families, find work in their communities, and stay in El Salvador to continue to re-shape their country.

Each year Fr. Jeff personally donates his Chiefs season tickets for a raffle as his way to raise funds for our students. Please join him generously in supporting our students in El Salvador by making a donation at our second collection on October 5-6.

Jesus said to his disciples:

Reflection on the Readings

The refrain from Responsorial Psalm 113, “Praise the Lord who lifts up the poor,” offers us the ideal lens for reflecting on today’s readings. The psalm calls upon all of us to praise the Lord who is indeed the master and ruler of the world. Yet, despite all this power and authority, **God’s primary concern is with the lowly and the poor, continually caring for them and raising them up. God’s concerns are to be our concerns. This is the essential message of all the readings.**

The prophet Amos speaks of those who cannot wait for the Sabbath to end so that they can continue to become wealthy and powerful by taking advantage of the poor, through cheating, selling inferior products, or by whatever other unjust means they can devise. **God, who is continually attentive to the needs of the poor, sees what these people have done, and does not forget.** Amos thus warns that unless we model ourselves on our God, we may call God’s wrath upon us. Because of our unjust acts, we may have resources now, but a time of reckoning will come. **God’s justice will eventually set things aright, if not in this life then certainly in the next. Amos the prophet did not mince words when it came to the abuse of justice. No one who abuses or takes advantage of others will escape God’s justice.**

The second reading from the letter of First Timothy encourages us to pray for all, most especially for kings and those in authority. **We pray so that all, especially those with power and authority, may be attuned, as our God is, to the needs, concerns and cries of the poor. This is the only path leading to a quiet and tranquil life for all.** In other words, if we truly seek peace, then we must constantly work for justice and right relationship. **Peace will only be realized when all are treated with dignity, when each has what they need to live, when all are treated with respect and honesty, and when right relationship with God, others and all creation dominates our minds and hearts.**

Luke’s gospel reading is the most challenging of all. Jesus seems to be aware that people in authority or power can and often do take advantage of others to secure their own ultimate ends. This is what the “steward of injustice” is doing. The master even commends the dishonest

steward for acting prudently. **The steward is commended not for the selfish end he was working toward but for the way he went about achieving it.**

In other words, Jesus encourages us to be as industrious and shrewd as the steward in working for our ultimate end, union with God who is continually attuned to the needs of the poor. We are to be as industrious and shrewd in God’s affairs, namely being attuned to the poor, as the steward is in his own affairs. **We are to use wealth and power to do God’s bidding not ours.** This is the meaning behind the proverb that “no servant can serve two masters...you cannot serve both God and money.”

Today, Jesus challenges us, the wealthiest of nations, to use all of our shrewdness to lift the poor, giving a home to the homeless, the outcast and the stranger. As we continue to tackle the problem of immigration in our country, the only true perspective that a Christian can embrace is the one that Jesus challenges us to embrace. How shrewd can we be in ensuring that human dignity, respect and right relationship will dominate our discussions and our eventual legislation concerning immigration? **Will we support and vote for leaders who are willing to sit with and care for the poor, the homeless, and the stranger, leaders who act out of true justice and right relationship?**

This week, reflect on how you will use your resources and power shrewdly and prudently so that the poor, the outcast, the stranger, the alienated, and those seeking asylum at our doors will be treated with human dignity and justice. Reflect also on how this mindset will guide you when you vote for leaders in our communities and nation.

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Reflexión Sobre las Lecturas

El refrán del Salmo Responsorial 113, "Alaben al Señor que ensalza al pobre", nos ofrece la lente ideal para reflexionar sobre las lecturas de hoy. El salmo nos llama a todos a alabar al Señor, que es el maestro y gobernante del mundo. Sin embargo, a pesar de todo este poder y autoridad, la preocupación principal de Dios es con los humildes y los pobres, atendiéndolos y levantándolos continuamente. Las preocupaciones de Dios deben ser nuestras preocupaciones. Este es el mensaje esencial de todas las lecturas.

El profeta Amós habla de aquellos que no pueden esperar a que termine el sábado para poder seguir haciéndose ricos y poderosos al aprovecharse de los pobres, engañar, vender productos inferiores o cualquier otro medio injusto que puedan idear. Dios, quien está continuamente atento a las necesidades de los pobres, ve lo que estas personas han hecho y no olvida. Por lo tanto, Amós advierte que a menos que nos modelemos sobre nuestro Dios, podemos invocar la ira de Dios sobre nosotros. Debido a nuestros actos injustos, es posible que tengamos recursos ahora, pero llegará la hora de la verdad. La justicia de Dios eventualmente arreglará las cosas, si no en esta vida, ciertamente en la próxima. Amós, el profeta, no medía las palabras cuando se trataba del abuso de la justicia. Nadie que abuse o se aproveche de otros escapará de la justicia de Dios.

La segunda lectura de la primera carta a Timoteo nos anima a orar por todos, especialmente por los reyes y los que tienen autoridad. Oramos para que todos, especialmente aquellos con poder y autoridad, estén en sintonía, como lo está nuestro Dios, con las necesidades, preocupaciones y gritos de los pobres. Este es el único camino que conduce a una vida tranquila para todos. En otras palabras, si realmente buscamos la paz, entonces debemos trabajar constantemente por la justicia y la relación correcta. La paz solo se logrará cuando todos sean tratados con dignidad, cuando cada uno tenga lo que necesita para vivir, cuando todos sean tratados con respeto y honestidad, y cuando la relación correcta con Dios, los demás y toda la creación domine nuestras mentes y corazones.

La lectura del evangelio de Lucas es la más desafiante de todas. Jesús parece ser consciente de que las personas con autoridad o poder pueden y con frecuencia aprovechan de los demás para asegurar sus propios fines. Esto es lo que está haciendo el "administrador de la injusticia". El amo incluso elogia al administrador deshonesto por actuar con prudencia. Se elogió al administrador no por el fin egoísta hacia el que estaba trabajando, sino por la forma en que lo

logró.

En otras palabras, Jesús nos anima a ser tan laboriosos y astutos como el administrador en el trabajo por nuestro fin último, la unión con Dios que está continuamente en sintonía con las necesidades de los pobres. Debemos ser tan trabajadores y astutos en los asuntos de Dios, es decir, estar en sintonía con los pobres, como lo es el administrador en sus propios asuntos. Debemos usar la riqueza y el poder para hacer las órdenes de Dios, no las nuestras. Este es el significado detrás del proverbio de que "no hay criado que pueda servir a dos amos... no pueden ustedes servir a Dios y al dinero".

Hoy, Jesús nos desafía, las naciones más ricas, a usar toda nuestra astucia para levantar a los pobres, dando un hogar a las personas sin hogar, a los marginados y a los desconocidos. Ya que continuamos abordando el problema de la inmigración en nuestro país, la única perspectiva verdadera que un cristiano puede adoptar es la que Jesús nos reta a adoptar. ¿Qué tan astutos podemos ser para garantizar que la dignidad humana, el respeto y la relación correcta dominen nuestras discusiones y nuestra legislación futura sobre la inmigración? ¿Apoyaremos y votaremos por líderes que estén dispuestos a sentarse con y cuidar a los pobres, las personas sin hogar y los desconocidos, líderes que actúan por verdadera justicia y relación correcta?

Esta semana, reflexione sobre cómo utilizará sus recursos y poder de manera astuta y prudente para que los pobres, los marginados, los desconocidos, los alienados y los que buscan asilo en nuestras puertas sean tratados con dignidad humana y justicia. Reflexione también sobre cómo esta mentalidad lo guiará cuando vote por líderes en nuestras comunidades y nación.
